#### **FOREWORD**

Having been asked to contribute to the programme for the World Championship event at Beenham Park weekend, it is very interesting to look back over the results of the Championship for the last ten years.

In welcoming all the drivers and passengers for this year's event, it is interesting to note that a name that has always been prominent in the results is Ton Van Heugten who as long ago as 1972 was placed third with his passenger Jack Weary. Two years later with a new passenger, Dick Steinberg, he achieved fourth place, which was to be the spring-board for his overall win of the 1975 Championship with the same combination. In this year's Championship Ton again is at the top of the results with a new passenger Frits Kiggen. If Ton is able to continue on the same form that he has shown in earlier rounds of this year's Championship a very good result or perhaps an overall win at Beenham Park could very well put both hands on the World Championship for 1981.

The Countries who have shown most strength in the years of the competition have ebbed and flowed over the years, both the Swedes and the British were very strong in the early years of the competition, but it was not long before the rivalry between the Dutch and the Swiss came to the surface. I am sure everyone who will be watching today's race will remember those tremendous races at Newbury when the Haller Brothers and Robert Grogg who was then passengered by Graber, produced such tremendous racing before the race was transferred to today's venue, and from those two Countries, it is still the names of Grogg and Ton Van Heugten who still accommodate the leader board.

I think it is unfortunate that the British team have not equalled the efforts of the earlier competitors of Thompson Elliott and Guilford, and we are all hoping that Terry Good with his passenger Barry Williams will spring a very nice surprise in this year's race. I am sure that we shall all be rooting for Terry and his passenger, but one must not overlook the new names who have now come to the fore in the Championship.

First there is Josef Brockhausen of West Germany. This is a rider who has served his apprenticeship well and first came to England in small internationals and certainly looks a strong competitor for future honours, then we should look to Hansi Baechthold who until Robert Grogg decided to change his power from Norton to Yamaha, seemed to be the main spearhead of the Swiss team. I do not think we can overlook Baechthold as I am sure that he will appear again in the results. The Dutch are never far away with good riders and obviously the most promising is young Jan Bakens and Rijn Von Gastel. Anyone of these drivers could also be at the top of the leader board on the day.

I therefore on behalf of the organising club the Mortimer and District Motor Cycle Club welcome all our world competitors together with all the visiting international officials, particularly those of the International Jury who with myself and also members of our own Motorcross Committee meet on many occasions throughout Europe in the organisation of this competition. I was fortunate enough to be at the West German Round where the honours were equally shared between Grogg and Josef Brockhausen. The name that I have not mentioned of course, is last year's champion Reinhard Boehler. Although Reinhard has been a competitor for some years, he is someone who should not be ignored and it certainly looks at the present time that the older hands in the Championship are showing the young ones how to compete. It is unfortunate that the young drivers are not ascending to the top of the Championship, but perhaps we shall have a big surprise this weekend.

I hope that everyone will enjoy the racing and will join in the sport to make it a memorable weekend.


