

### AROUND THE CENTRE

These comments were held over from last month due to lack of space. We apologise that they cover matters of some time ago — Editor.

The worst part about changing a big deal is when the new one falls considerably short of its predecessor and the whole show leaves one feeling cheated, like say the recent Grand Canyon jump. Thus it happened that the gate marshals shuffled restlessly, the south coast 'Highway Patrol' sat patiently all for the flash left hand drive projectiles that weren't coming this year to the dunes outside Ringwood for this year's Hants event. It was instead billed as the new British Super Moto Show devised to find one champion this year from amongst the batch of thirty nominated super stars, the youngest only seventeen and at the other end of the scale someone who has been about these past twenty years. The result was a home win, not really unexpected, and a glimpse at those likely to leapfrog into this top thirty by virtue of the supporting events, and here again the top scorer was British, albeit nearer forty than thirty. It is not surprising therefore when one hears an ex British Grand Prix winner say that it was not the same as the DeCoster, Kring spectaculars and the sooner they are tramping back to Matchams on a Good Friday the better. Nevertheless it is fair to say the Ringwood club went about their task of organisation with their usual efficient manner and the racing was lively enough. But until we get an up to date Grand Prix win under a home belt, there will always be the vision of two or three other runners half a lap ahead of our best. The new style series might evolve just such a super star, lets hope so.

Colin Holdstock as many know is now on the other side of the world making a new life for his family, and it would be most immoral if I did not pause for a pat on his back. He came along with the new style Gazette just when its finances were running those of British Leyland a close second and not only produced a better monthly on time, but did a financial revival that would put friend Woodwedge Bert in the shade. I am sure we all wish him well. Also on the move though not quite so far is Chris Cullen. Cully is off, not to be taken in any way rudely, to

Wiltshire to set up residence and no doubt shape up a few Wessex premiers. Possibly one of the finest examples of a true motor cycle competitor, Cully has been a leading centre runner for probably longer than he even cares to remember and in his long reign never one to cause disrepute. His smile will be missed at weekends, through those of you in the western end of the centre will have a glimpse from time to time. Sniff, sniff and pass the hankie stuff.

Before his exit however, he did, along with many others venture to farthest Ventnor for the Wight epic, this year scene of a first win for Geoff Chandler, now without doubt the finest rider the South has produced for many years. One hold up not accounted for by the organisers was the homeward bound five o'clock to Portsmouth. Its Captain had a big five when berthing his beast and it took a new tide and four hours to launch the craft. Talking of launching reminds me of last year, but I hear the goldfish were left to themselves, not unexpected with Longfellow's premature retirement and my participation at a family wedding. Nevertheless other than concern over the increasing vertical severity, all seem to have enjoyed themselves and all credit to the club for executing probably their most ambitious course so far with such credit. Whilst dwelling on the Chandler winning streak, one must pause and relate his individual win at the Inter Centre event in Cheshire a really fantastic effort. Without this year Sammy Miller and Devon refugee Ian Haydon, we still were able to maintain last year's placing thanks particularly to a fine debut by Phil Legg and good backing up by the rest. Many will have read that there is a move ahead to bring the sidecars in on the act and with George Greenland, Bob Colein, Brian Peeling and Harry Foster all in the top eight of the National Trials table, it was a formality for the Centre to back any such move. George, with two outright wins to his credit, is hard at the leaders and needless to say we wish him and Dave Lane every success and as much benefit of the doubt as possible.

As the trials proper close down Geoff Monk puts his iron away having made a real pig of himself with premiers and in between still finding time and terrain to clerk the new style Bank Holiday Mason Cup. The regs. said it was to be severe, so the moaning and bitching of those who thought themselves capable, just hightlights what impossible asperations they had for themselves. If we are to evolve national competitors then it will be from this sort of event and not from one that keeps the bike nice and clean and wears out bottom gear. Rather than spoil an organisers day, if they say it will be hard, to these spoilers I say stay home with the Solvo, for organisation is hard to find, and good imaginative stuff these days very remote.

The racers now have the months ahead and if the weather and racing is as good as at Winchester's Scramble recently, then the crowds will have little to complain about. Graham Noyce won all his races so well that it seemed for all that we have a centre champion of considerable talent. Another fine example of a good old fashioned centre meeting was the Southampton event, scene of a return to the sport of Mike Guildford. Only Roger Martin stopped him having a clean sweep debut in the sidecar events, a most impresive resumption. With a good crowd in attendance at what on paper looked like a nothing special entry, one must assume that the cost of travelling will see a return of support of these meetings, all that remains is for clubs to give them their moneys worth.

Duty done in voting we accepted Southampton's kind invitation with thanks, and we drove through the hot evening sunshine to George Hodges' opening of the 5th June Board Meeting.

Apologies were received from Mr. P. Ryall.

The minutes were received as circulated and signed by dear George Hodges, who in turn handed the gavel of office to Roy Brett.

Mortimer Club now have approval for 16th November Trial from Messrs.

Blackmore and Vikings. Thank you Sportsmen.

Bishops Waltham have offered and have been accepted as promoters of the 10th August Centre Grass Track Championship Meeting. Thank you Wimborne and Farnham for also making generous offers.

The Register produced 15 Officers, 54 Delegates, representing 32 Clubs. The Reading Ace have decided to wind up, and the financial balance has been passed to the Auto-Cycle Union Benevolent Fund. A motion was passed regretting the closure, and Reading Ace were thanked for the generous donation and also for their physical efforts in the past towards the Centre.

It appears that there are irritating events being promoted by Youth Division Clubs in Okeford and Bulbarrow areas, causing the non-use of existing "SENIOR" courses. A full discussion took place and the Chairman recommended that a direct approach by STURMINSTER Club should be made to the Ringwood "Schoolboys" Club. Unfortunately this was unacceptable to a majority present, and it was proposed that LONDON Auto-Cycle Union should be protested to with reference to unnecessary irritation. Messrs. Hawker and Hunt have been invited to the next Southern Centre Competitions Meeting.

The Licence Bogey Anomaly rose from 'Hordean' Jem after being prompted by a Midland Centre Board Letter. It was noted that Southern Centre delegates voted for the Lower Licence exemption, and that the Midlands voted against this Centre.

Under 17 year old riders in TRIALS cannot be entitled to awards. Machines must be ridden between sections, and no change of rider is allowed. National Trials must have stationary noise tests.

Bowrings, our Insurance Brokers, are insisting on Landowners' Indemnity with Permit Secretary being notified before the day of the meeting.

Grass Track Sidecar machinery from 1st January, 1976 MUST NOT have a super-charger, and from 1st JANUARY, 1977, a capacity limited to 850cc (Sidecar). Scramble jerkins are NOT suitable for GRASS TRACK PROTECTIVE CLOTHING.

London Delegates travelling expenses will be totally met by Local Centres.

Brian Coombes reported 29th June St. Paul's is well under way. Entries closed. Programme at printers.

## Rights of Way Sub-Committee

One wet Saturday afternoon towards the end of May, this Sub-Committee met in Shipton Bellinger-its first meeting of the year-and a welcome was accorded to the two new members. They were Fred Furlong and Ian Rennie. A similar welcome was extended to Les Blyth, who had returned to the Sub-Committee (to replace Jeremy May) after several years absence.

With introductions over, the Secretary announced that Ken Broadbery-Sayer had tendered his resignation from this Sub-Committee. The Secretary was instructed to acknowledge Ken's letter, and to thank him for having served the Sub-Committee since its formation.

It was agreed that Fred Furlong would look after North Dorset, and it was hoped that Peter Knight might agree to be co-opted onto the Sub-Committee to ensure adequate coverage of South Dorset. Ian Rennie would take care of Wiltshire.

The Chairman's Report contained a warning that much hard work lay ahead in connection with the Special Review of the "Roads Used as Public Paths" (objection period now closed in Dorset, not yet opened in Wiltshire or Hampshire).

The Secretary read his Affidavit in connection with closure of the U.33 road (Kingsclere), the wording of which was warmly approved by members of the Sub-Committee. It seemed that proceedings could extend over a period of several years.

A general discussion on the Great Ridgway brought comments from most members, and it was confirmed that the period for objecting to the proposed Experimental Closure had terminated on May 15. A great many objections had been lodged, and a hard fight appeared inevitable.

Area Delegates gave brief reports and made observations on various Rightsof-Way problems. Fred Furlong touched on "unsurfaced County roads" (perhaps destined for down-grading to bridleway status, in view of no R.U.P.P designation in Dorset).

Brian Palmer mentioned British Horse Society's welcome decision to seek Byway status for all R.U.P.Ps. (in line with our own policy), but Dennis Kingswell warned that sporting interests of local clubs must be considered when claiming vehicular rights which may aggravate farmers.

Les Blyth touched on the old problem of misleading sign-posts (in Hampshire), Roy Brett mentioned the excellent outcome of lane-clearing work carried out by motorcyclists in the Basingstoke area, and a discussion on desirability of new Ralph Venables maps brought the meeting to a close.
