

Willsport Sidecar Speedway Championship of Great Britain

Foreword by Colin Martin

On behalf of the promoters, Dave Pavitt and Martin Newnham, welcome to the exciting world and to the spectacular action of sidecar speedway. Today's meeting is the second in an eight round competition to determine the Wulfsport Sidecar Speedway Champion of Great Britain, which runs throughout the summertime at Swindon (2 meetings), King's Lynn, Somerset, Stoke and the Isle of Wight and culminates in the crowning of the victors in an October meeting at the Smallbrook Stadium on the Isle of Wight.

For those of you who have not witnessed sidecar speedway racing before, here are a few pointers:

Using 1000cc engines from road going machines, the engine capacity can be increased up to a maximum 1045cc. It can also be modified to run methanol fuel just like the solo speedway bikes. These modifications will increase the brake horsepower or output available from the standard engine of 120 BHP to an amazing 150 BHP plus! But raw power from the sidecar is not the end of the story as the teamwork between driver and passenger is paramount to convert that power into drive onto the track. The driver steers the outfit and determines the speed but the passenger has to control the rear wheel by moving his weight to the side or onto the back of the bike.

Moving onto the rules, which are similar to the solo speedway rules but with one major exception. Contact is not allowed under power and that means contact can be made entering a corner but contact or pushing is NOT allowed exiting a corner.

One other important piece of information for you to consider, these sidecar speedway machines do not have any brakes fitted!

The first round at Newport on the 1st May produced an unexpected and dramatic result from the Grand Final with the current champions Ivor Matthews/Mick Stace, along with Paul Bickley/Paul Silvera and Matt Tyrrell/Shaun Yates finishing all square on 14 points.

In fourth place, on 11 points, are Richard Moore / Rob Winspear (AKA Team Skeleton). Watch at the end of the meeting as Rich performs donut spins with the outfit. You thought Poland's Adam Skornicki was good at donuts on a solo just watch Team Skeleton!

So sit back and enjoy the thrills and the occasional spills of sidecar speedway racing on one of Britain's biggest speedway circuits.

A chance for the sidecar boys to go full throttle and get on the gas....

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





Story of Stide Car Speed Way - Partitive by Dave Stallworthy


We continue our Sidecar Story by looking at the 1950's onwards. After World War two (1939-1945) Sidecar racing grew to new heights in Australia. Leading drivers were Jim Davies, Jack Carruthers and Chook Hodgekiss. Some Australians had raced in the UK but the most high profile visit was in 1950 when Jim Davies and Peter Speerin toured our tracks. I have some vintage video film of them in action and they looked very impressive indeed. Sometimes the Australians held

more than one Championship per year, below is a list of the Australian Champions from 1946 to 1959. 1946 Jack Carruthers / Paul Bridson, 1947 Jim Davis / Peter Flynn, 1947 Keith Ratten / Charlie Perabo, 1948 Jim Davies / Peter Speerin, 1948 Keith Ratten / Charlie Perabo, 1949 No Championship, 1950 Jim Davies / Doug Tankard, 1950 Jack Carruthers / Reg Dee, 1951 Jim Davies / Doug Tankard, 1952 Chook Hodgkiss / Charlie Kendall, 1953-58 No Championship, 1959 Don Willison / Des Dick. From 1952 to 1963 a long list of Midland Motorcycle Aces tried the thrill of Speedway including Bill Evans (Norton) Denis

Austin (Works Triumph) Claude Evans (Norton) Ian Paskin(Triumph & Norton) Ivor Lawrence (Norton/Jap) Alf Ellis (Norton) Chris Vincent (BSA) Keith Blaynee (BSA twin) Arthur Cadlin (North Jap) Harold Hill (Norton Jap and Vic Artus (Ariel & BSA).


They raced at many different circuits including – Cradley, Wolves, Bristol, Exeter, Belle Vue, Norwich and Scunthorpe. Former Multi track promoter Mike Parker used to have the Sidecars as part of "Festival of Speed" meetings which included Solos and Midget car racing.


Driver Ian Paskin once told me that he raced his outfit against Parker who raced his Midget car while at Norwich Ove Fundin (5 times World Solo Champion) raced a Sidecar faster than the regular drivers!


Looking at the drivers above, Bill Evans was 6 times British Sidecar grass track Champion, Chris Vincent won both the British grass track and Road Race Sidecar titles

including also a T.T win. Alt Ellis went on to make Solo grass frames with Peterborough Speedway ace Andy Ross an Elstar rider of note. Ivor Lawrence went on to be a top Solo grass tracker while Vic Artus a top rider in an outfit and his son Alan followed in his wheel tracks. As well as the Midland Boys from the late 1950's through to 1986 another group emerged in the South West at Plymouth and St Austell. These drivers included Roy Wedlake, Phil Williams, Ken & Dave Westaway, Pat Crawford, Ivor Toms, Gerald Stoneman, Fred Tarr, Eddie Seymour and Pat Crawford. After StAustell Speedway closed in 1963 they raced the outfit around the then tarmacked Stock car track using road trim tyres. Ken Westaway is a machanic these days for Pavel Ondrasik and as recently as Y2K used his old outfits to do some Sidecar Speedway Demos at Clay County Moto Parc with his sons.
