## HOW A SPEEDWAY MEETING IS RUN

### CLUTCH STARTS

Clutch Starts are employed in all official competitions.

The riders approach the starting line in their proper positions. When the green light is displayed by the Steward, the riders will move into the starting area bounded by the 2-yard line and the starting gate. Once the green light is displayed no time allowance will be granted, neither can any rider whose engine stops after that time receive assistance until the race is started. Any rider excluded for a starting offence cannot be replaced by a reserve.

### TEAM RACING REGULATIONS

Each heat shall consist of four laps. For all National League matches there shall be fourteen heats, and teams must consist of six riders and two reserves.

No rider is allowed to ride more than four times in a National League match.

Re-starting a Heat. The Steward only is authorised to stop a race and any race stopped shall be re-run immediately. Only those riders who originally started shall be digible for the re-run. Any rider eligible for the re-run who is unable to ride due to personal injury or machine damage may be replaced by a reserve.

## SIGNALS IN USE AT THIS MEETING

The Green Light is used for the starting of "rolling start" races, or as an instruction to the riders to come up to the tapes for a "gate start." Red Light—Stop. Yellow Flag—One more lap to go. Black Flag—Signal for a particular rider to withdraw. Black and White Check Flag—Finish.

The coloured lights suspended in front of the starting line indicate disqualification of any rider by the Steward.
