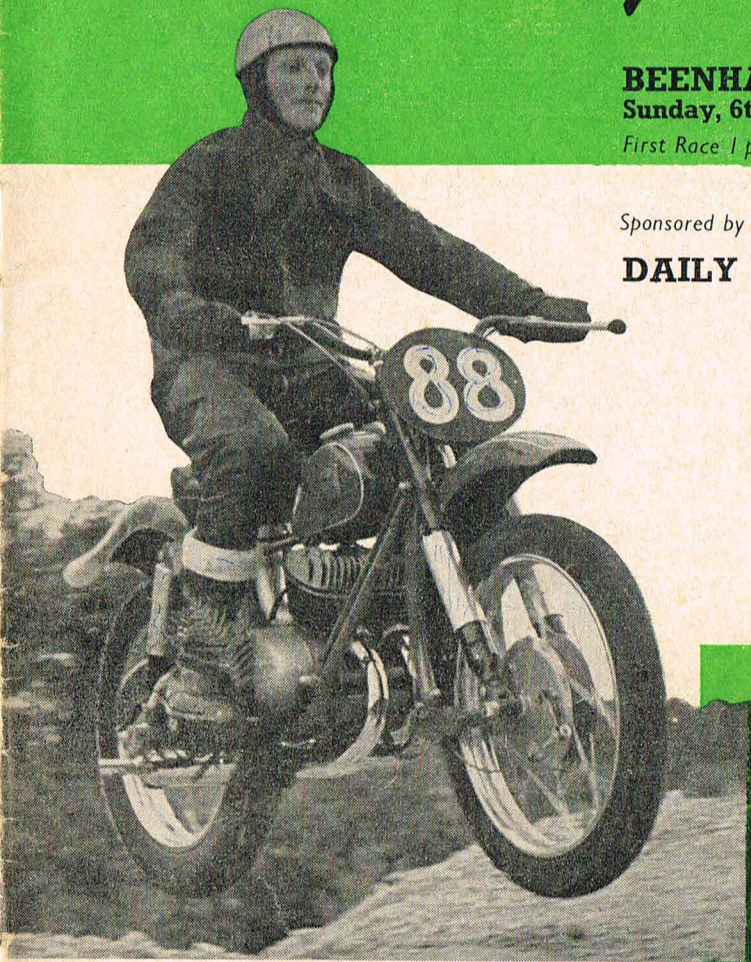

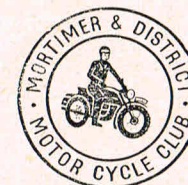

THE INTER-CENTRE EVENT

IN Gt. Britain all forms of competitive sport are controlled by national groups or bodies—soccer by the F.A., cricket by the M.C.C., motor-cycling by Auto-Cycle Union. Our sport is governed by the “General Council” of the Union. With over 850 Clubs it is obvious that there must be some form of regional representation on the Council, similarly there must be some form of regional administration. These requirements were met by the division of England and Wales into 20 areas called “Centres”, e.g., Berkshire, Hampshire, Dorset and part of Wiltshire constitute the “Southern Centre”. It is natural that Inter-Club rivalry should spread to Inter-Centre competition.

The first Inter-Centre Scramble was held in the present form at Hawkstone Park, in October 1954. The event received the full support of the “Daily Herald” which sponsored the meeting. It was a brilliant success. Twelve Centres sent teams of three riders all of whom had to complete the full number of laps. There were many retirements, including our local Southern Centre team. Midland Centre emerged as the victors with South Midland as runners-up. The series had been given a fine foundation.

The following year the event moved to Rolleswood Farm, near Stratford-on-Avon. Again there were teams of three, but the Midland Centre failed to finish on this occasion and the whole of the day's racing was dominated by Southern Centre riders who won the team event from Western Centre.

1956 saw the first change in the method of running. Teams of four competed, with the fastest three performances of each team to be counted to give an overall aggregate time for the team. Each team could therefore have one retirement without losing points. The team event developed into an exciting duel between South Midland and Southern, ending with South Midland the winners by a margin calculated in seconds.

Today we again have teams of four riders. There are two team races with two members of each team in each race. The times of the three fastest riders from each team will be added together and the team with the lowest aggregate will be the winners.

This year the “Daily Herald” has again sponsored the event, and the full weight of this great national newspaper has been devoted to further the interests of the National Inter-Centre Scramble. We will witness a grim struggle as the teams fight it out to establish the right to be called the “National Scramble Champions”. It is a high honour, but the winners will be worthy champions.

We have not mentioned individuals in this review for the simple reason that this is a team event and we are sure that 1957 will be another milestone along the road of our greatest National Team Championships.

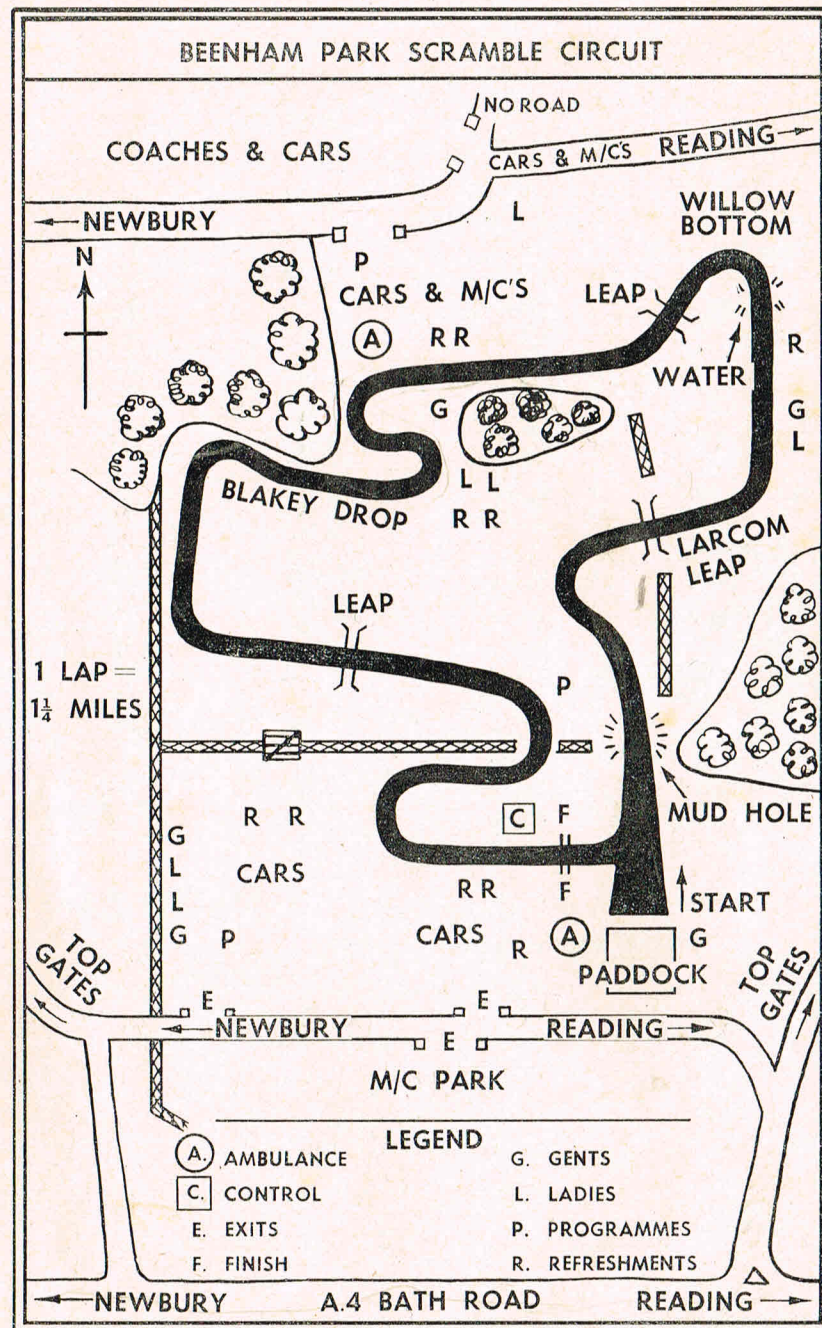

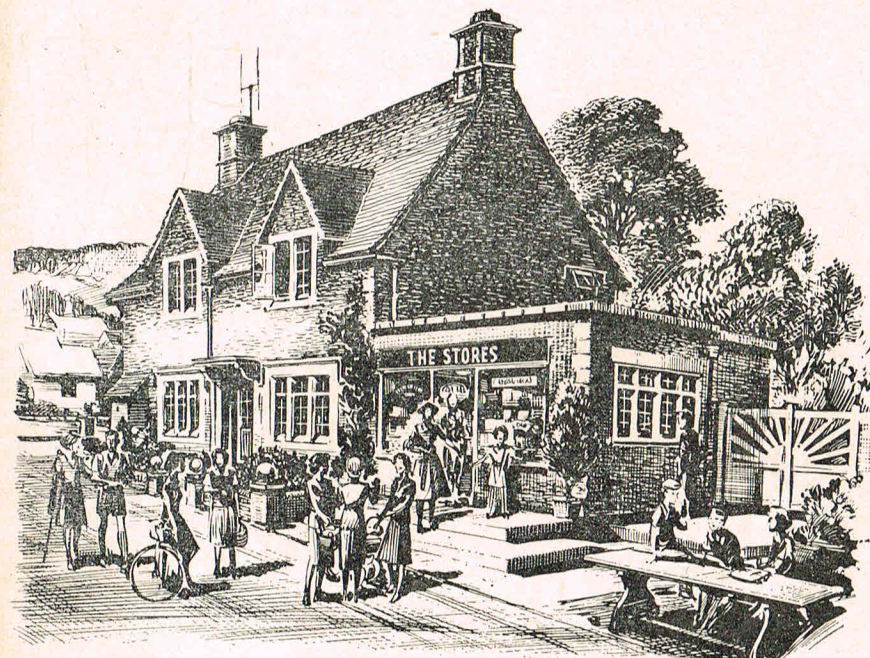
