# INTERNATIONAL COUPE D'EUROPE

This is the first time the International Coupe d'Europe for 250 c.c. machines has been held in Great Britain and is its second year of existence. It is already established as an event of frontrank importance in motorcycle scrambling and is attracting many of Europe's best riders.

Today's event is one of 12 which take place throughout Europe during the season. A rider can gather points at each event and his four best showings decide his final position in the championship table.

In addition to collecting valuable points, the winner of the British event also receives the *Daily Herald* Challenge Trophy which will give riders an extra incentive for what is already a tough and fast race.

The German entry is a powerful one. Fritz Betzlbacher, the European champion, riding his Maico works machine, is in top form, but he will have strong opposition from fellow-countrymen like Rolf Muller and Alfred Hulsman. There are also riders from Sweden and Austria who will be worth watching on the superb Beenham Park course.

Great Britain is also in the running for the championship. There is Brian Stonebridge, competition manager for Greeves, and one of the world's tallest scramblers. His distinctive style of riding has long been the delight of international crowds. With a long series of successes he recently won the moto-cross event in Holland. Other well-known names in the British ranks are Don and Derek Rickman, Roy King and Stuart Bickerton.

Besides the international event there are strong supporting attractions, including what should be a fast and entertaining sidecar race. In these events we have the pleasure of welcoming competitors from France and the U.S.A.

There is not the slighest doubt of the growing popularity of scrambling in this country. More and more people, who are not necessarily motor-cyclicsts, are following the exciting sport of the "rough-track." Clubs like the Mortimer and District Motor Cycle Club, which organises today's event, are proving the worth of these races in showing what machines can achieve under gruelling conditions. And that is not to forget the riders who know how to bring out the best in machines and themselves. The tougher the obstacle the greater the challenge.

The crowds at this event will witness some of the most exciting racing they have ever seen, and they will be able to recapture the excitement of today in tomorrow's *Daily Herald* where there will be a full report.
