

TODAY'S SPECTACULAR EVENT

THE International Moto-Cross European Championships, in the lovely setting of Beenham Park, are an indication of the growing popularity and importance of 250 c.c. motor-cycle racing over the "rough track".

More than 50,000 people saw last year's event. And the sport is important to a large number of countries, not the least of which is Great Britain, in proving how machines stand up to really tough conditions.

Visitors to Beenham in 1958 will recall the tremendous tussle which developed between Brian Stonebridge, on his Greeves, and Jaromir Cizek, of Czechoslovakia, on his Jawa.

Racing of similar high standards will be expected this year. Stenebridge has been doing well in Continental events and Great Britain has a fighting chance of winning the title for the first time

In today's event there are the racing stars from Western and Eastern Europe, so the Championship is likely to be rough, tough and spectacular. Sweden, France, Czechoslovakia, Belgium, Holland, West Germany and Denmark are represented as well as Great Britain.

The best of luck to all riders in this outstanding meeting over a vigorous circuit. The start of this $1\frac{1}{4}$ mile "rough track is 80 yards wide. From there onwards the riders follow a circuit which, in its variety of twists and turns, is a sure test of good riding, whether it is through the 1 in 4 straight climb into Larcombe Leap, the water jump at Willow Bottom, or Blakey Drop at 1 in 3.

This is one of 13 events which take place throughout Europe during the season, from Spring to Autumn. A rider collects points at each event and his best seven showings decide his final position in the championship table.

The additional award of the DAILY HERALD Challenge Trophy for the winner of the British event provides extra incentive to those who take part in this exciting sport.

There is enormous interest in the series right through the season. On the Continent, scrambling is a major sport. It is becoming so in this country and on superb courses like Beenham, where the family can make it 'a day out', there is a really special sparkle about the racing.

The two races, of 15 laps each, in the British event give spectators a double opportunity of seeing their favourite stars display their endurance, power and skill. As riders roar over the finishing line in each event they are awarded points on an ascending scale, so that rider with the fewest points after the two races is the winner of the whole event. If there is a tie on points, the winner is decided on aggregate time.

Follow the thrills and excitement of today's racing as the champions compete for victory, and then recapture the great moments in tomorrow's DAILY HERALD.




