

## "BRISTOL MAILBAG"

Dear Sirs,

What a remarkable match last Friday night, it reminded me of two similar matches a few years ago, when Bristol were having a very good season and winning matches with some fantastic scores.

The two matches that come to mind were on Friday, October 7th, 1949, when Glasgow White City at Knowle were beaten 70-14, when Bristol won every heat 5-1. As a matter of interest the point scorers were Mike Beddoe 9, Billy Hole 10, Eric Salmon 8, Roger Wise 12, Fred Tuck 12, Jack Mountford 9, Dick Bradley, Reserve, 5, Johnny Hole, Reserve, 5.

The other match was on the following Friday, October 14th, 1949, when Norwich were the visitors and lost 68-16: this time Bristol won the first thirteen heats 5-1 and the 14th heat was drawn 3-3. Point scorers that night were Roger Wise 9, Jack Mountford 12, Mike Beddoe 12, Dick Bradley 9, Billy Hole 11, Fred Tuck 7, Johnny Hole, Reserve, 4, Chris Boss, Reserve 4.

No doubt Eric Salmon will remember those two matches on thinking back.

I have nearly all the Programmes dating back from 1948.

With regard to the remaining matches, would it not be possible for the Bristol team to be made up of all the riders who used to ride for them say against Swindon: the riders are: - Dick Bradley, Johnny Hole, Chris Boss, Chum Taylor, Olle Nygren, Jack Unstead, Danny Dunton and Cliff Cox: that is providing Southampton are not booked for that night.

I am a bit disappointed that Jack Unstead has not been invited to ride yet, as I am sure a lot of Bulldog supporters would be glad to see him again, also Poole I am sure would not mind for one Friday night.

May Bristol have all the support next year that they should have and all the best for the league in 1960.




