## GOOD EVENING LADIES AND GENTLEMEN—

Once again we have another first-class programme lined up for you, with our visitors tonight comprising the famous Swindon Robins.

The Robins have a side that certainly looks as though it will take a lot of beating, but we think we have produced a Bulldogs Guest Team that will be able to give them a good run for their money—and at the same time provide us with the type of racing that will keep us on our toes right to the end of the meeting.

Good news at last re those tickets for the World Championship Final. They have now arrived, so those of you who have been anxiously awaiting this moment will be able to go right along tonight and get your hands on those precious “documents” that will get you into the famous Empire Stadium on September 19th.

The Final this year looks, even at this stage, as though it is going to be one of the most open ever, for although there are still two semi-finals to be run tomorrow—at Belle Vue and Norwich, the thirty-two riders left in at this stage are all of the top class. By the time the number has been weeded down to the ten who will join the six continental riders who have already won through to the Final, the result on “Wembley Night” will be anybody’s guess. The allocation of tickets to Bristol is not over-large, so we do urge all those who possibly can to get their tickets tonight. If that is not possible, you will be able to call at the Stadium (or you can ‘phone) during the next fortnight. The tickets will be on sale again at our next meeting, if there are any left, but after that any unsold will be returned to Wembley. You have, therefore, two weeks in which to make certain of your place, so get cracking on it right away—and don’t blame us if you miss the boat.

With the big event now taking up the main focus in the world of speedway racing, Bristol enthusiasts would, no doubt like to be in the picture of what the situation is just at the moment. The Semi-Finals started last Monday at Wimbledon, and that was followed by another “semi” at Southampton last Tuesday. The other two are at Belle Vue and Norwich, as already mentioned. Each rider will ride at two meetings, and this year no rider will be drawn to his home track. When the four meetings are completed, the top ten riders will join the Continental boys at Wembley. For our final meeting of the season, we are arranging a really first-class bill of sixteen riders to compete in an individual competition which we are going to call the BRISTOL OPEN TROPHY. We shall get each of the top-line riders available on that night, so we shall be able to look forward to a really great wind-up to the season.

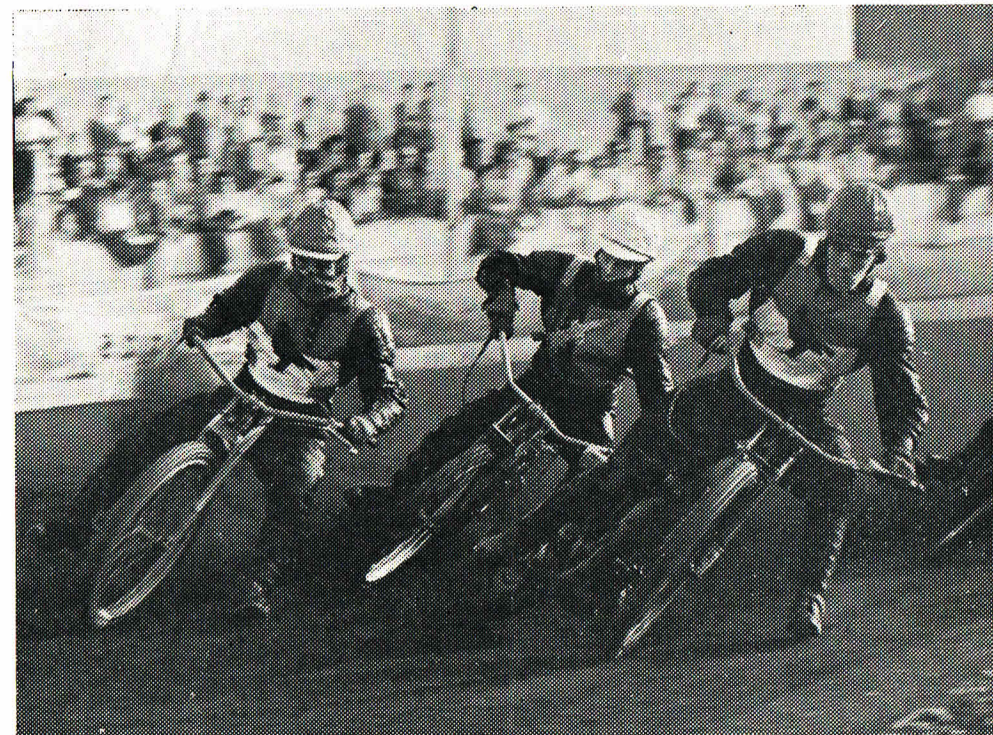
