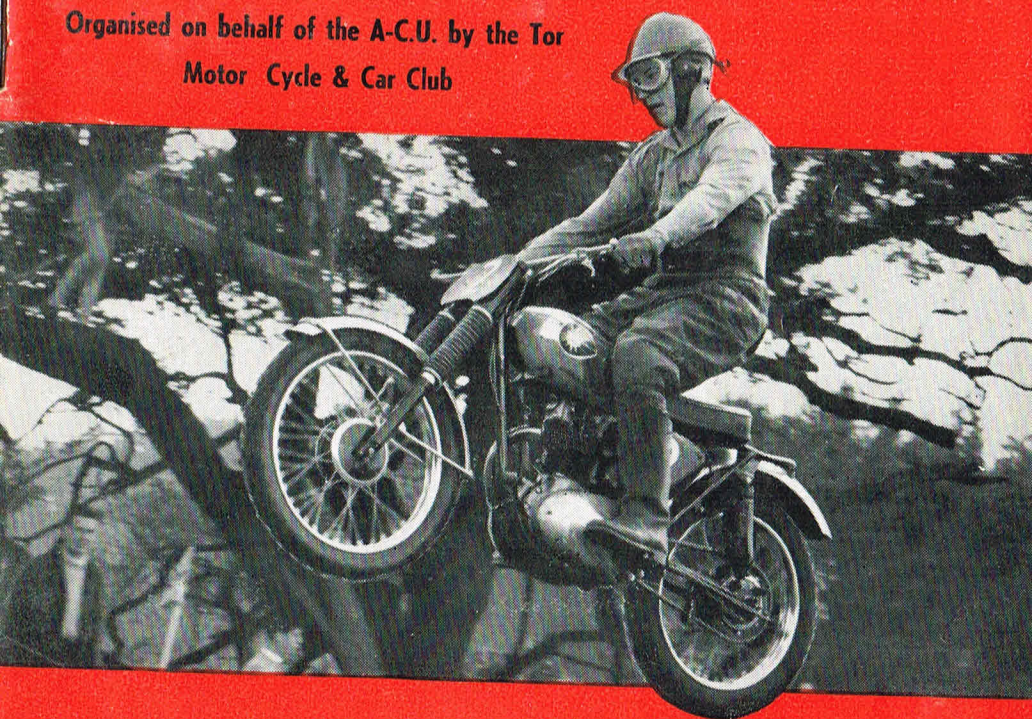

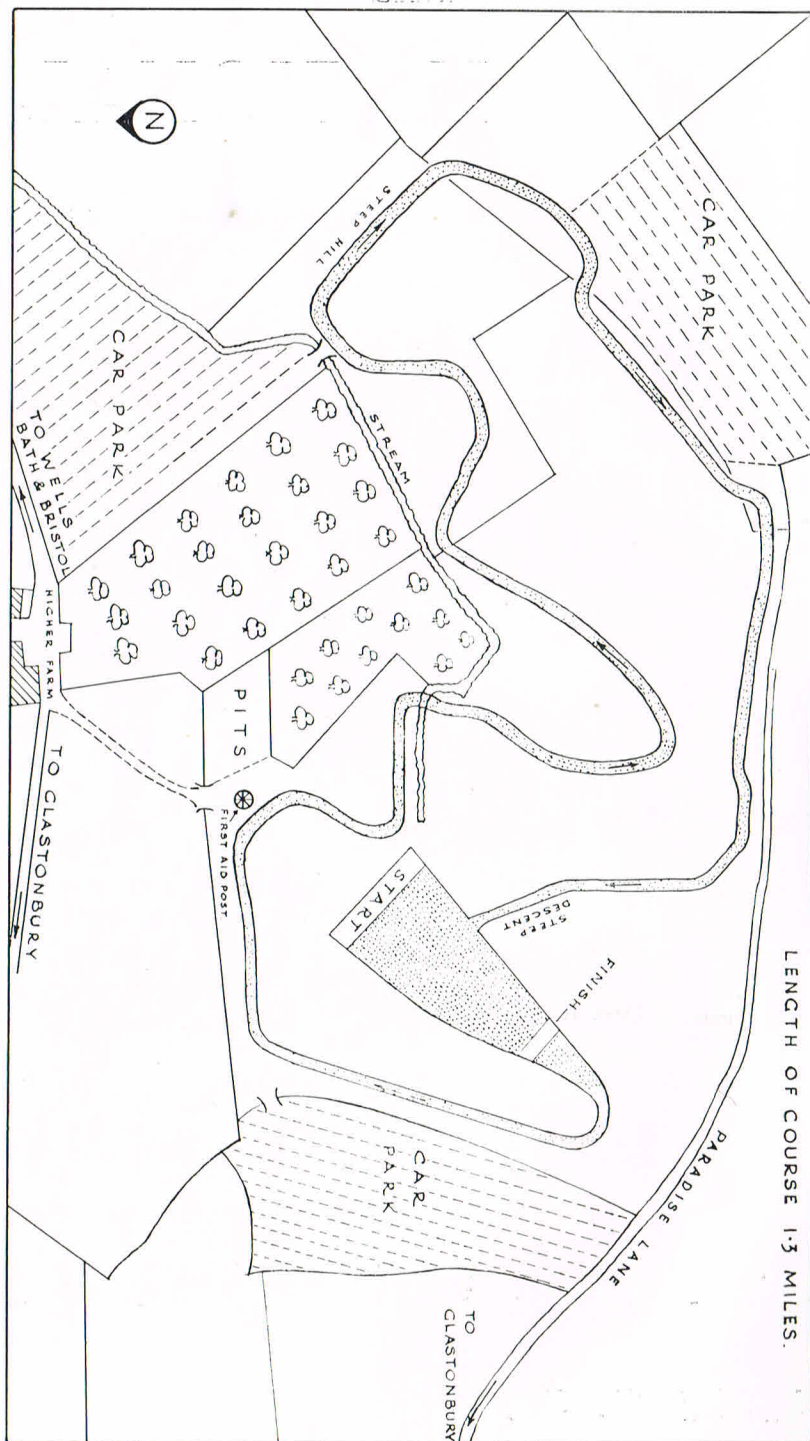

SCRAMBLING in Britain reached a new high this season. From the top international and national events down to the smallest club "do" there's been a terrific spirit of keenness and enterprise to put the sport over and to win new friends.

And it's succeeding with an impact that leaves no doubt in my mind that it is already jostling the accepted major sports for top-of-the-poll popularity.

We on the HERALD are proud to be part of the motor-cycle scene. 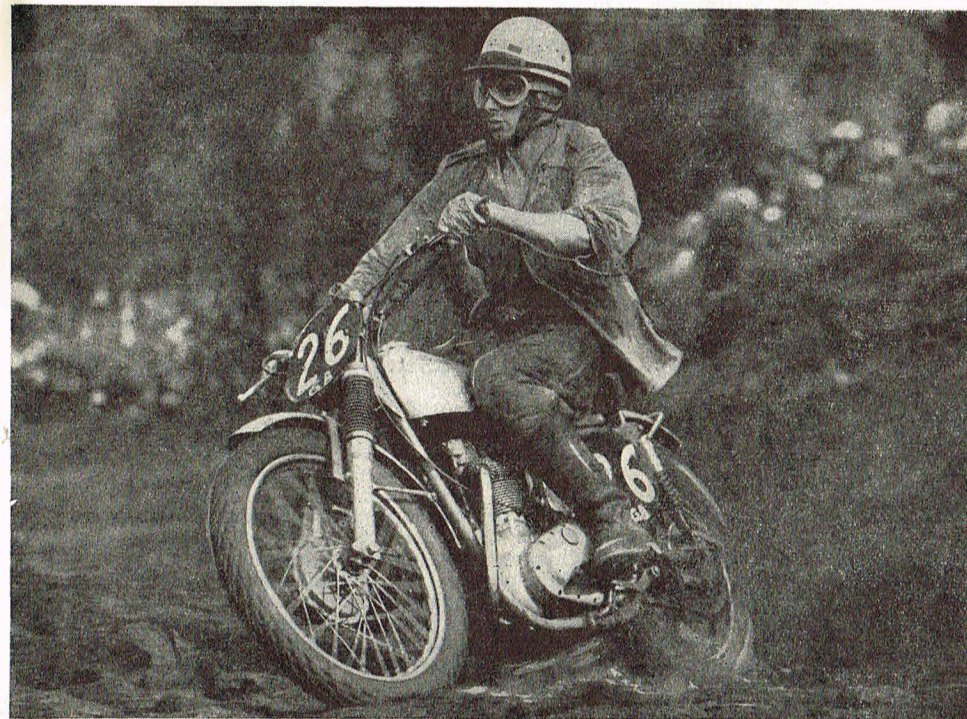

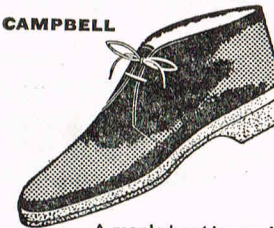

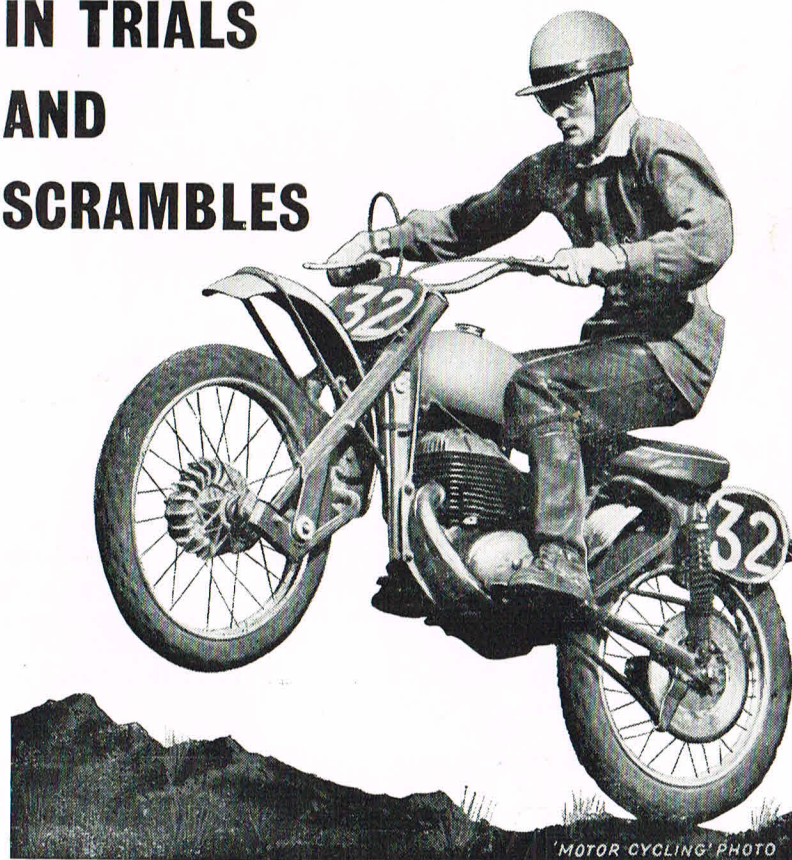
