Good Evening Ladies and Gentlemen,

A few words arising from last Tuesday evening's mixed entertainment. It leaves us with the pleasurable knowledge that we hand over cheques to the value of £260 each to the International Youth Rally and the Army Cadet Force. The recipients are extremely grateful, as will be those who receive the clothing so many of you so thoughtfully and generously brought along. My thanks to you all need hardly be expressed and my pleasure was in the achievement, which could not have been obtained without your support. So, once again, a big thanks from yours truly.

Now back to serious Speedway. Kindly note a slight rearrangement of fixtures: the Control Board has ruled that the match against Belle Vue on 8th August at Southampton and at Belle Vue last Saturday shall be the Second Round of The National Trophy (the Knock-Out Final matches originally arranged for those dates will now be held on 5th September at Southampton and 9th September at Belle Vue).

So next Tuesday we entertain Belle Vue in the second leg of the second round of the National Trophy. The score in the first leg held at Belle Vue last Saturday leaves us a margin of 10 points to make up. The remaining teams in the National Trophy are: Swindon, Norwich and Ipswich or Coventry.

After the knock-out from the competition of Wimbledon by Norwich, anything could happen, but our lads are extremely keen and on top form and are not prepared to give an inch of ground.

With us this evening for the Semi-Final of the World Championship we have Mr. Reg. Payne, the Editor of "The Sunday Pictorial", who, as you know, sponsor the World Championship and have been such loyal friends and the only National Press to give the sport of Speedway what it is entitled to. For this wonderful publicity let this sporting Editor know how you appreciate what he has done in the past and is still doing. I sometimes wonder what would have happened to Speedway if so much consideration by "The Sunday Pictorial" had been missing.

By the way, have you obtained your Wembley tickets yet? An all-English Final is something different and, I believe, the first of its kind to be held at this vast arena. What a night's racing this could be. The top nine scorers go to Malmo, where our Bjorn Knutsson will represent the Saints, together with, we hope, Barry Briggs.

I should like to acknowledge a letter, jointly signed by V. Cozens, S. R. Blake and J. C. Doling and if they will let me have an address I will reply to them personally.

### Speedway Championship of the World, 1961

(Sponsored by "THE SUNDAY PICTORIAL") by DON CLARKE

Three months ago 140 British Speedway riders started on a rough, tough trek, which makes T.V.'s "Wagon Train" series seem like a Sunday School outing.

Target set by these 140 tough guys is the "golden road" which leads to Wembley Stadium, and a claim for the "Sunday Pictorial"-sponsored British World Final, due to be settled on Saturday, 2nd September.

After twenty preliminary rounds—in which 108 riders have gone to the wall—we are left with thirty-two survivors to fight this week's four semi-finals at Wimbledon, Southampton, Norwich and Belle Vue (Manchester).

If the thirty-two semi-finalists think they have had a tough ride getting to this stage of the World Championship competition, wait until they go to the starting tapes tonight!

The road to Wembley can be killing. Each competitor has two rides, one on a small track, the other on a large track. The sixteen with the highest totals from the combined scores go forward to the Wembley Final.

To the highest point-scorer at each of the four semi-finals goes a £50 cheque in "Pictorial" prize-money, plus a possible place in the Wembley Final.

Once through to Wembley—Speedway's greatest night of the year—this is what the sixteen finalists can expect as rewards: Winner £300, Second £150, Third £80, Fourth £50, Fifth £30, and Sixth, Seventh, Eighth and Ninth £15 apiece.

Added incentive in the Wembley Final is extra "Sunday Pictorial" prize-money of £50 for riders who set up the fastest times in their five rides.

On top of "Pictorial" cash awards, finalists receive also, £2 10s. per start, plus £5 for every point scored.

With such glittering prizes at stake, no quarter will be given in tonight's battles.

As one rider aptly puts it: "We will be climbing up each other's backs for every point we can get". And that is how it should be!

Fans looking forward to the "Battle of Giants" at Wembley Stadium on 2nd September are advised to book their seats at their Speedway Office tonight.

Ticket prices are: Covered seats, 21/-, 12/6 & 10/6; Uncovered seats 8/6 & 6/-; Standing 3/6.
