

Good Evening Everyone,

The pace in the Provincial League is rapidly speeding up, and with the end of the season now in distant view, no less than eight teams must all be considered as battling with chances to steal the title. How one rates each team's chances will be a matter for argument at the present stage, but the fact remains that, at the time of writing, Stoke, Plymouth and Poole are at the head of the table with 18 points respectively, Exeter and Newcastle are on the 16 point mark, while Sheffield and Cradley are right in the fight with 14 points.

These teams are scrapping it out every inch of the way, with Newcastle sitting nicely poised with a match or two in hand. One other team, however, unheralded in the earlier part of the season, has come thundering through from the back in the last few weeks. That team, you will hardly need to be told, is Neath, the side we all saw in action here last week, when they gave us perhaps our most memorable match since the Pirates helped to establish this thriving and lusty league.

Our own lads drove in another fine shot towards the target, when they won a close match at Bradford on Saturday. The win was a real team effort as the scores will indicate, and the individual points (including bonus points) were: Tony and Geoff 10. Tim 9, Ross 7, Roy 6, Norman and Bobby 3. One or two of our second strings, however, seem to be finding the points a little hard to come by lately, and naturally, with the Championship in our sights, we shall have to keep a very close eye on the performances of Pete Munday, who, in such a short time, is already knocking on the door for entry into the team.

Tonight the Pirates take up the fight once again, and we welcome as our visitors the impressive-looking outfit from Middlesbrough. If names count for anything, then this side will make our lads pull out all the stops, for their line-up includes ex-National Leaguers Eric Boothroyd, Johnnie Fitxpatrick, and the man who will be remembered for his prolific point-scoring for Southampton a few seasons ago. Brian McKeown, Brian, after two or three seasons back home in Australia, returned this year to ride for the Bears, becoming immediately their leading scorer, Clive Hitch, of course, is well known to us all as one of the very best riders produced by the Provincial League. The match should be yet another tip-top scrap, and one which the Pirates must win to stay up with the leaders. The two matches that will undoubtedly prove decisive for the Pirates are the two away fixtures against Neath and Exeter. The former is scheduled for next Saturday, while the Exeter match will be raced on September 3rd. But what a season it has been. There can hardly be anyone in speedway with a memory long enough to recall the time (if there ever was one) when so many sides had such a big interest in the final placings at this stage of the season,

Later this month, the opening rounds of the Provincial Riders' Championship will burst upon us. The Draw for these rounds has been made, and our own lads' engagements have been listed on another page. Next week we shall be publishing full details of the method by which this competition will be run, but we can tell you now that it is going to have a 24-RIDER FINAL.

Meantime, let's get on with the racing and see if the Pirates can sustain their challenge to become Provincial League Champions for the second year running.


