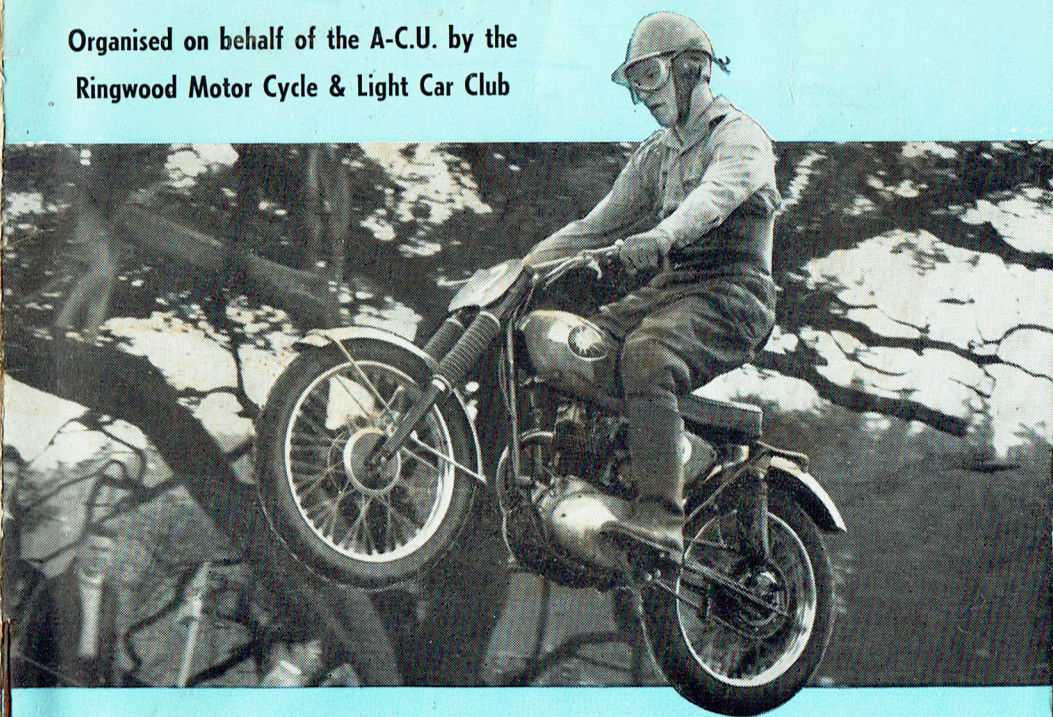

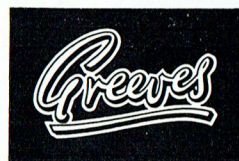

THE INTER-CENTRE TEAM SCRAMBLE CHAMPIONSHIP

I doubt if there's anything quite so unpredictable in scrambling as a team championship. You look down the lists of teams, you weigh up the chances of each rider against his many opposite numbers and, on paper at least, you know the winning combination. Then you watch the races, confident . . . and DEAD WRONG!

But right or wrong, there's something about this particular clash between the Centres which brings together the best moto-cross men in Britain, that makes the blood quicken. What better to illustrate these points than last year's event at Rollswood.

With Don and Derek Rickman, Ron Stillo and Ivor England riding for the Southern Centre and Dave Curtis leading an equally strong South Midland line-up, it looked just a matter of picking the winner from a two-horse race.

But on the day . . . Curtis won both races all right, but his teammate couldn't stay with him at that terrific pace. Southern's Ron Stillo broke an oil pipe seconds before the race: he borrowed a machine but couldn't get in the first 20. Derek Rickman crashed on the first lap and injured a thigh, Don pressed on to finish second. In the second race Don overslid and did well to finish 12th, three places behind Derek with Ivor a further five places away.

But the favourites had had it. And instead, little-fancied Wessex Centre whose modest team manager Vic Keeling had earlier admitted: "I don't see how we can possibly beat the Southern Centre's fine combination" squeezed home victorious BY ONE POINT over South Midland.

It was, of course, sheer teamwork that won them the title. Their four riders—Peter Stirland, Ken Messenger, Frank Underwood and Mike Griffiths—were never closer than fifth place behind the leader, but in spite of everything, there was always three of the four in tight formation throughout each of the two 15-mile races.

Even after Ken Messenger had been carried unconscious from the track following a ten-rider pile-up, the others kept going—a brilliant demonstration of single-mindedness.

Who will carry off the massive silver *Daily Herald* Challenge Trophy as winners of today's event? I can, as usual, see a fair crop of "good 'uns" but I don't think I'll be sticking my neck out too far in again tipping the Southern Centre. They've a fine record in the competition having previously won the title in 1955, 1959 and 1960.

And don't forget tomorrow's *Daily Herald* will carry a full report and complete results of today's meeting.

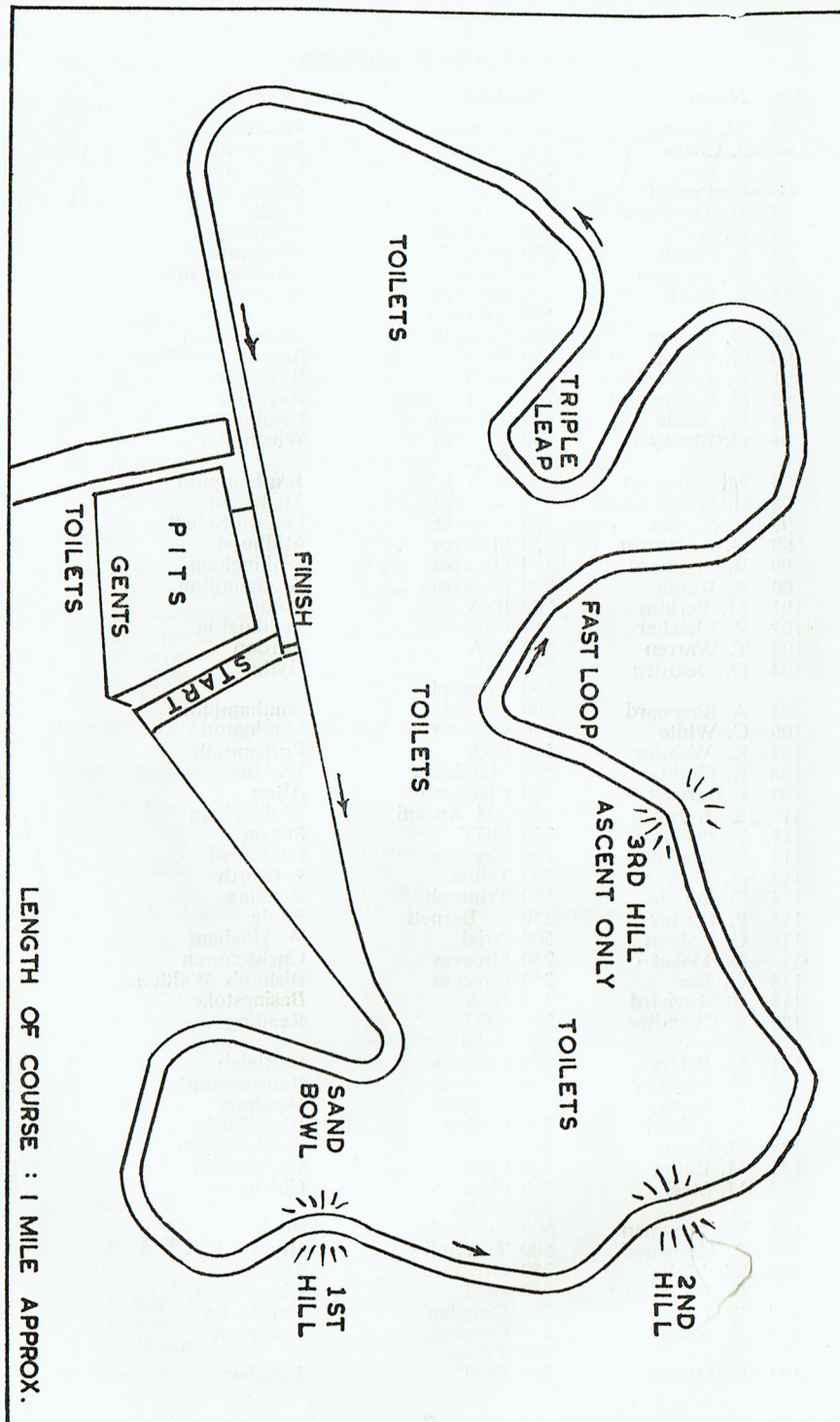

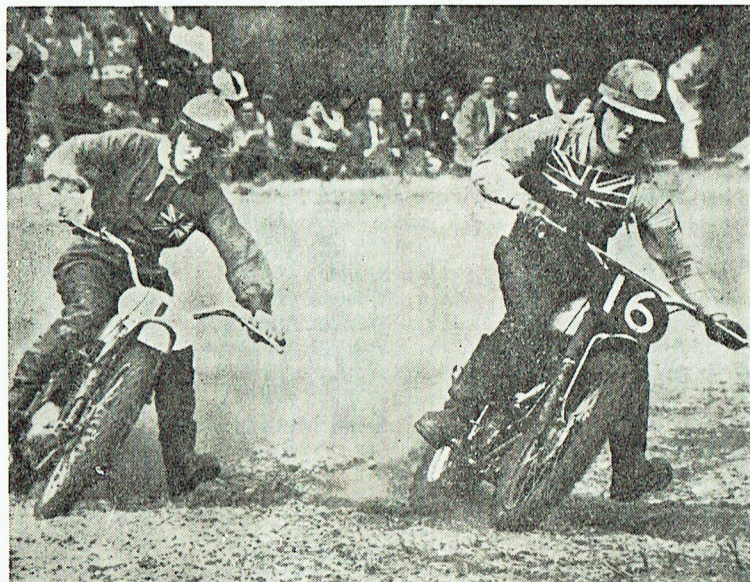
