E N G I N E S.

1. BURRELL General Purpose Engine No. 2767 built 1905. 9 tons 5 cwt A single crank compound engine, new to R.Heard of Weston Zoyland. Used for threshing until 1946 and then timber hauling. It has been extensively restored and its owner, J.Chappell of Wembdon still occasionally uses it for threshing.
2. FODEN "D" Type Tractor, No. 13444, Built 1929, 8 tons. This engine has had six owners and has been used for many purposes, among then being showman's work and timber hauling. It was purchased by present owners J.Chappell and R.Smith in 1957 and named "Little Lady"
3. BURRELL Scenic Type Showman's Road Loco. No.3888 Built 1921. This Loco. was travelled by a London Firm of Amusement Caterers and is names "General Gough". It has been extensively restored by the present owner, J.Miller of Whitchurch.
4. BURRELL Showman's Tractor, originally built for W.D. as a crane tractor, converted to showman's about 1920 and used by Herberts of Dorchester for rest of working life. Present owner J.M.Gilbey.
5. FOWLER. Heavey Haulage Loco. No. 14934 Built 1917, 12 tons called "Monarch of the Road" originally built for the Russian Government but never shipped abroad, it has since been used for general agricultural work. Present owner, S.T.Woodland.
