

## Promoter's Piece

Hello there!

My goodness those Glasgow Tigers took us closer than we expected last week! Wins don't come much narrower than that—seven heats all-square and just two points in it at the end.

After the hectic battlings earlier in the week in the Midland Cup. it was a great show by the lads to return to Cowley and make our British League record here six wins out of six.

What a turnabout the form was though. Arne reliable as ever, of course, with a faultless maximum. But Jimmy was not at his peak again. He is being bugged by clutch trouble just now, so here's hoping his experiments pay off and he gets it sorted out soon.

But the two lads really out of luck last week were poor Eddie Reeves and Tony Clarke. Eddie's reconditioned engine simply seized solid on him in his first heat and the track spare did not suit him. So, regretfully he had to bow out of the rest of the meeting. He has had this last week to put it right, we hope.

Tony was almost unrecognisable as the fiery fighter of the week before against Edinburgh and could not register. He must come right back though. The sooner the better.

Still Eddie's misfortunes gave Des Lukehurst his chance and did he take it. He was obviously inspired by the phenomenal, right out-of-the-blue maximum at Long Eaton a couple of days before.

That particular night, the Archers' management did all in their power to prevent us winning. They rode Ray Wilson four times in the first seven heats. and, like Ray Cresp, Ray finished up with 13 points from six rides.

Just to show how determined they were, the number eight man Long

Eaton put in never raced all night.

But, boy, did Des show them. He was making the gate with the best of them. I can assure you—if you need it after Des's fighting performance against Glasgow—that his maximum was no fluke. The Archers were really out to win that night and Des still led from start to finish in all his outings.

Afterwards Des confirmed that it was, in fact, his first full maximum in speedway, though he has had three or four "paid" maximums. In only his second meeting ever he got an "eleven pays 12". This was at Hackney when Des

was riding for New Cross.

The night after our first away win of the season, at the Archers' expense, we were up against those Coventry Bees again. This time, with the honourable exceptions of Arne and Jimmy, we have to admit they were too good for us— 12 points too good in the end, I'm sorry to say.

But I was delighted to see the rest of the boys really riding their hearts out even though things never really went their way. They never made the gate like the home riders and that, I'm afraid, was that. Still our lads all gave 100 per cent for four laps.

It was just one of those nights and those Coventry riders take a hell of a

lot of catching on their own track.

Incidentally, talking of liking your home track, did you notice that the night after topping Glasgow's scoresheet against us that crowd-pleaser Charlie Monk notched 15 points in Scotland's win over the Russians on the White

Of course, the greatest news of the week has been that Arne has rightfully been named as Barry Briggs' next challenger for his Match Race championship and that coveted Golden Helmet.

So those of you who fancy a jaunt to the coast to cheer our skipper, make a date for tomorrow week, Friday, July 15 at Poole. Just re-capping, Arne and

Briggs have already had one match race this season.

On April 21, Arne took Cyril Maidment's Silver Sash away in the match race during the match against Belle Vue. The following week, however, Briggo took it away in the one straight race after Arne had led the Swindon ace home in the first heat of the match. The Golden Helmet, of course, is a best-of-three affair, and here's wishing Arne all the best at Poole.

As you will, no doubt, by now have noticed, we are reverting to a 7.45 p.m. start. We tried bringing it forward quarter of an hour, solely for the convenience of the spectators, many of whom make long journeys to get to Cowley.

Clearly, it has not worked very well. Apart from spectators drifting in late —often until at least 8 p.m. or later—visiting riders have not always found it easy getting here in time either. So we reckon it will suit everyone better to revert to 7.45 p.m. After all we have repeatedly suffered from late starts while the 7.30 p.m. starts have been in operation.

Incidentally, it was great to see the letters column show up so well in last week's programme. Keep it up fans. Keep writing in with grouses, suggestions,

news, views, etc.

Just a word again to you lads. Come on, push your good-looking girl friends into our Miss Oxford Speedway contest. We want plenty to choose from. Rembmer, photos with full name and address to the Speedway Office.

1. Give the reserve spot to Pete Seaton for at least six weeks. This feeling is quite strong on the terraces and would be fair as Des Lukehurst has been given a long run in the team and shown no improvement. How can a promising junior improve having two second half rides a week on a track that's been cut up.

2. Obviously speedway at Oxford will improve if bigger crowds can be present, atmosphere being important. At the moment a person could live in Oxford and not know that the town had speedway, so poor is publicity. The Oxford Mail should be "worried" into providing the same sort of coverage to speedway as that given to football and cricket.

3. Race times should be official and accurate. These sustain interest.

5. Keep on at Ron How. It would be great to have him back with us.

We could beat any team in the country then.
