

'DUKES' THE DEBATE

Tonight we welcome our great rivals, fellow Yorkshiremen from the City of Steel, the Sheffield 'Tigers.' Twice recently 'Tigers' promoter Frank Varey has been to The Shay as England team manager—you can be sure that he has instructed his boys as to the quickest way around our circuit, so 'Dukes,' watch out for it tonight. 'Tigers' Bob Paulson received a hairline fracture of the shoulder blade last week, hence the blank spot at No. 6. It is hoped that Bob will ride tonight, if not Sheffield will probably use their top men in each of those blank spots, under the team injury substitute rule.

The 'Dukes' tonight are minus young Eric Boocock who is away in Poland with the Great Britain Test team. The team are due back on Monday and we hope with a list of victories behind them. In Eric's place tonight-under the International replacement rule—we have from King's Lynn, Terry Betts.

Our meeting here last Wednesday week against Oxford resulted in a runaway for the 'Dukes' with only the 'Cheetahs' Arne Pander extending our boys. Arne was in great form to drop only one point during the night to Dave. At Poole last Friday Arne failed to lift the Golden Helmet from the head of Barry Briggs. Barry won in two straight runs.

Although we went full of confidence last Saturday to Swindon (where we won last year) the match resulted in a win for the 'Robins' by 49 points to 29. Tommy, still plagued by the gremlins in his E.S.O., was forced to quit after his first race. Young Eric was riding his No. 2 machine (completed with the borrowing of a few bits and pieces from John Dews and Charlie Monk), his usual machine having been sent to Poland in advance. Dennis and Bob failed to get to grips with the slick Swindon surface whilst the Skipper stormed to a hardy ten points. Bert from the reserve berth scored a creditable five points, two of them on Dennis' machine after his own had split a fuel tank. Swindon scorers: Briggs 12, Broadbanks 12, Hitch 8, Keen 8, Kilby 6, Ashby 2 and Shuter 1. 'Dukes': Skipper Eric 10 plus 1 bonus, young Eric 8 plus 1, Dave 6 plus 1, Bert 5, Tommy 0, Dennis 0 and Bob 0.

Next big events coming up are the visits of Swedish tourists Vargarna and the Polish National team. Both teams are due next weekend and a full list of where they can be seen will appear in next week's programme.

RESULTS OF NORDIC/BRITISH FINAL

This meeting on Thursday, 14th July at Sheffield was the last stage before the European Final at Wembley on Saturday, 3rd September. The top eight scorers from this meeting go forward to Wembley to join the top eight from the recently-held Continental Final at Slany, Czechoslovakia.

The eight qualifiers with their totals were: Barry Briggs (Swindon and New Zealand) 15, Ivan Mauger (Newcastle and New Zealand) 13, Nigel Boocock (Coventry and England) 12, Colin Pratt (Hackney and England) 10, George Hunter (Edinburgh and Scotland) 10, Ken McKinlay (West Ham and Scotland) 10, Sverre Harrfeldt (West Ham and Norway) 10, Mike Broadbanks (Swindon and England) 9. Other scorers: 'Dukes' Eric Boocock (four rides in place of Hans Christiansen) 6, Brian Brett (Newcastle and England) 6, Kalevi Lahtinen (Finland) 5, Ole Olsen (Denmark) 5, Nils Paulson (Norway) 3, Torbjorn Nygaard (Norway) 3, Johnny Faafeng (Norway) 2, Poul Wissing (Denmark) 1, Hans Christiansen (Denmark—one ride) 0.

13 ON POLAND'S SHORT-LIST

World Champions Poland have nominated a short-list of 13 riders for the tour of this country which opens with a Test Match against Great Britain on Friday, 29th July at Hackney. And sympathies to the Polish selectors when they come to decide which five riders will be omitted from this list. For amongst the riders are seven who have appeared in World Finals in recent years and several others who stand a great chance of reaching this year's World Final.

These are the men who thrashed the Russians (bar Igor Plechanov) in the Continental Final of the World Championship and remember that before the Russians became race and travel weary they were an even match for England in the series that has recently finished.

Poland has the most comprehensive league system outside the British Isles. They run two divisions with promotion and relegation. Last year, as 'Dukes' fans will remember, the R.O.W. Rybnik team, reigning Polish Champions, had a highly successful club tour of this country and four of their riders—Tkocz, Wyglenda, Woryna and Maj, as well as Pogorzelski (Stal Gorzow) who was also on the tour—are included in the listed 13 for this trip.

The riders on the short-list are Stanislaw Tkocz, Andrzei Wyglenda, Pawel Waloszek, Zbigniev Podlecki, Antoni Woryna, Andrzei Pogorzelski, Jan Mucha, Jerzy Trzeszkowski, Marian Kaiser, Edmund Migos, Konstantyn Pociejkowicz, Joachim Maj and Marian Rose.

Reigning Polish Champion and Golden Helmet holder Tkocz, Waloszek, Woryna (runner-up in the Continental Final), Pogorzelski (winner of Continental Final), Kaiser, Migos and Pociejkowicz are the members of the party who have qualified for the European Final at Wembley in September and another, Rose, scored nine points in the Continental Final—only two points less than the winner Pogorzelski—and it wasn't enough for him to qualify for Wembley!


