

A SHORT HISTORY OF THE "BATTLES OF NEWBURY."

In 1643, King Charles I, whilst marching upon London, was chased from the West Country and caught by the Parliamentarians, led by the Earl of Essex, on the outskirts of Newbury. A very bloody, but rather inconclusive battle took place on September 20th, and the following day the King withdrew his forces to Oxford. The most conspicuous reminder of this encounter is of course the Falkland memorial. But the name given to the scene of the battle—Wash Common—is believed to spring from the fact that that day the ground was awash with blood.

Just over one year later, on October 27th, to be precise, King Charles was returning from Cornwall when he was engaged in the second battle of Newbury. Although defeated by the Earl of Manchester, he was again allowed to escape, much to the chagrin of Oliver Cromwell. A fine memorial to this battle is the nearby Donnington Castle, the gate house of which is still standing and was recently restored from the ravages of time and vandals to become a protected ancient monument. It is quite conceivable that, if not actually fought over, our scrambles course was the site of a base camp for one of the opposing armies. So, you see, it is a very suitable location for the modern battles.

Over three hundred years elapsed before our go-ahead secretary, Dave Joyce, set out the plan of campaign for another "Battle of Newbury." Although less bloody, we hoped it might prove as colourful and long remembered as its illustrious forerunners. It was in fact the first scramble to bear this title and took place at Winterbourne, about two miles North-west of our present course. The victor this time, on March 11th 1962, was no Earl but our old friend Ken Heanes, mounted on his usual trusty Triumph charger. Probably a Royalist at heart!

March 10th the following year and the battlefield moved about four miles eastwards to Hartshill Copse at Cold Ash. This time top dog proved to be Vic Eastwood on a fiery steed trained at Plumstead. Most definitely a Parliamentarian!

In 1964 the same rugged course saw all other participants conceding victory, after some tough skirmishing amongst the scrubland to young Roger Snoad on a lightweight galloper provided by one Bert Greeves. Another Roundhead?

Next year the club achieved its big breakthrough when it obtained permission from Squire Fairhurst to mount battle over the present "Fox and Hounds" course. This immediately proved to be a popular move, not only amongst the combatants, but also the public who came to spectate. They could now observe the fighting more closely than ever before and there was ample space for them to put their own steeds out to graze whilst it took place. Joe Johnson, from Oxford, took top honours this time on his very British mount with the French sounding name of 'Metisse.' Aha! a foreign mercenary had joined the combat.

1966 and the same jousting ground with the Trophy awarded to the overall winner of the 2-leg 500 c.c. Moto-Cross. This year a redoubtable fighter all the way from Yorkshire, Arthur Lampkin (B.S.A. Victor) became our "Laughing Cavalier."

Last year we offered a larger sack of gold than ever before in this country to the worthy winner. The lists were filled by a magnificent entry. Unfortunately Dave Bickers, Derek Rickman and the aforementioned Arthur Lampkin were hors-de-combat. However past winners Vic Eastwood and Roger Snoad did battle right royally against such as Bryan Goss, Chris Horsfield, Don Rickman and Bryan Wade. But all these fine riders had to concede victory to Alan Clough aboard a Swedish Husqvarna. (A Norseman at the Battle of Newbury?).

So to Sunday, March 10th 1968. This year the inducements are the same as last time. With the unfortunate demise of another contest organised by the purveyors of a certain dried leaf imported to these islands by Sir Walter Raleigh, we hope for an ever mightier field of fearless warriors. Take up your chosen positions for battle is about to commence!

"Where," you may ask, "are the Falkland memorials and the Donnington Castles of today's battles?" I suggest you consider the many homes for youngsters run by the "Church of England Children's Society." These are scattered throughout the country with the nearest at Cold Ash. What better memorial could anyone ask? Remember that by supporting this and our other scrambles you are also providing for the welfare of some less fortunate members of the younger generation.

Thank you, and may you enjoy a superb day's sport.


