Courage Challenge 250c.c. MOTO-Cross Grand Prix of Great Britain

This is a great day for British Moto Cross. Not just hosting the World's top stars in the 250 cc class, but also witnessing the debut of the country's newest and most exciting permanent circuit. It's barely six months since Roger de Coster came here, and this land had not so much as a post in it. What's been done since then is a tribute to the Newbury Club. and the landowner. Captain Fairhurst. With De Coster's insight. and the Club's hard work. the new Fox and Hounds circuit has been created as one of the trickiest tracks in Europe. Laid out to give all of its spectators the best view of all its twists and turns - don't be deceived by its open-plan outlook. It's extremely difficult to ride, and to ride fast is the the supreme test of a champion. Into and around every corner lurks a hazard, an off-camber drop, a ditch. Every inch and contour of the natural terrain has been utilized to pit the riders wits against the speed and capabilities of his machine.

That's why it's a worthy venue for this Grand Prix today, and ironic that the most likely man to be its first champion is De Coster's arch rival Heikki Mikkola. Former 500 cc title holder, the determined 31 year old Finn is out this year to become the first man ever to win both world classes. On form and with the reliability of his Husqyarna, he is the man to do it.

Putting in a strong challenge this year are the KTM-mounted Russian team lead by Vladimir Kavinov and former 250 cc Champion Gennady Moisseev. Also in contention is a past British Grand Prix winner Torleif Hansen, the flambovant Swede on a very special works Kawasaki. Then there's American Jim Pomerov riding for the Spanish Bultaco factory. In fact the whole line up of the 250 cc Grand Prix reads like a list of potential winners, and many of them have been like Hakan Andersson, champion on Yamaha in 1973, and now with Montesa, or Harry Everts, last year's title holder on the twin-carb Puch. Or what about the incredible Jaroslav Falta, robbed of the championship by a protest at the end of 1974, spending most of 1975 in hospital with a blood disease, and now back with the leaders again.

Our own British riders feature the determined Geoff Mayes and Rob Hooper, who have travelled all the way across Europe and back to contest the rounds of the series so far. But for my money the youngster to watch will be Neil Hudson, currently upsetting the established names in the British Championship, and hungry for international experience.

Whatever the results today, it will be a victory of the rider, not the machine, nor luck and the conditions of the track.


