

leven successive years is a long time for a sponsor to be actively involved with any aspect of motorcycle sport, yet there was no hesitation on the behalf of the Haynes Publishing Group to continue to support the prestigious Four Stroke Motocross Championship after the 1986 series had drawn to a close. There has been a great resurgence of interest in four-stroke motocross during recent years, so much so that clubs are clamouring to have at least one event of this nature included in their annual programme, from which all twostrokes are barred. There is something magic about the big, thumping single, which demands real skill to ride successfully and is bound to be a crowd-puller. Few will dispute that all those who ride regularly in the Haynes Championship have become more like one very large family, so that apart from the keen sense of friendly competitiveness that abounds, events take in a social atmosphere too that culminates in the annual dinner and prize aiving after the final rounds have been run. This is motorcycle sport as it should be, a reminder of how

things were when British motor cycles reigned supreme and were a force to be reckoned with, both at home and on the Continent.

So many have been involved in the revival of four-stroke motocross that it is easy to overlook those who play a less glamourous, but nonetheless vital role behind the scenes. It is easy to forget those who prepare the machines and wield the spanners, the wives and airl friends who know little of the luxury of a Sunday lunch whilst the season is on, the officials and the marshals who assist with the running of events, their general organisation, and more often than not end up clearing all the litter left after a meeting, the car park attendants and programme sellers who, like the officials and marshals, are out in all weathers and see little, if anything, of a meeting, and those valiant first aiders who are there in a voluntary capacity yet if they were not in attendance, the meeting could not be run. One must not forget either the announcer who has to keep track of each race and provide a commentary to the spectators all round the course, the press and photographers who cover the

event and write about it in their newspapers and magazines, and the other sponsors, big and small, who support individual riders and make possible their entry in events which otherwise would create serious financial problems. Let's not forget the spectators too – their support is vital and their enthusiasm more than welcome or the Four-Stroke Riders and Supporters Club that has done so much to revive and keep alive the big four-stroke, which otherwise may have disappeared from the motocross scene altogether.

Special tribute must be paid to Lorna and Jim Wilds, who have planned and organised each year's Championship programme since the Haynes Publishing Group commenced sponsorship, and indeed even before. They enthusiastically support every meeting in which Championship rounds are included, no matter how far, and organise the annual dinner and dance at the end of each season. They too rarely enjoy the traditional Sunday lunch and are often on the road long before we have got up.
