



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HAYDON'S GP DEBUT

THE SELFLESS GESTURE by Ron Haslam of giving up his 'wild card' ride in the British Grand Prix in favour of James Haydon, is to be applauded. The 19 year-old will take to the grid at Donington in August to contest the show-piece event.

Haslam could have easily snapped up the chance himself, but instead unselfishly chose to give it to the ex-Superteen from Amersham. The ride came as an unexpected surprise for the Team Great Britain rider.

Haslam is anything but whimsical in his choice, however. Since plucking Haydon from the Superteens, he has carefully trained the youngster, turning him into one of the country's top 250cc runners.

Describing the young

rider, Haslam said "He is developing nicely and has a great deal more to give. His style is suited to a 500 and it's time to give him a taste of 500cc racing. He'll be the youngest rider there, but it's never too soon to start."


Haydon, who now lives on the Haslam farm in Derbyshire where he undergoes intensive training, said of the ride "It's a marvellous gesture by Ron and I'll do my best not to let him or the team down."

Team Great Britain is backed by Two Four Sports, the British Grand Prix promoters, who have put up a considerable sum to hire an ROC Yamaha from Serge Rosset for Hayson's GP debut.

Appleyard gets back to basics

AFTER A WEEKEND OF living in luxury at Donington Park a couple of weeks ago, it's back to the basics of paddock dwelling for Yorkshireman Robin Appleyard. When his wife Diane won a weekend break at a Hilton Hotel of her choice, Robin decided it would be ideal to combine business and pleasure and stay at one near Donington while he was contesting the second round of the HEAT Supercup series.

"Just for a weekend I thought I was in a works team," said the 125cc rider from Keighley.

The change of circuit living routine coincided with the major breakthrough he has been looking for since rejoining the short-circuit scene.

"I needed a win under my belt to get me going and got it," he explained.

This weekend Appleyard intends to try semi-automatic CTS gears, which allow upward changes without throttling back. "A lot of the grands prix riders use it so I'll give it a try," he explained.

Lofthouse

LEADING 125CC BRITISH contender Mick Lofthouse looked set for TT glory after dominating practice in last month's smallest class.

But his Honda seized while leading Joey Dunlop, now a record 16 times winner.

Mick was runner-up in last year's Supercup series and is hoping to rekindle his British challenge after gearbox problems at Donington.

Moly's Island magic

THE SENSATIONS of the Isle of Man Sidecar TT were Dave Molyneux and Karl Ellison. The double TT winners hit the mainland for the first time this year at Brands Hatch stoday.

The pair, who both reside on Mona's Isle, bring their home prepared 600cc Yamaha outfit over the Irish Sea for the 12 lap Formula II race.

Built completely from scratch and on a limited budget, the Yamaha was only completed a couple of days before TT practice started. Fresh from their wins and clearly in form, the Manx pair are prime contenders for a rostrum position. Another strong performance will almost certainly come from Eddy Wright and Pete Hill, but 350 specialists Dave Saville and Nick Roche have pulled out. Both teams had a good TT and are campaigning hard for championship honours.

Brindley's Back

Today sees a rare outing in the Formula II Sidecar class for John Brindley and Chris Jones, on a Sabre Tools prepared machine.

If performance goes to form the pair should be in the hunt for victory as they are currently the Brands Hatch Grand Prix Circuit lap record holders with 92.25mph, 1min 41.47sec set in June 1991. If the weather holds, the lap record may come under serious threat today.

Brindley has left sidecars in favour of solos this year, and lies fifth overall in the Sound of the Singles series.

Top Man Moodie

DOUBLE TT WINNER Jim Moodie puts his recent success in the Supersport 600 series down to finally having a race tuned engine.

The machine, leased through Honda Britain is being prepared by Tony Scott, and Moodie is clearly pleased with the results. He said "In the past I've run my Supersport machine in standard trim, but this year it's benefitting from some development work. In addition, the latest Avon tyres are working well, and the combination has set me up on a winning run."

The Scotsman gave the TT a miss for several years but decided to return this year on his more competitive CBR Honda in a bid to achieve his ambition of winning a race on the mountain course.

"I certainly never expected to leave with two trophies", he said, having also scooped the Supersport 400 class with a YZR 400 Yamaha. Moodie also finished second in the junior race in a rare outing on a 250 Honda.

If he returns to the TT next June, he makes no bones about wanting to ride the Crighton Rotary Norton he currently campaigns in the British and Supercup championships.

He enthused "It would be ideal, and I'm certain it would be possible to get it round faster than the JPS Norton Steve Hislop rode to victory last year."

Although he feels that his Norton campaign suffered a set-back when he was knocked off at Mallory Park early in the season, Moodie is confident he can mount a fight-back for the British Championship.

"A lot of work was done on the machine while I was at the TT, and it's now as good as it has ever been" he explained.

Ducati debut

SUPERSPORT SPECIALIST Mike Edwards raised a few eyebrows at Donington when, complete with flu, he took seventh place during his first ever Superbike ride on an 888cc Ducati. He took over Steve Wynn's machine when Ron Haslam decided he wasn't sufficiently fit to ride. In one practice session, he put in the fastest lap ever on the Leicestershire circuit.

"I got round in 1 minute 38 seconds, which compares pretty favourably with my previous best of 1m 39.5s on a Yamaha OWO1," said the Supersport 600 rider.

"After qualifying 13th for the Sunday races, I was looking for a similar position in the race or at best something in the higher top ten," added Edwards who even surprised himself.

With Haslam set for another 250cc outing this weekend expect to see Edwards aboard the Sports Motorcycles Ducati.

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WHITHAM'S WAY

WITH SIX WINS from eight races to his credit, Jamie Whitham is riding high in the ACU British 750cc Championship. The sixteen round series enters its second half at Brands Hatch this weekend and the 26 year-old from Crosland Moor near Huddersfield has so far opened up a 30 point lead over Fast Orange team-mate Rob McElnea, and a staggering 40 point advantage over Steve Hislop of the Castrol Honda team.

Although Whitham is now clear favourite for the champions' trophy, the challenge being mounted by Honda is getting stronger, and with 160 winning points still to be contended, the championship outcome is by no means a certainty.

Hislop, based in the Isle of Man, started his challenge to the Yamaha dominance at Donington, when he snatched victory over Whitham in the first leg by a fraction of a second. In the second leg however, Hislop went down at the Esses when he tried to nip past Whitham on the inside.

"It was my fault", the Scot admitted, "But at last I had proved that James and the Yamaha are not invincible in the British Championship."

This weekend sees Hislop arrive with the new RVF Honda, which should prove a potent threat to the Yamahas of Whitham and McElnea.

Castrol Honda Team manager Neil Tuxworth said "We've been testing a new engine in preparation for this event. At Donington in the Supercup event Steve was lapping quicker than when he beat Whitham in the British Championship round, but was not able to present such a challenge.

"Although we are the ones chasing at the moment, I'm confident we will get on terms in the near future."

Fast Orange Team leader McElnea is equally confident. He declared "We are working towards machine perfection all the time. We are in front and that's where we intend to stay."

Knocked off

Glaswegian Jim Moodie currently dominates the Supersport 600 scene and is pleased with the Crighton Norton on which he holds fourth place in the Superbike ratings. Talking of his campaign so far, he said "We had a set back when I got knocked off at the Mallory Bus Stop earlier in the season, but are getting back on the pace again."

Matt Llewellyn is having an impressive season on his Kawasaki, and a new lease of life has emerged for Somerset's Alex Buckingham, who should be back with his 1993 OWO1 Yamaha engine after switching to last year's spare for the Donington Supercup rounds following an expensive failure at Castle Combe a week earlier.


Brian Morrison is racing well on the factory spec Kawasaki and added interest comes to the round with Terry Rymer, who has taken a break from his World Superbike schedule to race at his home circuit.

TT Winner

This year's double TT winner Jim Moodie holds a 13 point advantage over fellow Scot Ian Simpson in the Supersport 600s. Racing with a properly tuned engine is clearly paying off.

His progress in the last round at Donington bordered on the spectacular as he fought his way through from the back of the grid to finish third behind defending champion Phil Borley and Hailsham's David Heal.

The Supersport 400 title has seen a new potential champion emerging in

the form of Andy Murphy. Three second places have elevated him to the top spot, and the York rider now holds a 10 point lead over Ian Simpson who failed to score at his native Knockhill, but has since stormed to two race victories.

In the 250cc class Paul Brown, who switched from Yamaha to Honda support this season, is proving hard to beat. The Humberside rider took the overall lead at Donington Park where he earned a hard-fought victory which gives him a 13 point buffer over Preston's Mark Barker.

Darren Mitchell's consistency has given him a share of third place with reigning champion Steve Sawford.

125cc class

The return from the Grands Prix arena of Steve Patrickson and Robin Appleyard has added spice to an already competitive 125cc class. Patrickson fought his way to victory in the last round, despite dropping to 20th when Fernando Mendes crashed in front of him on the second lap.

He now leads the overall championship by six points over Andy Hatton, winner at Knockhill and early season leader.

South African Mendes, now based in Bedfordshire, lies in third with Yorkshireman Appleyard sharing fourth

with Mick Lofthouse, who took victory at Donington a fortnight ago.

The name Hanks has been synonymous with sidecar racing since the fifties, when Fred took a Matchless to seventh place in the Isle of Man TT. Roy, one of his three racing sons, was a leading light in the introduction of the 350cc racing class, and currently leads the Formula II campaign.

High scoring performances in all four

rounds have put Roy and nephew Tom in front, but a double winner in the series from another famous sidecar family, Mick Boddice, is only three points behind despite being sidelined in the last round with wheel bearing seizure.

Although last off the line last time out, Gary Smith stormed to a surprise victory with passenger Tony Balazs.




Meakin Team Green Silkolene




Alternatively, why not stagger your departure times, as even a short wait at the end of the meeting could prevent you sitting in a traffic jam.
