## Flying Scot on home ground for more wins

Niall Mackenzie is on home ground, and that spells even more trouble for the pretenders to his title. The champion is no mood to relinquish his Motor Cycle News British Superbike crown. He has spelt that out in the last six races – all of them straight victories.

The Flying Scot might have celebrated his 36th birthday at the recent Oulton Park round, but he still has the style, speed and skills to set the pace. And that was no more apparent than last Sunday when he took a brilliant

third in the opening World Superbike race at Brands Hatch.

Mackenzie goes into rounds 15 and 16 with a 74 points advantage over his team-mate Chris Walker, but there will be no easing up. The champion is determined to keep his "number one" plates. He has won nine of the 14 races so far and is riding as well now, as at any time in his long and illustrious career.

But, the rest will not take his domination lying down. They are equally hungry for success. The promise here is hot-action. The season is just into the second half, with eight races to go, and that means 200 points to be won. Mackenzie might be ahead in the tables, but there is a long, long way to go, and nothing can be taken for granted.



The Scotsman, is a wily campaigner – his pedigree of British 250cc and 350cc Championship success and then a decade in the fast lane of grands prix makes him equal to just about any challenges.

He came through last season's "winner-takes-all" final race scrap with his teamster James Whitham to grab the crown, and now finds himself again hounded by his team-mate. Talk about an action replay! Walker look out.

Throughout the last season the two Cadburys Boost Yamaha riders had called the tune, but Mackenzie grabbed the results when it mattered most in the final round – he won the British crown, Whitham impressed so much he won a ride for the works Suzuki team in World Superbikes.

Having won through that, Mackenzie is the real man for a tough situation. He is at home with the Yamaha, upgraded for this season with more factory parts and a world superbike specengine.

Mackenzie used this to the full in the opening action at Donington Park, blitzing the opposition with a winning

CADBURY'S BOOST YAMAH

Using upgraded Yamahas this year, with world championship engines of last term, former grand prix ace Mackenzie was delighted with the package in his efforts to add to his British title winning pedigree.

Joined in the team by Nottingham's Chris Walker — a hot-talent who went from zero to hero in a couple of years, winning all before him as he took up racing, eventually riding in a handful of grands prix.

Mackenzie continued to provide the thrills in a brilliant front running duel with John Reynolds, currently third in the points standings on the Reve Red Bull Ducati. Reynolds clipped the lap record to grab pole start, and set the pace in the early stages of the race, but Mackenzie powered back to snatch the win. And then the Scot provided an action replay in the second race.

"There are a lot of points to be won out there, but it is looking good for me," Mackenzie smiled, adding: "this was a good way to celebrate my birthday, and I don't feel any older!"

Mackenzie underlined those sentiments next time out at the tight Mallory Park circuit, taking a fourth winning double to increase his lead to an amazing 74 points, and this in a series that is reckoned to be the toughest in the world.



#### **Private** challenges

his year's Motor Cycle News British Superbike Championship features a race within a race - the Privateers Cup - which offers the non-works riders a slice of the glory and some hard earned prize monies.

The Privateers Cup has already produced some brilliant dicing and action through the field with Stoke Golding's Ray Stringer (pictured) on the Sabre Airways Kawasaki setting the pace. He comes here with a seemingly unbeatable lead of 101 points over Brett Sampson with Dean Ashton in third place.



Stringer was top privateer in three of the first four races, beaten in the second Donington race by Ashton, who was also to make good use of the Kawasaki ace's "noscore" at Brands Hatch by winning there also. Stringer, however, was back on form at Thruxton, with a winning double, to take charge of the Cup, underlining his dominance with another winning brace at Oulton Park and then, like Mackenzie making it a straight six at Mallory Park.

Sampson has clung in there, four times in those six races taking second places, and that has been just enough to keep Ashton at bay, but after a lean time at Oulton Park, he is fighting back, as his second and third places

at Mallory Park underlined.

Both know that if they are to make any inroads into Stringer's advantage, or head him off in the title run-in, then they have to start winning now. It could make for some fascinating action, keeping the races on the boil throughout the field.

In these situations, every placing and every point are vital.

ottingham motorcycle mechanic Andi Notman is virtually assured of the People National 125cc Championship – he has provided a brilliant front running performance, being headed off only twice in the nine races so far.

Notman began his championship blast with a victory at Brands Hatch, just ahead of Les Wood, who is still just adrift in the overall title rankings. Wood turned the tables at Thruxton, winning ahead of Matt Ford-Dunn with Notman back in third.


But, Notman retaliated in style, taking the next six races by storm, winning the lot, but then being surprised at Oulton Park by young Paul Jones, who riding splendidly took the honours ahead of him.

Notman is 50 points clear with three races, including this one remaining, and it is much the same story in the People National Supersport 600 Championship where Jonti Hobday, the winner of three rounds, is 42 points head of Ian Bennett, so far twice a winner.

The Honda CB500 Cup, with its massive entry also promises some fine action, particularly in the Newcomers battle where Dan Stewart and Chris Sherring are locked in a tight scrap. Only three points part them - Stewart, the consistent rider, has scored in every round but has still to win. Sherring has won three times and taken a second place.

But, in the National race James Toseland should seal the crown the winner of five of the first six races, he was also first on the road in the Oulton Park round but was docked his placing on a technical mat-

The Sheffield schoolboy is 45 points clear of Ian Bennett and knows that a win here would make him unbeatable.





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

#### Scots drive on Brown

aul Brown looks the hot-shot for the crown - the former 250cc British Champion taken charge of the championship battle with brilliant form in the last four outings.

But he needs to be aware of the "home" challenge as he powers into the eighth round here at Knockhill. Ian Simpson, the

man who trails him by 40 points, will be counting on massive support from his Scottish supporters to lift his challenge.

And Glaswegian Jim Moodie, together with Iain Duffus, will be looking for a major points haul in the series only visit into their native country.

All of them should be aware of the challenge of Ulsterman Philip McCallen - he was the opening round winner at Donington Park, finishing just ahead of Aussie ace Dean Thomas in a real thriller. but apart from a second place at Thruxton appears to have lost the plot.

However, the man who pushed himself through the pain barrier to take more victories in the Isle of Man TT races back in June will be on the charge here and that could spell problems for the title aspirants.

Simpson won the second race at Oulton Park, aboard Jack Valentine's V&M Honda Britain machine, just ahead of his teammate, the defending champion Dave Heal, but so far that has been the only taste of the winner's champagne for the Dalbeattie rider.

A second placing at Brands Hatch and a third on the return visit to Oulton Park have kept him in the frame for the crown, but he needs to start winning again here.

Heal, although he has scored points in every round, needs a victory to maintain any lingering hopes of keeping the crown for a second year - the man who enjoyed something like 120 victories on the biker formerly raced by current world motor racing champion Damon Hill is certainly in need of a good placing here.


lain Duffus returns to the championship, recovered from the injuries received in a horrific crash at Snetterton back in May he had been in the points at both Doninaton and Oulton before being sidelined, and after racing last weekend in the Bike Trader Production Powerbike Championship at Brands Hatch is getting back in trim.

However, all eyes will be on Brown, the man in the driving seat. But, he had to wait until the fourth round to sample seasonal success. At Snetterton, it was Thomas who took the glory, but Brown was stacking up the points with a solid third.

Then, he upped the tempo with three straight victories at Brands Hatch, Thruxton and Oulton Park, but, right against the form-book he was beaten into the second place at Mallory Park by teenage sensation James Toseland.

The Sheffield schoolboy, looking to start his A-levels next month, has already passed his examinations in bike racing. Virtually assured of the Honda CB500 Cup with victories in five of the first six races, he is proving himself against some of the country's finest.

It sets up an interesting scenario for

And with Simpson deteramined to blast to home success, it could be a turning point in the season.

But Toseland could have the final say. The possibilities are endless, for the spectators, that adds up to brilliant action.

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#### Title scrap



Darren Barton grabbed the advantage in the title stakes at the Mallory Park double round - the former grand prix rider nipped ahead of Fernando Mendes by a couple of points thanks to a late charge that earned him a second place.

Barton, pictured below left, heads the action in a three way scrap for the title – don't rule out Phelim Owens, also pictured, as he is only 16 points down on the leader after nine thrilling races, even though he is still to win a race.

It's a series that could well go to the last round – five different winners so far, making the outcome unpredictable.

Chris Burns, the 18 year old Superteen graduate, is the latest of

these winners – he celebrated his "wild-card" entry into next Sunday's British Grand Prix at Donington Park with a sparkling display. Second in the opener to Fernando Mendes, he headed off Barton to win the second.

They were rides to move him into fifth place in the rankings and on the fringe of the title chase, with 94 points.

Mendes enjoyed his second win of the series, but it was not enough to keep him on top of the pile, as Barton, the winner of three previous races picked up a total of 28 points at the Leicestershire circuit.

Other winners so far have been Rodney Fee, who took the opening round glory at Donington Park, Paul Robinson at Snetterton and Jason Davis at Brands Hatch.



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Scott Smart is well on the charge for the crown, but he is under real pressure from Jason Vincent the race here is another crucial head to head for these two riders.

Vincent made local knowledge pay last time out on his local Mallory Park circuit taking the verdict from Smart who had injured his wrist in a testing spill prior to the

The duel for the title between them began in the opening shoot-out at Donington Park - Smart was on top then in both races, with the Earl Shilton rider just adrift, and the nephew of Britain's last winner of the World 500cc Championship Barry Sheen completed a hat-trick of wins next time out at Oulton Park.

Mark Coates took the honours at Snetterton, ahead of Vincent and Smart. and then at Brands Hatch, Woolsey Coulter made good use of Smart's European Championship diversion to chalk up a memorable double.

Smart, pictured here, chasing double glory this year, domestic and Euro, had to

settle for second best to Vincent at Thruxton. but was back ahead as the action returned for a second time to Cheshire and Oulton Park.

Now, he needs to re-kindle the form that took Knockhill by storm twelve months ago - then he rode in the Superbike action as an eleventh hour rider replacement, picking up points, and also winning the 250 race.

A repeat of that would keep him in the driving seat, but the pursuing pack led by Vincent, a "wild-card" entry into the 500cc British Grand Prix next Sunday at Donington Park, have other ideas.

Keep an eye on defending champion Steve Sawford - apart from Adrian Clarke. he is the only rider to have scored points in every round. He is still searching for that elusive first win of the campaign - Knockhill could provide that, especially as he needs every point to stay ahead of John McGuinness.





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
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
