













The Marlboro Aerobatic Team

WE WELCOME again Philip Meeson, British Aerobatic Champion and leader of the MARLBORO AEROBATIC TEAM, who will be demonstrating the spectacular sport of competition aerobatics above the circuit here today.

1980 is the year of the tenth World Aerobatic Championships, billed to be opened by President Carter in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, USA on 16th August. This aerial meeting between East and West will be on home ground for the first time since 1972. Then, they were won by the Americans at Salon de Provence, France. Two years later there was a political cancellation but in 1976 the contest was resumed in Kiev, Russia, where the British were the highest placed Westerners, taking third place behind the Russians and Czechs. In 1978, the Czechs won in Czechoslovakia — so on home territory this year the western nations obviously have high hopes.

Depending on the political situation, the Russians will be at Oshkosh, so will the East Germans, Czechs, Poles and Rumanians. They will be flying the Yak 50 or Zlin 50 government-produced aircraft, flown by government-

sponsored teams.

Most of the major western nations will be represented. From Europe, France, West Germany, Spain and Great Britain will be sending teams, and with few exceptions the pilots will be flying the incredibly manoeuvrable Super Pitts Special — and just as in motorcycle racing they will have spent many long winter hours rebuilding, lightening and improving their mounts.

Each country sends a team of five pilots, and 1978 and 1979 British Aerobatic Champion Philip Meeson is practising hard in the Marlboro Pitts Special to fly for Britain.

Through external bracing the old fashioned biplane design is still the best for the high stresses aircraft experience in this demanding sport, for it allows tremendous strength with minimum weight. Indeed many world championship pilots who have experimented with singlewing designs are returning to the proven work horse. The Marlboro Pitts is the most advanced of its type flying in Great Britain. It weighs only 950lbs with Philip on board (both pilot and plane have removed weight this winter!) and the standard 180hp engine has been increased to give over 230hp — a power-to-weight ratio similar to that of a Formula 1 racing car!

Today Philip will be demonstrating some of the manoeuvres he will be flying in the final free sequence, where the pilot is allowed complete freedom to express the art of aerobatics. Altogether, four sequences are flown at the competition — the first three comprising



complicated compulsory manoeuvres which demand outstanding skill and concentration. Incidentally, most of the flying at the championships takes place at about 1,000ft, and any low manoeuvres serve only to lose marks. It is skill, not bravado, that wins the World Championship!

The British aircraft leave at the beginning of August for two weeks' practice in the States before the competition. With the help of Marlboro hopes are high.

Philip Meeson — Pilot and Team Leader

This is Philip Meesons's third season as leader of the MARLBORO AEROBATIC TEAM. When not competing in national and international competitions, he and his team colleague give solo displays of breathtaking aerobatics at shows throughout Europe, in their Marlboro Pitts Specials.

Philip learned to fly in the famous Tiger Moth, then took up a commission in the Royal Air Force where he

flew many different types of aircraft.

His interest in aerobatics continued during that time, and he took part in many national competitions, first representing Great Britain internationally at the European Championships in 1975.

Currently British Aerobatic Champion, he practises continuously, to maintain this coveted title, and is looking forward to the challenge of the World Championships later this year.

Facts and Figures about the British Match Race Team

MICK GRANT from Wakefield, Yorks (35). Mick hasn't missed a Transatlantic since 1973 and is thereby our longest standing team member. Mick spent much of last season helping Honda develop their NR500 Grand Prix machine and has put in thousands of miles on their test track in Japan.

Before last year's Honda contract, Mick was a Kawasaki team regular and he did great things for the Green Meanie image in Britain. A former TT winner and outright Isle of Man lap record holder, he is equally at home on genuine road circuits or custom built tracks.

In 1975 he won the MCN Superbike Championship and is a former MCN Man of the Year. Fifth in the all time Transatlantic points scoring, he has never actually won an Anglo-American match race. Will line up in this year's Transatlantic on a brand new Sid Griffiths Yamaha — but could be seen on the Honda 500 in the ShellSPORT races.

DAVE POTTER from St Mary's Cray, Kent (29). Dave crowned his first season as works rider for Team Mitsui UK Yamaha outfit last year by snatching the MCN Superbike Championship from under the nose of Ron Haslam at the final round. Following an early season injury he came on strong in the latter part of the season. A Yorkshireman who moved South, his early successes came at Lydden before he started a long time fruitful relationship with tuner Ted Broad. In 1978 he ran Barry Sheene close for the MCN title.

Dave has a fine Transatlantic record, and apart from 1974, hasn't missed the series since 1973. He was Britain's second highest points scorer in 1973, 1975 and 1979 and was our best points scorer in 1978. Won his only T/A race, however, back in 1973. Currently fourth all time points scorer.

RON HASLAM from Langley Mill, Notts (23). Shy and retiring off the track, but fast and aggressive on it, "Rocket" Ron finally swept away his crashing image last year and has a growing number of staunch fans. Last season he won the two round FIM Formula 1 (Production) World Championship and MCW Formula 1 Series for Honda GB but lost the MCN Superbike Series at the last round. Had he ridden in the qualifiers at Scarborough, the title would almost certainly have been his. But he never rides at the Yorkshire track which claimed the life of his talented brother Phil. Like Phil he has been sponsored by Mal Carter, the Halifax garage owner, on Pharaoh Yamaha machines.

Recently Ron has been testing the Grand Prix Honda although he has yet to make a major impact outside Britain. One of a family of six, he first started racing in 1974 — brother Terry also races, in the sidecar category. Ron still prepares his own machine and still lives at home with his mother, where he keeps a pet monkey, has a collection of 60 guns — he's a good shot — and builds model aircraft. Has yet to win a Transatlantic race but this could be his year.

GRAEME CROSBY from New Zealand (24). The first Colonial to ride for Britain in the Transatlantic (Canadian Du Hammel used to ride for USA), Graeme Crosby was unknown a year ago in Britain. Now he has a Suzuki works contract to ride in Grands Prix, a victory in the 1980 Daytona Bell Production race behind him, plus a big fan following.

His first appearance in Britain was an unnoticed one-off at Brands Hatch in 1978 but he returned to take part in the TT and a couple of other races last year. "Croz" was an instant sensation with his sit up and beg Kawasaki and finished fourth in the Formula 1 TT. Then, with the Moriwaki machine, he proved he was as fast as anyone in the Forward Trust Formula 1 Series, and finished runner-up to Haslam in the series. Although he hails from New Zealand, most of Graeme's racing prior to 1979 was in Australia. The talkative and promotable Kiwi will ride Suzuki's RG650 for the first time in the Transatlantic. If he can cope with a two-stroke as well as he races the production fours, the Americans could be in for some surprises.

GRAHAM WOOD from Scunthorpe, Lincs (27). The sensational of the two Mallory Park Transatlantic qualifying races which he won, 1980 is looking like Graham Wood's big year. He will be racing in Grands Prix regularly this season on the Fowlers Yamaha 500 and has already won, first-time out, with the machine at Cadwell Park.

Although Graham has been racing for six or seven seasons, it was signing with Fowlers that turned him from a top club racer into an International prospect. After several promising performances, including a second at Mallory in June, he won his first MCN Superbike race at Oulton Park, in the Marlboro Race of the Year meeting last October. In the big race itself he was second behind Roberts, when forced to retire. He also finished third in the ACU British Championship.

Graham could well be one of the surprises of the Transatlantic and it could set him up for a good season in Europe. He's the only newcomer in the British squad.

JOHN NEWBOLD from Jacksdale, Notts (27). A Transatlantic regular, though he had to earn his place this year, John is a popular rider and former member of the Suzuki works team. Now sponsored by "One Arm Bandit" king Dave Orton's Appleby Glade Team, John hopes to come back strongly following a season dogged by injury.

In fact, last year, John won the second Mallory Park Transatlantic race but took a very bad fall at Oulton Park the next day. No sooner had he recovered than he crashed again at Cadwell.

John, the son of a butcher, started racing back in 1971 and was helped when his father won the pools. Some fine

rides on 250s and 350s, particularly at Mallory, earned him a works Suzuki ride in 1975 and in 1976. Since leaving the works team he has continued to show good form but hasn't raced abroad so much, as he also works as a butcher. But there is still a lot of strong racing potential in the man they call Joe 90.

KEITH HUEWEN from Woolaston, Northants (24). The reigning ACU British Champion, rode his way into the British team for a second year running with good performances in the qualifying runs.

Last year he was the surprise qualifier at Brands Hatch and was a little out of his depth in the series. But in the past year Keith has made a good deal of progress with the Len Manchester team and should find the going less tough. First came to notice in 1978 riding a 350 Yamaha.

STEVE MANSHIP from Leicester (34). Almost a veteran campaigner who returns to the British team after missing a year, following some excellent riding in the Mallory Park qualifiers. Steve's brother Andy was killed racing, back in 1970. But Steve started to make an impact in 1974, when he picked up a Grovewood Award. In 1975 Steve continued his progress and won the ShellSPORT 500 Championship. He has combined his racing with work as a heating and plumbing contractor. A big moment came in 1978 when in the chaotic rainsoaked British Grand Prix he was awarded second place behind Kenny Roberts. That year he also picked up the ACU British Championship. Last season he finished fourth in the MCN Superbike Series.


