#### W.E. Hume - Presidents Message

It is not really possible to write anything new about the Banbury Run – every word has been used already.

It is the biggest and best motor cycle rally in the world and it is certainly the only event of its kind that can be said to have reached the status of a national festival.

Whilst the VMCC has altered the definition of "acceptable motor cycles" from pre-1930 to any that is older than 25 years of age, the Banbury has made no such concession to change in demand. Yet, to pretend that the entry from 1985 is that of 1955 is ludicrous — there is one obvious difference and that is that the machines of today's event are on the whole magnificent examples of the restorers art.

When I joined the VMCC the average 'bike in the rallies, even Banbury, was, not to put too fine a point, scruffy'.

My congratulations to the entrants and restorers – very often they are one and the same person – you bring credit upon the Club.

Mick Jaggard tells me that for the first time in its history entries have been closed through over subscription, there is a probability therefore that the 1985 Banbury is the biggest assembly of vintage motor cycles that there has ever been.

Spare a thought and a pat on the back for the team of organisers – events this size don't just happen – everybody from the central figures whose names appear in this programme to the cheerful volunteers (!) manning the crossing. If they do cause you a problem please remember the size of the problems that they have solved before you blow your top. Your snag is not that big is it??


#### Message from the Secretary/Treasurer of the Event


