
DEREK RICKMAN

The open throttle work displayed in this victory inspired Ken Edwards, Southampton Trials Star, to suggest that the lad "had a bash" at Scrambles. Words of wisdom indeed. "The lad" entered a Ringwood Scramble . . . he won the Novice race. "And that" says Derek "is how it all began."

A long string of successes followed, highlighted by races in 1952 and '53 in Holland and France. October '53 however and a broken wrist which took 13 months to heal plus



February '54-56 R.A.F. Service all combined to "slow" him down. His return to civil life in February this year with the added inspiration of a very charming wife, whom he imported from France in October last year, and it appears that Derek is starting his best ever season. He was a member of the Southern Centres successful 1955 National Championship Team. Rides a "works" Royal Enfield.



JOE JOHNSON

White riding vest and distinctively painted black and white helmet make Joe one of the easiest to recognise of all the riders. At the present time he is doing National Service and helping the Royal Artillary to fire its guns at Rhyl in Welsh Wales. I think he said "fire", it may have been "clean". He started racing at the ripe age of 16 years, he is now 19 and his three seasons have been successful from the word go. Joe rides with great dash and is a spectacular performer, this dash meant that in his early days he had trouble in staying aboard but experience has rectified this as his record of 90 wins and 112 places earned

on the 197 Dot and 500 Gold Star B.S.A. amply demonstrates. He has also won the Winterbourne Trophy and the Ariel Challenge Cup. His home is Cowley, Oxford.
