

It is now 60 years since the first Bemrose Trophy Trial which took place at the same time as the first airship crossed the Atlantic, before the Queen Mary was launched and when we did not have an official radio broadcasting service in this country.

We have a longstanding tradition to uphold and hope that today's event will maintain this tradition and perhaps enhance it.

A look through motor cycle history books will remind you of the machines used in the first Bemrose Trial such as Raleigh, B.S.A. and Ariel and will highlight the tremendous differences between them and today's sophisticated lightweights. The modern trials iron with its powerful yet flexible engine, suspension system, increased ground clearance, better braking and quieter exhaust represents many years of development, but balance, throttle control and determination to do well are still the essential qualities required by a good trials rider.

Add to this background some superb "observed sections" in the heart of the Peak National Park and the stage is set for a good event for riders and spectators.

Please remember we are all here today only because many individual landowners, associates and helpers want to see the tradition of the Bemrose Trial continued and have generously allowed the use of land for the day and given time and energy to the preparation of the trial.

Permission to cross private land has been given for competitors and officials only, no unauthorised vehicles will be allowed access. No re-visiting, remember many popular sections have been lost in this area due to unauthorised riding, and please respect the landowners' property.

#### **TODAY'S SECTIONS**

HIGH EDGE—At the start—Limestone outcrops

CHEEKS-Next to A53-Rocky stream-bed, steep banks

REEVE EDGE—A tough mile walk—rocks and more rocks

DANEBOWER QUARRY—Access on foot—Scree and rocky climbs.

THREE SHIRES HEAD—Mile walk from parking. Rocky stream-bed, deep pools

HAWK'S NEST—Difficult parking or 1 mile walk. Notorious rock-strewn climbs, steep gradients

ROBINSON'S ROCKS-River-bed below Hawk's Nest

MANOR STEPS—Alongside road—across the river and up the bank

CHURNET—Below Mermaid Inn—no parking in Car Park. Mud, stream-bed sections and rocky climbs. A long hard walk.

FERNYFORD—Alongside road—wooded valley with river sections and greasy climbs


HOLLINSCLOUGH—Short walk up lane—a rock endurance test which is part of the Bemrose tradition

WASHGATES—Half mile walk down lane—stream sections at packhorse bridge

BOOTH FARM—Mile from start, limestone outcrop, good viewing

ETCHINGS—You need to be fit to reach the sections but they are worth the effort. Rocky climbs

AXE EDGE—Short walk from road—rocky scree—dangerous drops—quarry access prohibited



REGULATIONS—Please read your supplementary regulations and these final instructions carefully.

- 1—ALL DRIVERS MUST PRODUCE THEIR 1981 NATIONAL OR INTER-NATIONAL LICENCES WHEN SIGNING ON.
- 2—Machines must be presented to the scrutineer for checking. Numbers will be issued by the Scrutineer after passing the machine.
- 3—The start and finish wil be at the High Edge Raceway, near Booth Farm, Buxton. The first man will start at 10.01 am. and commence his last section at 4.51 pm. Drivers will start in numerical order at 1 minute intervals. Time penalties will be debited against any driver starting or reporting for last section late (1 mark per min.) and a driver will be deemed to have retired if more than 30 minutes late. No penalty for early starting of last section. All drivers must sign off at the finish.
- 4—Riders are requested not to cause undue delay by watching their colleagues. They may be required to attempt observed sections in the order of arrival. Refusal to do so renders a driver liable to a penalty of 10 marks.
- 5—To enable trials riding to be continued in this area it is imperative that all drivers keep to moorland tracks and do not ride indiscriminately over the moors.
- 6—The 1980 Awards are now available and winners are requested to collect them when signing off.
- 7—Car Parking—POLICE NOTICE Competitors, officials and observers are warned by the Police NOT to park on the road. This causes danger to themselves and other traffic.
- 8—As the entire route is in the Peak National Park please show courtesy and give priority to ramblers encountered on route. Drive quietly through villages.

NB.—Petrol is only available at 24 and 32 miles (Solo) and 7 and 32 miles (Sidecar).
