

THE WEEKEND OF THE CHAMPIONS

Phil Read returns to Brands Hatch—scene of many triumphs in the past—but with a difference. This time he comes as Champion of the World in motor cycle racing—a title which he has won the hard way, coming into the mighty MV team as No. 2 to the title holder, Giacomo Agostini, and forcing his way to the front by sheer merit. In the Evening News Race of the South he faces what must be regarded as his biggest challenge, against riders like FIM Formula 750 champion Barry Sheene, Paul Smart, Charles Mortimer, Stan Woods, Peter Williams and the rising Australian star, John Dodds.

Most of these outstanding riders will have machines of bigger capacity and potentially higher top speed than the 500 cc MV ridden by Read. But the Luton-born veteran, who now lives at Oxshott, has shown in the past that no man knows the Kent circuit better than he does and on the full Grand Prix course, with near flat-out speeds, it will be the rider who can use the power available to the limit who will win.

We extend no less of a welcome to the deposed 500 cc champion, Agostini, (who retains his 350 cc world title, of course), but for whom the 500 cc race would have had Read as an odds-on favourite. Throughout this two-day programme it will be wheel-to-wheel stuff on both two wheels and three—not so much sorting out the men from the boys as the Supermen from the stars.

While the finals of the British championships may sound the least inviting they certainly will not be, for included in the line-ups for these events is almost every rider who has been involved in this brilliant season of short circuit racing.

They are placed on the grid in their qualifying position from the earlier rounds and to select any of the 1973 British champions is about as difficult as finding a Grand National winner. The winner of the 750 cc solo championship race will receive the Evening News Trophy and two magnums of champagne.

With the capacity for the Race of the South being from 250 to 750 cc, the entry is by invitation from all of those here for the weekend's racing. Incorporated in the race

will be the final round of the BP/Bill Ivy championship. Here, Barry Sheene, Peter Williams and Paul Smart are all in a position to knock Stan Woods from the top of the table.

Second only to the Race of the South is the final round of the 1973 Motor Cycle News Superbike Championship. Peter Williams currently heads the list but, with double points for this round, any one of Stan Woods, Barry Sheene, Percy Tait, Barry Ditchburn or Paul Smart could collect the £1,000 first prize.

With Sheene and Woods already assured of the first and second places in the ShellSPORT 500 cc championship, the interest is maintained by the clash between



Read and Agostini. Has the Italian recovered sufficiently from his recent accident to be "with it"? Also included is the Dutch champion Wil Hartog, having his first-ever race here.

Agostini joins another distinguished company in the 350 cc race for the Rothmans Trophy in which the field includes John Dodds (who could well reverse some world championship positions in 1974), Hartog, John Williams and Mick Grant, all of whom are capable of giving the champion a run for his money.

Two really international sidecar races round off this fascinating programme, with the winners being the crew with the best aggregate time. There will be, of course, the new British champion plus his rivals, in addition to the Swedish champion Gote Brodin. the Dutch trio of Sees Smit (the national champion), Martin Kooij and Gerrit Verkerk. and Kenneth Calenius from Finland, who has the reputation of being the fastest sidecar racer on two wheels! We shall see.

Surf'Racer Demonstration

On each day of this meeting, at 2 p.m. on Saturday and 2.15 p.m. on Sunday, there will be a demonstration of the revolutionary Surf'Racer, which the unitiated may regard as a cross between a motor cycle and a go-kart.

The Surf'Racer provides an entirely new form of mechanical entertainment, or a new sensation in miniature motor sport recommended for people from 15 upwards but unlikely to be kept away from some much younger enthusiasts.

For the technically minded, the Surf'Racer is a three-wheeler with the single wheel at the rear and without a steering wheel or moving handlebars. It is powered by a 50 c.c. Solex single-cylinder two-stroke motor giving a safe, quiet 15 m.p.h. speed. The makers recommend a small track measuring about 50 x 20 yards, either outside on tarmac (with or without cover) or indoors on a wooden floor.

The sport of Surf'Racing is already well-established on the Continent and in Japan and the U.K. concessionaires (Newhall Marketing Services Ltd., of 36 Regent Place, Birmingham, B1 3NJ—Tel.: 021-235 4122/1706) have their own track in Cornwall.

The Surf'Racer is started easily by pushing and control is very simple by means of accelerator and brake levers on the handles. Steering is achieved purely by leaning.





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
