THE BIG NAMES OF BRITAIN.

It's Northern Moto-Cross Day !

Television Sports Commentator Colin Hutchinson turns the spotlight on today's star-studded line-up.

Stand-by ! Boltby's launching pad is ready for the big blast off ! Ten, nine, eight, seven, six.....tension and excitement run high as the minutes tick away towards zero hour . . The 'rocket' men of rough riding are ready and raring to hurtle into scrambles space. It won't be the moon they are heading for but the top honours in this year's Northern Moto-Cross. Before the elastic starting gate twangs open to release the victory hungry, 18 strong, cast contesting the two leg main event, lets make an 'orbit' of the paddock to meet the 'stars' — old favourites and new faces !

Leading the parade is Aldershot's 'Prince' of moto-cross Les Archer who is breaking his Continental jaunts to make his first British appearance of the season. It was in 1956 that Norton mounted Archer won the European 500 c.c. title (the year before it was elevated to world status) and although 7 years have drifted by since, the championship crown has only left Sweden once and then it went to Belgium ! During a colourful career Les has won the Moto-Cross des Nations and Grand Prixes of France (four times) Luxembourg (twice), Denmark, Britain and Belgium.

Up against Archer will be the entire AMC works team plus runners from the BSA, Dot, Greeves and Cotton factory stables.

Gordon Blakeway is the latest recruit to the London AMC colours and he is also the 'veteran' of a youthful quintette. Fair haired Blakeway, a Darlington market gardener, is only 28 but his four team-mates average an age of just over 20 ! Here is the chart Chris Horsfield (24), Vic Eastwood (21), Dave Nicoll and Mick Andrews 18. The Plumpstead ponies took a hard knock when Dave Curtis and Geoff Ward retired, but now the Matchless-James flag is flying high thanks to the razor sharp riding of this talented team.

Life has moved fast for 6 ft. 4 Nicoll and Stratford-on-Avon runner Horsfield. Less than a year ago both were 'private' entrants — today they are not only armed with works battle chargers but rank high in the British top twenty charts ! 5 ft. 8 tall and tipping the scales at just over 10 stone, Vic Eastwood is really hitting the tree top. Although still studying for his B. Sc. degree in Mechanical Engineering this Bexley, Kent youngster (born at Colne in Lancashire) has found time to finish second to Jeff Smith in the Louvain, Belgium International Meeting and win the 'National' 'Wessex' at Glastonbury, Somerset.

With Jeff Smith, John Burton and Arthur Lampkin championship chasing in Russia, John Harris leads the one man BSA contingent into action ! This Birmingham rider is a past winner of the Lancs. G.N., finished first in the 1962 Polish Tatra Trophy Trial and has already won his ticket to this year's I.S.D.T. !

When it comes to two-strokes you can't keep Greeves and Dots out of the news ! Both factories are here in force. Representing the Thundersley marque are Bryan Goss (a cattle and pig truck driver who often takes home the scrambles bacon) and Joe Johnson. 22 years of age, Goss comes from Yetminster, Dorset. He was the winner of this year's A.C.U. 250 c.c. Star round at the Wessex. Joe Johnson (about to become a proud father !) won the 250 c.c. classes at the 1962 Hants. G.N., Jackpot and Bargepole Scrambles. Lining up for Dots are Pat Lamper (the 26 year-old factory Competitions Manager), ginger haired Frank Yarwood, the very much in form Norman Crooks and Swainby farmer Ron. Tate.

Cambridge builder's son Fred Mayes (20 years old) rides a works Cotton and privately entered 500 BSA. Winner of the 1962 Suffolk G.N. and 4th in the Wessex '500'.

Completing the rich menu are Dickie Preston (the Hutton Rudby flyer), Ken Covell (riding his Matchless Metisse) and bright youngsters Dick Clayton and John Done.

That completes this quick round-up. The stage is set for this all action attraction. Heres hoping you will enjoy it... now let battle commence !

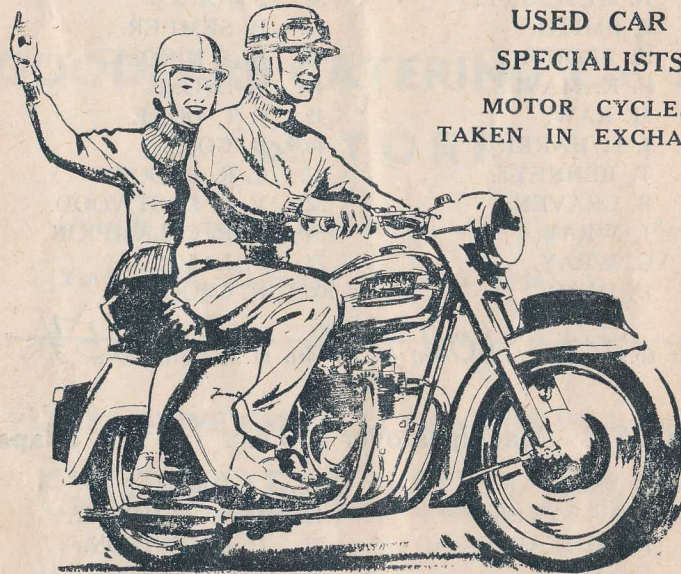

THE STORY BEHIND THE SYMBOL



THE VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY SERVICE



"The Volunteer Emergency Service is the finest thing that has happened to motorcycling for years". Lord Montagu of Beaulieu.

The Volunteer Emergency Service works on this basis: "We love to ride our machines but enjoy it better still if we can do so to some purpose".

Together members put their motorcycles, scooters and even three wheelers and cars at the disposal of worthwhile causes. Chief among these causes is the Hospital Emergency Run. A hospital telephones VES headquarters when a volunteer is needed to rush blood for a critically ill patient. VES immediately telephones member riders in the emergency area to find a volunteer who can carry out the mission. A rider is located, the hospital told when the volunteer will arrive, and perhaps another life is saved. In a few months in London alone 40 such missions have been completed and in many cases they were matters of life and death.

The VES was founded in February 1962 because riders who had distributed small-pox vaccine for 2½ million people during the big outbreak were keen to continue this kind of emergency work. As the organisation has grown, many different

types of emergency have arisen that strain the resources of existing organisations; to them the VES is a godsend. It is ironic that the much maligned motorcycle is once again helping to save lives. Something for the critics to think about.

The VES has roles for everyone. Some can only do local jobs, others are willing to spend a day or a night riding hundreds of miles. Some take care of organising, others address envelopes. Some have telephones, some have not.
