### Let's Hear Those Cheers Again!

#### Writes BOB SNELLING

EARLIER in the month Phil Read celebrated his 20th year in motor cycle racing and little has been left to write about his brilliant career, but at 37 he keeps on proving that he is far from being a 'back number'. Given the right machine he is still able to give 1976 super-star Barry Sheene a run for his money. The recent Italian Grand Prix was a case in question and what a great race that turned out to be with the young star just getting the better of the old master.

Their resumed battles to-day could provide the highlights of the meeting but we must not forget that there are a lot more Aces in the pack for the major honours and we may have a new head carrying the title

'King of Brands'.

However, it's consistancy that counts at this Evening News sponsored meeting, with the title going to the rider with the best two rides from the Superbike, ShellSPORT and 350cc races. Last year a couple of second places enabled Barry Ditchburn to retain the King of Brands title, while a broken chain ruined Barry Sheene's chances following two fine victories in the ShellSPORT and Evening News races. Mick Grant won the Superbike race and went on to clinch the Motor Cycle News championship for the first time.

This afternoon's programme really has everything, for in addition to rounds of the Motor Cycle News Superbike, Motor Cycle International Sidecar and ShellSPORT 500cc Championships there is the opening round of the exciting new Motor Cycle Mechanics Production Machine Championship which carries prize money totalling nearly £5,000. Full details of this new competition appear in the current issue of the magazine. The set-up for the other championships is widely known and current positions can be found elsewhere in the programme.

Given that Easter type weather we should witness some great racing and go home with some more fine

memories so let us at this stage wish all of the riders the very best of luck.

With the T.T. so close, the number of entries received was surprising and it was not possible to include heats for more than the Junior and Non-International Licence holder events, consequently there had to be quite a few disappointed riders left on the sidelines, much to the regret of the organisers.

Following the 350cc heats comes the first of the championship rounds, the new Motor Cycle Mechanics Production Series which is bound to claim a big following as the season progresses. Martin Sharpe, currently in excellent form, could take this opening race but he is not an odds-on favourite with such riders as Tony Holland, Tony Smith and Brian Bartlett in the line-up, or we may have a surprise from not such a well known name. Anyway, a welcome here to United States entry Brian Zeky, who has a good chance of collecting points in the 250cc class.

Steve Manship, Dave Potter, Dave Camier, Bob Heath, Mick Patrick and John Cowie should reach the 350cc Final, with the winner coming from that bunch, but the performance of visitors Bernard Fau from

France and South African Gregory Barsdorf will be of considerable interest.

The fields for the Evening News Race and the third round of the Superbike Series are pretty well identical and the pattern of each could be much the same. There will, however, be a lot to talk about during the interval.

That front row will take some catching, so it is essential anyone behind them gets away to a good start. Bernard Fau will have his work cut out in this company and on current form it must be Barry and Phil cutting out the pace but, with the slightest slip, Mick Grant, Ron Haslam, John Williams or Steve Parrish may be nipping through. It will be a treat to see Dave Croxford out again on the Challenge and also veteran Percy Tait fresh from his victory in the N.W. 200. Let's have those Easter cheers all over again in these and indeed all the other races.

Barry Sheene has made it known that he wants that Superbike title back and he has already staked his claim for the return of the ShellSPORT title, in which he once again meets the former World Champion and some more tough opposition. Steve Parrish lies in second place in the table followed by John Williams, Tony Rutter, John Cowie and 1975 winner Steve Manship and they will all be striving for points to keep within striking distance of Barry. So this too will be another good scrap right down the field, particularly with the 'King of Brands' title in mind.

Winner of the opening rounds of the Motor Cycle International Sidecar Championship, Dick Greasley finds himself on the second row of the grid while current runner-up Trevor Ireson, is even further back. You can bet that these two will soon sort this out, but there surely must be some interest in the front row trio of the 1975 Champion George O'Dell, Mac Hobson and Gerry Boret, who have yet to open their score in this year's series. There may, however, be an upset from the visiting Fins with Kalevi Rahko, Paavo Kukkonen and Matti Ketola or Dutchman Boy Brouwer getting into the picture.

The final for the Non-International Licence Holders rounds off the programme and here many of those 'Stars of Tomorrow' will again be on parade. Andy Trott collected this title a couple of weeks back and should enhance his reputation here, so stay on and watch this one as it could produce another cracking finish.

Well, that's it—take it easy on the way home, for there is bound to be a lot of holiday traffic about. See you at the 'Hutch'.

### **Motor Cycle Mechanics Production Championship**

BIG TIME, big money production racing comes to British circuits for the first time today with the first leg of the six-round Motor Cycle Mechanics Production Championship.

For production racers and fans alike, MCM's brand new championship heralds a major move forward in the development of a branch of the sport which up to now has taken a back seat at the circuits. The new series, which carries over £4,000 in prize money, is this year being run under the current ACU production racing rules with four modifications: the five year age limit rule on machines is waived; fairings can't be used unless fitted as standard or listed as an optional extra; street legal lighting must be fitted, except where it conflicts with track safety regulations; the fitting of big bore kits is banned.

To keep interest high and to add to the excitement, a handicapping system featuring a staggered start will be used, with the 250cc class bikes moving off first, followed by the 500's and finally the up-to-1000cc machines.

Cash prizes offered in the series are the highest ever offered in production racing. In total, Motor Cycle Mechanics is putting up a cash prize fund of £2,300 and this will be split between each of the six rounds as follows: First £100; Second £60; Third £40; Fourth £25; Fifth £15; Sixth £10. On top of that, series prize money of £800 will be divided as follows: Overall series winner £300 plus MCM Production Championship Trophy and replica; Second £200; Third £100; Fourth £80; Fifth £60; Sixth £40; Seventh £20.

Several major companies in the motorcycle industry have also come into the championship with cash prizes and bonuses. To stimulate dealer interest in the championship, Honda, Suzuki, Kawasaki, Yamaha and Benelli have all put up £200 for the highest placed machine in the series of their manufacture entered by a dealer.

Other firms offering cash prizes include Roger Slater, Mick Walker, Duckhams, AGV, Cobra Luggage and Hondastyle Clothing.



### **Motor Cycle News Superbike Championship**

WELCOME to the third round of the Motor Cycle News Superbike Championship—the biggest and best non-world championship road racing series.

Following the success of previous championships, two extra rounds have been added this year and the total prize, bonus and contingency money for the 10-race series has reached an incredible £15,000.

Today's race is being sponsored by Kawasaki U.K. and in addition to the prize money, which is paid down the field to 10th place, riders will have the added incentive of battling for the special £300 bonus money which goes to the leaders at one-third and two-thirds race distance. In addition, the rider setting the fastest lap receives £100 from B.P.

The man in the money after the first two races is Barry Sheene, who won both rounds at Brands Hatch and Cadwell Park, setting fastest lap on each occasion. However, as anybody who was watching those two races will verify, Sheene has had to ride very hard for his successes. Mick Grant, last year's champion, riding his Kawasaki, pushed Sheene to the limit on both occasions and obviously the tough Yorkshireman will not give up his hard-won title without fight.

Former world champion Phil Read returns from success abroad to add plenty of spice to todays's races and Barry Ditchburn, Grant's Kawasaki team-mate, will be hoping to make up for his mechanical toubles at Cadwell with a good ride today.

Roger Marshall, the British champion, and Geoff Barry tie for third place in the championship table while Paul Smart, who is beginning to recapture his old form, lies sixth behind Ditchburn.

The championship is scored like the Grands Prix—15-12-10-8-6-5-4-3-2-1—with five bonus points going to the rider setting fastest lap at each round. If the fastest lap is shared, each rider receives five points. Double points will be awarded at the final round at Brands Hatch on October 30-31, which will be televised live on ITV's "World of Sport" programme.

### "Motor Cycle" International Sidecar Championship

This is the third year of the "Motor Cycle" International Sidecar Championship which, in 1975, was the closest fought of all the British road racing championships. It was decided only at the final round and then only by the fastest lap. That was set by George O'Dell with passenger Alan Gosling, who snatched the title from British Champion Mac Hobson and passenger Gordon Russell.

After such a successful series, it is natural that the format should be unchanged for 1976, with eight rounds, all at Motor Circuit Developments circuits.

The only difference is an increase in the prize fund, so that the winner of each round will get at least £125. The total fund has gone up to £3,738, making it the most lucrative sidecar championship in the world.

The series winner will get £500, with £250 for the runners-up, £100 for third and £75, £50 and £25 for the fourth to sixth outfits. Scoring is on world championship lines with 15-12-10-8-6-5-4-3-2-1 for the first 10 but with the addition of five points for the fastest lap at each circuit. All points scored will count towards the final total.

Double points will be awarded for both places and the fastest lap at the final round, at Brands Hatch on October 31.

Qualifying rounds are: April 16, Brands Hatch; April 19, Oulton Park; May 31, Brands Hatch; June 13, Mallory Park; July 11, Snetterton; August 30, Oulton Park; September 12, Mallory Park; October 31, Brands Hatch.


