



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Flag signals

Red: Immediate stop by all riders. Only used by the Clerk of the Course or his deputy and displayed only at the start/finish line

Yellow plus yellow with red stripes held crossed These two flags shown crossed diagonally and held aloft, indicate the race has been stopped and is accompanied by a red flag (see above) at the start/finish

Yellow (waved): Great danger in section of track ahead; slow down, proceed with caution.

Yellow (motionless): Danger in section of track ahead

Yellow (motionless): Danger in section of tack anead, take care, no overtaking, maintain positions until clear of section displaying yellow flag.

Green: Course clear. Used on marshals posts to indicate their position to riders on first lap of all practice sessions. Also shown immediately after the post where a yellow flag has been shown to indicate circuit now

Black: Accompanied by riders number on separate board. That rider to stop in pits next time round. Always shown at start/finish line on special instructions from Clerk of the Course.

Yellow with red stripes: Oil flag. Displayed when oil

has been dropped on the circuit in that section, displayed until the hazard has been dealt with. Also

denotes slippery surface ahead.

White: Ambulance or course car on circuit

Yallow with black cross: Denotes start of last lap Black/white chequered: Denotes finish of race, usually waved at the winner and held motionless until every

other rider has passed. NB: Races at all Brands Hatch Circuits are started using a system of red and green lights

Ithough the first ever Eurolantic
Challenge, with four teams of eight
riders each battling for crucial points, is
the centre piece of today's busy programme,
there is promise of plenty of back-up action in
the opening rounds of six of the 1988 ACU
Star UK Championships that provide the
support races.

Certainly of major interest is the new Norton team at full strength in the unlimited championship with its rotary-engined 588cc machines. It is the failure of the Federation Internationale Motocycliste to agree to this cubic capacity displacement that is keeping the British factory out of World Championship competition at the present time.

But while Norton carry on discussions with the FIM's technical committee, it has been given the green light to contest British national events which include the Isle of Man TT in June.

The prospect of seeing all three Nortons going for points in one race for the first time, rests on the outcome of two qualifying heats. Simon Buckmaster—in the throes of moving from Hertfordshire to a new home in Coalville, Leicestershire—is joined by the factory development rider Malcolm Heath in the first heat, while Trevor Nation makes his bid for the final in the second.

In the opinion of former Suzuki and Kawasaki works rider Mick Grant, the chances of the Nortons turning out to be potential winners is good. 'Very impressive, plenty of power and handling that gives confidence', he remarked after a 'guest' tryout recently.

Certainly among the favourites for maximum points in the opening round is Londoner **Terry Rymer** who certainly knows his way round the testing 1.2 mile Indy circuit. He shot to prominence at the start of last season when he went into an early lead in the MCN/EBC Brakes Superstock series and his lasting form has led to him being named among three reserves for today's Eurolantic.

He rides a 750cc Yamaha — now sponsored by Sterns Disco — so he will certainly be out to find the rhythm that leads to the winning groove!

Tim Bourne from Ashford, Kent, is another Brands regular who should be among the pace-setters with his 1100cc Suzuki, and the same goes for 500cc Suzuki rider Steve Manley from Clacton, Essex. Phil Borley from just down the coast at Southend, proved to be the surprise man of the 250cc Championship last season, and he is out to do the same in the bigger class as he switches to a 750cc Suzuki.

Graham Read, son of eight times World Champion Phil Read, rides an 1100cc Suzuki that will take him to a TT début this year and he joins another young rider to watch this season, Londoner **Mark Linscott** who races in the David Brown team colours.

A strong Scottish challenge is spearheaded by **Brian Morrison**, **Howard Selby** and Isle of Man TT Formula 2 winner **Steve Hislop**, while from the Island itself there is **Mark Farmer** on a 1000cc Heron Suzuki. Adding to the countrywide appeal of the event is Ireland's **Eddie Laycock**, winner from Hislop, of last year's dramatic Junior TT.

An Italian World Championship-bred Aprilia is brought into British national battle for the first time by top 250cc title prospect Nigel Bosworth from Nuneaton, Warwicks. He clashes with regular Derbyshire rival Rob Orme from Ilkeston, who this year races a Rotax, and they both compete in the first of two heats to sort out the 36 riders who set off in the final. Laycock is back in the action this time with one of Dr Joe Ehrlich's EMC machines and there's change of mount for Yorkshireman Steve Patrickson who puts his faith in a British-built Hejira this season.

Brands Hatch Racing interest

Local interest comes from Brands Hatch
Racing entries, from Horsham, Sussex,
company director **David Wilson** on an
Exactweld and London-based Irishman
Conor Brennan on a Honda, plus **Dave**Redgate from nearby Chatham on a Yamaha.

For added interest, in what promises to be a cut and thrust contest, watch Yorkshireman lan Newton and Humbersider lan Burnett—younger brother of British match race campaigner Roger Burnett.

The hero of the 350cc straight race could well be Essex rider **Glen English** who rides a seven-year-old TZ Yamaha that looks every inch its age. Shoestring racer English — who has yet to find enough cash to complete a full season of racing — became the first Man of the Meeting of the year in the Brands season opener last month.

The battling Hislop and Laycock clash yet again, but they can expect added pressure from hardened contestants, Welshman **Steve Williams** on a Dennis Trollope-entered Yamaha, Nottinghamshire's **John Reynolds**, the first rider of 1988 to be named Man of the Meeting at Mallory Park, and Scotland's **James Rae**.

Nation is back with a trusty Suzuki for the 750cc Production Championship round, but the Wiltshire rider can expect a tough time from Morrison, one of five riders from north of the border in this event. Linscott, plus Andover, Hants, based Colin Gable, John Roach from Crawley and Nick Allison, who comes across the Channel from Jersey, should be in the scoring, and for local interest keep an eye on the lad from just down the road, Wilmington's, Mark Curtis on his Deeprose Suzuki.

English switches to his little Suzuki for the 125cc race confrontation of just 17 riders. Main interest here is on Grand Prixexperienced **Alex Bedford**, who makes a




comeback with a Honda after a year's retirement, forced by the lack of cash. Simon Westwood, entered by the London Suzuki centre but putting his faith in a rival Hassock machine, and Lincolnshire's Gary Buckle on an MBA, should be with the front runners. And save a wave for Burton Latimer, Northants, veteran Les Judkins who admits to being around the age of his riding number 50!

A full house for the Sidecar race promises some close three-wheeler dicing, but I fancy the first crew over the line could well be **Derek Rumble** and his passenger **Gareth Keep.**The pair took Mallory by storm in the Leicestershire circuit's first meeting of the year when they set the fastest lap of the day—including the solos—with a 1000cc Suzuki powered outfit.

Thirty-year-old sheet metal worker from Wigan, Rumble and Taunton tyre depot manager Keep, have since pooled their limited resources to purchase a new Windle chassis and a Trollope-tuned 700cc Yamaha. The pair may be late starters in the sport but their determination to succeed more than makes up for the missed years on the tracks.

Welshman Chas Greaterex has repaired — after a pre-season practice mishap — the LCR outfit he acquired from World Champion Steve Webster that should put him among the leaders in a well-matched contest which sees circuit experts Gary Thomas/Paul Chappell, from Orpington, Gravesenders Judd Drew/Brian Houghton and Derek Plummer/Alan Phillips from Weybridge, among the contenders.

Taxi driver Rob Hitchcock takes the passenger role for a change as Chislehurst garage owner Dave Lockyer takes the controls of their 750cc LCR Yamaha. From the Isle of Man there's Dave Molyneaux and passenger Alan Langton, who this year are getting the backing of Padgetts of Batley to





run a 700cc Yamaha outfit.

In all it's a support programme worthy of being included in a major new event on the British race bill. So just sit back and enjoy 13 races of the best in motor cycle entertainment.

EUROLANTIC CHALLENGE

1. The Eurolantic Challenge is contested between four teams of eight riders — the teams being USA, Europe, UK '1' and UK '2'.

2. There are six legs, each of approx 20 miles in length — legs 1, 2, 3 take place at Brands Hatch on Good Friday and legs 4, 5, 6 take place at Donington Park on Easter Monday.

3. Machines comply with the following specifications — FIM World Superbike, AMA Superbike, ACU British TT Formula 1.

4. Points are allocated to the first 24 finishers in each race as follows — 24, 23, 22, 21, 20, 19, 18, 17, 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1.

Team points are awarded to the top six riders from each team based on the overall finishing positions in each race. If the 7th and 8th placed team member finishes in the top 24 placings in any race, those points are not added to the Team score. If the 7th and 8th placed Team member finishes in the top 24 placings in any race, his points are counted towards his Individual overall score. To be classified as a finisher, the rider must have completed 75% of the race distance. Reserves may only start if a vacancy arises within his team; reserves are brought forward in order of practice times.



America's reigning Camel Pro Series and AMA Grand National Champion **Bubba Shobert** will certainly be in winning mood this weekend after sidelining himself last year, before even setting off for his début in the series when he crashed during practice at Brands. This year the Honda rider — from the delightful Californian town of Carmel where

Suzuki. This backed up a 1987 season that saw him with numerous national race wins and end the year with fourth place in the AMA Superbike Championship. Last Easter on his first British visit he made fifth place in the overall points scoring and could well be up with the top three this time.


Top privateer with an astounding third place overall was last year's star newcomer Gary Goodfellow who has fought back from serious injuries received when he was brought off in a startline mêlée, to be ready for a second crack at the Challenge. New Zealand-born Goodfellow, who now lives in Canada and races a Suzuki, will be out to get back on trail to the top after missing much of ast season with his injuries.

Back for third visits come fellow Canadian racers Michel Mercier, sixth best last year with his Suzuki, and Reuben McMurter.
Since his last visit the impressive Mercier has taken the Canadian Superbike Championship while McMurter could well be making a début at Brands on a Honda sponsored by Rothmans in Canada, which will replace the famaha superbike he rode last year.

Making his first appearance this year is the exciting **Tommy 'Too Fast' Douglas**, who collected three championship titles and three runner-up spots in Canadian events last season. The former music student spent several years contesting off road racing, until he switched to the tarmac mid-way through 1984. Despite the late change he took that year's national amateur 600 Production Championship before winning the 750cc class title of the same series in 1985.

From there he went to the professional scene and ended 1986 as the top scoring Rookie Pro of the Year. The 24-year-old from Quebec is entered by Yamaha Canada and could well be the rider to spring a surprise or two this weekend, either here at Brands or at Donington Park on Monday where the final three legs of the six round event are held.


A leg injury has made it impossible for Doug Chandler to complete the eight rider American earn as planned, but **Scott Gray** has been called in as his replacement to give the visitors from across the Atlantic a potential winning set-up.



The man who captained the team and headed the scoring last year, Texan Kevin Schwantz, is tied by a Pepsi Suzuki Grand Prix team contract but a World Championship contender who has found the space to take in the Eurolantic is British team veteran of the match races, **Ron Haslam.** Hot foot from Japan last Sunday and raring to get back to the world title battle in America next weekend, 'Rocket' Ron has been given permission by Elf Honda to race a Honda (UK) race kitted VFR 750R this weekend.

'Rocket' Ron back for 11th match races

With five wins to his credit, Haslam will be in the British (factory supported) 'A' team as captain. It is his 11th match race assignment and one where he will certainly be out to make up for two years of bitter disappointment. "I love riding in the event because I enjoy racing in front of my home crowd", said Haslam. "Although it has been down to the machines I have had for the past couple of years which were not really competitive, I am out to make amends to the fans I feel I have let down a bit."



With a similar machine is Humbersider Roger Burnett who has sadly been forced out of the 500cc World Championship this year by lack of machinery. One of this country's most promising riders, the 1986 British Champion looked at one stage to have been left completely out in the cold when the British Rothmans Honda GP team ceased operations, but a recent support programme announced by Honda UK, means that he will have a VFR 750R for the World Superbike Championship. The machine will also give him the chance to reclaim the British title and repeat his 1986 classic TT winning performance in the Isle of Man.

The Loctite Yamaha squad, managed by former racer Steve 'Stavros' Parrish and featuring reigning MCN/EBC Brakes Superstock Champion **Keith Huewen** and this country's most underestimated rider **Mark Phillips** from Lincoln, also form-up under the 'A' team banner.


Yorkshiremen **Phil Mellor** and the less experienced but unquestionably talented **James Whitham** are the choice of Suzuki, whose team efforts are much in the hands of former top racing all rounder Mick Grant, yet another Yorkshireman.

Completing the team are Roger Hurst and Ray Swann, the former no doubt pining for this weekend's 24-hour Le Mans Endurance race. They become somewhat unknown quantities this year, as they wheel out the new four-strokes that bring Kawasaki back into racing.

Now I feel that this team will have its work cut out, not just to beat the Americans but also to keep the British 'A' team at bay. British champion **Roger Marshall**, fired up after his excellent Battle of the Twins victory with a British Cosworth at Daytona last month, switches to a Suzuki again this weekend to head the British (privateers) 'B' team.

Return of the Nortons

Joining him will be twice winner **Trevor Nation** and last year's privateer Grand Prix





campaigner Simon Buckmaster on the new revolutionary rotary-engined Nortons which really are an unknown force. Nation, with the Loctite Yamaha team last year and before that a Suzuki rider, certainly has race-winning potential and with an equally determined Buckmaster, we could be on the brink of a major return to the top for British designed and built machines. Certainly all eyes will be on the pair this weekend as they race new machines in front of spectators for the first time, weighing up Norton's chances for the TT in June, the British F1 Championship and hopefully in the not too distant future the World F1 and Superbike series.

Another rider being backed in the Honda support programme is five times F1 World Champion **Joey Dunlop** and this year the Ulsterman breaks into the match race battle for the first time. Although he is not really a circuit rider, the outright Isle of Man Iap record holder could well add strength to the British 'B' team and I have a feeling will be the surprise package of the weekend.

Twice third in the F1 world series Paul Iddon is another with points scoring potential. This year the Derbyshire rider races an Italian Bimota with the backing of Ashford, Kent, sponsor David Brown. Like Burnett, Luton's Kenny Irons looked set for a 500cc World Championship career until change of factory team plans hit the scene at the end of last season. Things looked bleak for him as well until recently, but now he too is poised to switch to the four-stroke machine world of Superbike racing.

Teesider Andy McGladdery has proved to be a consistent four-stroke machine performer and should be in contention with his Suzuki while, the dark horse especially on his home track today is Dave Heal, the man with more metal plates in his legs than Barry Sheene!

Reigning Champion of Brands, Heal clocked up a record-breaking 93 outright victories with a TZ Yamaha last season but for this event has switched to a Suzuki Superbike for the first time.

It's likely that the European and Commonwealth riders will be hard pushed to get into the points, but then the underdogs have often proved the critics wrong.

Swede Anders Andersson and West German Peter Rubatto, respectively seventh and sixth in last year's World F1 Championship, are certainly experienced campaigners who have both contested the TT in the Isle of Man. Rubatto in fact could be the top man of this squad. He is the German Superbike Champion, has won the newcomer award in the Island and also performed well at the Macau Grand Prix last November.

If Australian **Graeme McGregor** could find some of his old dynamic form, he could also be in the running but he has been out of the action for some time and that's not good when you come up against such class opposition as the Easter Challenge presents.

Finn Jari Suhonen is gaining momentum in

the Superbike world and Austrian Hans Lindner, last year's 250cc European Champion, is certainly a good rider but they could be outclassed in this company. Also in the team are Michael Galinski and Finn Esko Kuparinen who really have no chance of being in the hunt.

Although the British riders will be on more equal machine terms this year in the Superbike Eurolantic Challenge, the Americans could just have the little extra needed to clinch a first victory in the new four-way battle. And I certainly wouldn't put my money on the British 'A' team being the runners-up! With just six rounds in the contest this year, the first three at Brands today are going to be even more crucial — even decisive — to the outcome.
