





Lotus on Track Elise Trophy

Lotus on Track Elise Trophy

The Elise Trophy was launched in 2007 in conjunction with MSVR - the racing club division of MotorSport Vision. The series was a huge success in its inaugural season, with full grids at every UK round and a spectator following unrivalled in club motorsport; thanks to the strong Lotus community.

2008 saw the series continue to grow, over 60 cars raced at many meetings with double grids having to be run to cope with entries. Now firmly established as the UK's premier National race series with huge grids, unrivalled spectator support and the best club race calendar in the UK.

Cars in the Production class are standard production cars with a maximum power of 170 BHP. The Modified class sees a maximum power of 250BHP at the hubs, to put the cars on a par with the new 2-Elevens

Todays endurance race is a first for the Elise Trophy. never before have so many Lotus cars taken part in a race of this length together. We have a mixture of drivers attempting the 100 minutes on their own, some who are pairing up to drive 50 minutes each in a shared car and a number who are pairing up their car with another as a tag team. The single cars will have one pit stop of 6 minutes at any point during the race while the 2 car teams will need to make 3 pit stops of just under 2 minutes each meaning each car and driver will race in 2 x 25 minute stints.

Trying to pick a winner is going to be difficult but over the last 3 years Chris Randall has been the class driver in the series and in his last outing in the ET with his Europa it would be difficult to bet against him especially as he pairs up with another ET race winner Ben Pitch. Brands Hatch instructor Jamie Stanley is one of those attempting to run the whole race on his own and will be favourite to run Randall close. Lotus Cup Europe driver of the season Scott Cruickshank makes the long journey from Aberdeen to pair up with Steve Williams in Scotts 211, only a win will do for them. Jonathan Walker is another looking to complete the race on his own while David Harvey will be looking for another podium finish after two of them at Le Mans.

In the Production class anything could happen as no one really knows how these cars will stand up to 100 minutes of racing. Simon Phillips is the only driver mad enough to attempt the full 100 minutes on his own while there are a number of cars being driven by 2 drivers including multiple many more cars and a calendar that will be unrivalled in UK ET winner Mick Edwards who teams up with Russell Hill. Marcus Jewell pairs up with ex-F3 champion Ben Clucas while we see ex-race winner Andrew Walsh out for the first time in 2009. Martin Roberts and Ken Savage will be looking the UK and into Europe (NYLOC especially), MSVR - David for at least a podium but by running 2 cars they should have reliability on their side and you wouldn't bet against them winning. Spare a thought for Paul Harding who has drawn the short straw to have Andrew "muppet" Kell as his team at Brands, which has become home to the Elise Trophy. We mate, no chancel

As is the norm for the Elise Trophy we see a number of drivers racing for the first time and would like to wish hopefully see you back here at Brands Hatch on 27th-28th them luck: Paul McNeilly, Nigel Hannam, Steve Quick and March 2010. David Carr.





Today's race will be the last time that the Elise Trophy is run in classes with the modified and 211's being dropped for 2010 when the series will be run to the current Production regulations only. If we've made the right decision we can look forward to a fantastic 2010 with much closer racing. club motorsport.



From the Tiger section it should be Mark Steward, Tom Griffiths and Paul Dudley at the forefront, although don't discount the marque owner Jim Dudley.

There are other sportscars which should not be discounted, most notably the rapid Caterhams of Nick Starkey and John Hill. Another Caterham driven by John Chasey is vying for honours in the points chase, although Chasey will have to contend with the quick BMW Mini of Jason Richardson.

Peter Reeve has wrapped up the class A points title with his TVR but will be looking to finish the season on a high note. Likewise from the Tigers both Mick Grant and Daniel Brigham will be hoping for class success.

In summary there will be battles throughout the field so both races should be very entertaining.


After the success of the Victor Meldrew Trophy in 2007 and 2008, support for the third annual Meldrew Trophy has been outstanding with

many drivers voting with their pension books and entering.





BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL


Warning to driver that his/her behaviour (e.g. corner cutting) is suspect and he/her may be black flagged.
