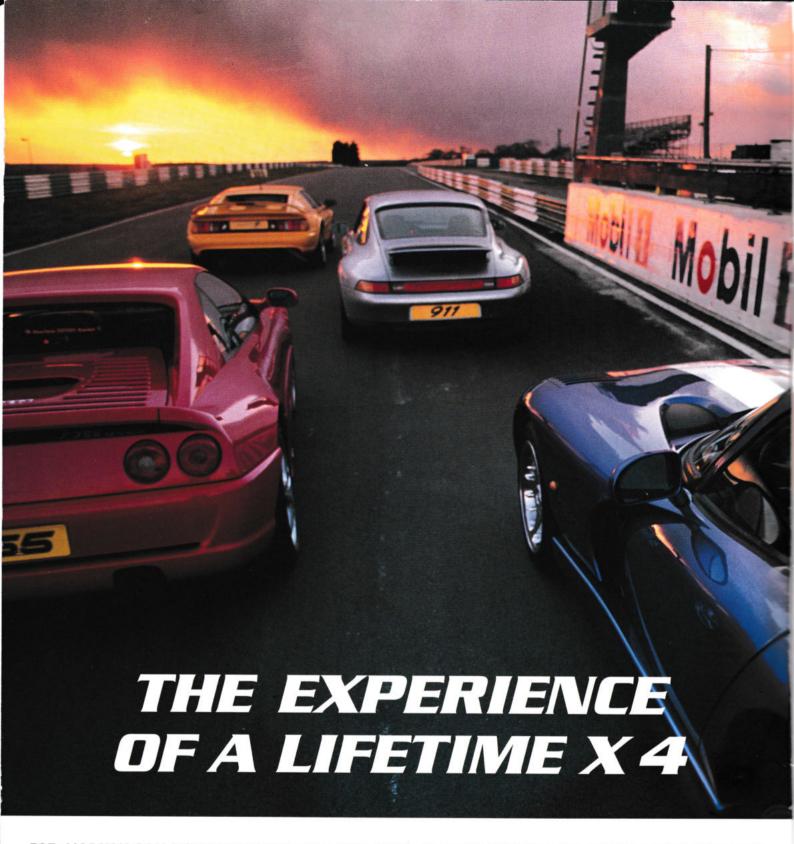

The dubious honour of favourite, if there is such a thing at the Festival, goes to Nicolas Kiesa. The Dane has dominated the domestic series this season and has already shown signs of true potential, with his intelligent racecraft and consistent pace.

His Haywood Racing Mygale teammate, Craig Murray, 22, is one of the most experienced Formula Ford racers in the field, and if anything counts over the three races which make up a Festival-winning performance, it is knowledge.

He is a hard racer, and his aggression will see him at the front from the very start, especially if he can overcome his qualifying bogie. Tom Sisley, 18, is a local lad and has shone at Brands this season. He needs a bit more time to develop before he is a regular frontrunner, but will be fighting for a position in the top six along with his Haywood Racing team-mate, the ever-improving American, 17-year-old Jeffrey Jones. Ricardo Megre, from Portugal, joined the team half-way through the year and is struggling to keep up with his talented team partners.

The biggest heartbreak of the 1998 Formula Ford Festival Final was 19-year-old Marcus Ambrose's Van Diemen laying broken in the Clearways gravel trap. He'd led for 18-and-a-half of the 20 laps before being pitched off the road by a closely-pursuing Jenson Button. This

year, he's back - and judging by recent form he is a real threat. Last week he lifted the Formula Ford Eurocup, after a tough and exciting final, fighting it out with Murray, Kiesa, and Van Der Ende. He is a really hard man to pass, and blindingly quick. Watch out for fireworks from the Tasmanian.

His team-mate is Ricardo van der Ende, who watched his brother take the Festival spoils in 1997. The 19-year-old from Maasdijk, was fourth in that race, but missed last season's event because of funding problems. He's been back at the top of the pile this year and desperately wants to take the Festival spoils, to make up for missing out on the British Championship.

The real wild card will be James Courtney. The Australian has improved with every race in the British Championship, and he seems on the verge of a breakthrough. Signing as the leading Van Diemen driver in 2000, a deal inked well ahead of this weekend's Festival, might just give him the extra boost he needs to step onto the top of the podium. The 19-year-old karting world champion is a real find.

Although the Van Diemens have struggled to keep pace with the Mygale chassis this year, a series of refinements have brought the Norfolk car a lot closer to the front. The fight between the constructors will be intriguing to watch

particularly as it's the time of year when teams start thinking about which chassis to buy for next season.

Outside the 'Works' teams, several drivers have been able to upset the regular order. Most impressive has been Mark Taylor, Taylor, from Tonbridge, drives a Mackie Mygale, and is excellent around the Brands Hatch Indy circuit. He is smooth and consistent, and unlikely to get ruffled in the cut-and-thrust atmosphere of the Festival. Two Scandinavians on the way up are Robert Dahlgren and Jesper Carlsen. Dahlgren clinched the Motoring News Trophy at Brands Hatch in May, a mini-Festival event. Carlsen, meanwhile, has taken a podium finish in the Slick 50 championship on a shoestring budget, in the unusual Vector chassis. Briton Rob Austin, and impressive Finn Kimi Raikkonen, have stepped down from Formula Renault Sport for the race and can't be discounted, but the portents favour drivers who have been in the cars all year.

Walter Lechner Jnr will be the most prominent of the overseas challengers. He has forsaken his father's own team - Walter Lechner Racing - to join forces with the French Graff outfit. Jean-Philippe Grand's team has come the closest to upsetting the traditional stranglehold of the British teams. The combination of Lechner Jnr - runner

up in the French and German championships this year - and the strength of Graff's Mygale, might just make history.

Jorg Hardt beat Lechner Jnr to the German championship and, ironically, he will handle a Lechner Racing Mygale, while insiders are looking towards French series winner Renaud Derlot, who will join Graff to bolster the French team's chances.

Memorial trophy to honour Neil Shanahan

The winner of this month's Formula Ford Festival will be presented with the Neil Shanahan Memorial Trophy, which has been instigated to commemorate the young Irish racing driver who tragically lost is life in a Formula Ford race earlier this year.

The trophy, which is made of porcelain, will be presented on a perpetual basis to the winner of the event and will be presented by Neil's parents Liam and Mary and sister Clare.

"The trophy will certainly be a fitting way to remember Neil," said Mick Merrigan who, along with Oisin O'Briain, formed Shanahan's management team. "This is the race Neil had set out to win at the start of the year so it is the most appropriate weekend to make such a presentation."

The Shanahan family will also donate a cheque for £1,000 to the winning driver. It was one of Neil's stated aims to win as much prize money as possible: "Neil would have been

thrilled to bits to have picked up a cheque for that kind of money and we know all the other drivers would want the same," Merrigan added.

Neil Shanahan was embarking on his first season in the British-based Slick 50 Formula Ford Zetec Championship after winning the Irish Formula Ford title in 1998, when he was sadly lost in an accident at Oulton Park.

In the four previous races he had established a tremendous reputation, leading the opening round at Donington Park and earning the Motoring News Race Ace award at Brands Hatch thanks to two audacious overtaking manoeuvres.

He was also an extremely popular addition to the Formula Ford paddock and won many friends during his short time in England, where he had first sprung to prominence in last year's Formula Ford Festival after holding second place in the Semi-Final until a mechanical problem forced him to retire.

James Courtney

Already signed to the lead the Van Diemen Formula Ford squad for 2000, the young Australian has impressed everyone this year, both with his competitiveness, and his ever-improving race craft. An each-way bet.

The one that got away



The revs were almost at their maximum, the engine howling as the Van Diemen RF82 screamed towards the braking point before the first apex. Steve Nichols was just in front and was setting his car up to go in deep. This was the chance, smoothly braking, a quick change down the gears and up the inside. Then suddenly, without warning, Nichols is facing the wrong way, and at 120 miles an hour and only three feet away there was no time for anything. The car rode up the front tyre of Nichols's car and suddenly it was performing aerial acrobatics, something it was not designed to do.

On the other side of the track Tony Jardine is commentating on the regional Sports Radio, and holds his breath. One lone figure, the driver's manager, is running down the inside of the track, hoping he is all right. Two million listeners wait in anticipation. Tony Jardine's voice comes on the air: "Yes, It's my mate Philip Bullman, and it looks like he is all right."

So who is Philip Bullman? Some of the older race fans will remember the name, and think to the days of Nigel Mansell, Derrick Warwick, Alain Prost, Martin Brundle, and the Aurora Formula one series, and suddenly the name comes jarring back into the consciousness. In 1979 he was the only British driver to finish at Monaco F3, battling Alain Prost for third place over two thirds of the race. He regularly beat Martin Brundle and Nigel Mansell and even Derrick Warwick. Bullman was on the way, as some of the newspapers wrote.

But this was 1979. Motorsports were in the dying decade of the gentleman's domain, where only the rich could race. Back then, if you didn't have the money, you didn't get the ride, and so it was that Philip Bullman's career took a downturn. In the mid 1980's the media had lost interest. He won the Willhire 24-hour race, set some records and overall proved to himself that he still had the touch.

Then in 1995, after several years of near obscurity, he secured a works drive with Prosport, and boy did it feel good. Two years later and that ride was also over. Then luck strikes him on the shoulder. Teaming up with Target MotorSports, he secured a ride in the URS FF2000 championships. In the first race he was already on the pace, threatening to upset the championship. According to him he was just working out the rust in his system.

It was during the season that the big news breaks. He is to team up with Graham Williams' Racecraft International to race in the Sports Racing World Cup. During the same time he also signed up with Extreme Sports Management to secure the funds so that the one that got away can return to where he belongs, in the ranks of the professional race driver.

Today, he is racing car number 13 in the white Target Motorsports Livery. Watch out for him because today he is here. Next year he will be on Eurosport.

For the third year running the Ford of Ireland Formula Ford Zetec Championship went down to the wire, 25-year old Paul Dagg finally clinching the title, after a season-long battle with Alan Ring.

Formula Ford in its Zetec guise has, been one of the great successes of Irish motorsport and has produced some of the closest and most exciting racing seen for years.

Before looking at the Irish contingent which has made the annual pilgrimage to Brands Hatch this weekend, it is appropriate to remember that this time last year, Ireland rested its hopes with a certain 19-year old, who had just clinched the Irish title. The immensely talented Neil Shanahan came to Brands Hatch on a high and was on course to win the semi-final when fuel pump problems cut short his race much to everyone's disappointment. Not before Neil had been noticed, however, and early this year he signed to drive for the works Van Diemen team in the British series.

Tragically, Neil's life was cut short in May when he was killed at Oulton Park whilst racing, but his memory will always live on in the hearts of the Irish. This weekend, the

amiable red-haired teenager will be particularly remembered as the Shanahan family, Liam and Mary, present the Festival winner with the Neil Shanahan Memorial Trophy.

Newly-crowned Ford of Ireland Champion, Paul Dagg, pays his second visit to Brands. Despite having only one win under his belt this year, he's learnt a lot, and heads the Irish team in his Swift SC99Z.

Former Irish Formula Ford 1600 Champion, Alan Ring, had two victories to his credit, but the Van Diemen RF98 driver had some bad luck, including a torrid time in the penultimate round at Mondello Park when he performed a double roll, having tangled wheels with lan Newport.

After a year's absence from Brands Hatch, Northern Ireland's gourmet chef, George McAlpin, is back! The fabulous black Miller Genuine Draft Mygale SJ99 is also sporting the decals of Seduction 2000 this weekend, which should ensure that McAlpin - the second member of the Irish team - will be in for a good ribbing. The charismatic restaurateur took two wins on his way to fourth in the Ford of Ireland series, but he

also annexed his first ever championship with the Northern Ireland Formula Ford crown at Kirkistown.

The third member of the Irish team is Benelux Champion, Peter Walsh, the first Irish driver to have won the series. Peter won three races in his Van Kalmthout Racing-run Van Diemen RF99 and took the title by virtue of winning three races to Tom Van Bavel's two, both drivers scoring 104 points.

John O'Hara, the 1996 Irish National Karting Champion, is in his second season of Zetecs and the 20-year old has certainly got his act together this year.

Inaugural series champion Noel Dunne, Alan Dwyer, John Gunning, Neville Smith and Matthew Gilmore swell the ranks of the Irish hopefuls, and Irish First Division Champion, Tim Buckley will be joined by fellow First Division runners Damien Burke and Mike Clyne. As ever an Irish surprise is on the cards.

Commissioned by the BRSCC, and designed and built by SHP Motorsport. Powered by a 1600cc Vauxhall 16-valve engine, producing 130bhp and driving the rear wheels through a 5-speed box. Engine speed is limited to 6500rpm and top governed to a maximum 100mph. Steel space-frame chassis, clad with reinforced body panels and run on Avon cntrol tyres.

An extra visit by the mighty BOSS Formula cars brings additional spectacle to the Formula Ford Festival this weekend.

BOSS on bonus visit

When the BOSS (Big Open Single Seaters) Formula circus rolled out of Brands Hatch in August, we all thought it was the last time this millennium that the Indy circuit would reverberate to the shrill sound of Formula One engines, running in anger. How wrong we were, for with the postponement of the planned finale at Silverstone last month, today's replacement round means that Festival racegoers are in for a feast of action.

Although Tony Worswick (Jordan) has already wrapped up the title, the Blackburn engineer will be keen to stamp his authority once again. He has won four of the seven rounds in '99, showing a gritty determination and will to succeed, in his Judd V10-powered Jordan 194.

It's amazing to think that, prior to the start of the campaign, his last BOSS victory was as long ago as the season

opener here back in 1996. That was before he acquired the Jordan, a machine that he has since honed (and practically rebuilt after a huge smash at Donington Park last year) and developed into a championshipwinning package.

Rob Gray is closest to Worswick in the points haul, an incredible effort by the man who Brands regulars will no doubt recall being in Formula 2000 some years ago. Gray drives for the European Formula Racing outfit, which fields a superbly presented squad of ex-works Tyrrells.

Gray has come of age this year, raising morale in Paul Stoddart's outfit, which has had its hands full, contesting both the BOSS and European Formula 3000 championships. Gray has yet to win a race, but there'd be no more deserving should he succeed today.

Arch-enthusiast, Stoddart, masterminded his teams efforts once again, his number one car being driven by reigning BOSS champion Nigel Greensall. Nigel, after setting a new outright lap record on the Indy circuit at Easter, has enjoyed mixed fortunes this season, culminating in a huge off at Thruxton.

Stoddart sits fourth in the points, having done extremely well in light of his limited race-car experience, and will be hoping to go well again today. Mike Gascoyne (he of the Jordan F1 technical

team) has appeared from time-to-time this year in one of the Tyrrells that he designed himself, when he worked for Ken Tyrrell.

Others of note in the main class include Dave Hutchinson, who has really got to grips with one of Dave Shelton's 1994 Benettons and of course, 'Daring Dave' himself. Hutchinson is desperately unlucky not to have a win under his belt – he ran out of fuel whilst leading the last lap, here in August.

Watch out too for the rare Eurobrun F1 car of Steve Fitzsimmons. Powered by an ex-Nigel Mansell Williams Judd V10 engine, it is potentially quick. Driven in its heyday by Gregor Foitek, it has yet to race in anger in the BOSS series.

The Masters class for the older F1 cars (built prior to 31/12/89) is the domain of the Hart turbo-engined cars of Colin Stone (RAM) and the superb Beatrice Lola of aircraft and car dealer Matthew Mortlock. Former Monoposto-series champion, Stone, is a regular in the Skoal Bandit-liveried car, while Mortlock only debuted the ex-Alan Jones chassis here in August.

Finally, the 3000 class title is already settled, with young Earl Goddard a runaway winner. The South African raised some eyebrows on his series debut in June, finishing third overall. He repeated that result at the ultra-fast Thruxton before going on to take an outright win at Brands Hatch in August.

Class rival Nigel James (Reynard) is no slouch, but looks set to play second fiddle unless Goddard's car lets him down.

The real surprise of this weekend is the long-awaited return to his home circuit of one of Britains finest racing drivers, Tony Trimmer, who'll be out to show that an ex-champion of British F1 can still cut the mustard!

The good ol' boys

With the new millenium just around the corner, what more fitting time and place than here this weekend, to be looking back on the history of Formula Ford, the world's most enduring category outside Formula One.

Formula Ford got underway at Brands Hatch back in July 1967. Yes, thirty-two years ago, and some of those long-lost marques that graced the early years are back here to do battle once again. To study them close up, makes you realise just how far removed today's hi-tec machines are from those early

The oldest FF1600s are found in the CARS Historic FF1600 series, in which Paul Sleeman has already regained the title he last won in 1997. This time he used a rare Macon MR8, rather than the Jamun T2 in which he also won the title back in 1996.

Sleeman quickly adapted to the Macon, comprehensively outpacing his rivals. They

include Robert Goodwin (Lola T200), Gary Smelt (Lotus 69F), the Merlyn Mk 20s of Kevin Stanzl and Peter Hancock, plus series sponsor Chris Alford in his Titan Mk 4. Other cars to look out for today include a Hawke DL2B, Alexis Mk 15, Palliser, Crossle and even a Brabham.

Moving on apace, we come to the Classic FF1600s, which takes in cars up to '82, in a two class structure. Having ruled the roost in Pre'74 for many years, Lotus 61 driver Dave Lowe has seen Kiwi Alan Crocker stealing his thunder this year. The two have been at it all season, and meet for the final time today.

Stephen Mawhinney has already wrapped up the Pre Dec '81 class. The Irishman fought some mighty battles with Nigel Lingwood and fellow Irishman James Hagan to win the title last year, but has rather put his rivals in their place in '99.

Finally we move on to the Super Classics (up to 31.12.89) where Reynard and Van Diemen chassis have been very much the dominant force in recent years. John Rickarby recently clinched the title, but wasn't entered at time of writing. Look out here for Elton Goonan's Duckhams-liveried Van Diemen RF87

More FF1600 action comes in the nonchampionship Trophy race, in which newlycrowned Kent County titlist Brett Francis is the man to beat. He faces a healthy entry that includes sometime Swift Cars supremo. Frank Bradley, making a rare appearance, and also the Irish veteran (he's well into his sixties), Tommy Reid.

The URS Formula Ford championship reaches its finale today, Anthony Galvin and Eric Hoult having already won their respective classes. Galvin's domination of Class A was mostly in the earlier part of the season, and the likes of Bob Davis, Steve Nichol (of the McLaren F1 outfit) and Tony Hancock, will be keen to put one over the champion this weekend.

Sports 2000 has been a welcome quest race on the Festival bill over the years, and it's wonderful to see these lovely machines again, and in such great numbers.

Finally, we come bang up to date with the opening round of the winter Ford Fiesta championship. These are the 1400cc Zetec cars which usually race as part of the Touring Car package. The winter series was held for the first time last year, the title being won by seasoned preparation ace/driver Colin Stancombe.

Stancombe's multi-vehicle outfit has since gone on to claim the national series this year with driver David Gibson. Picking any likely winners isn't easy at this stage, but it may well be that Stancombe has a hand in whoever lifts the title.

Up to now, young drivers have had to make the huge transition from karts to single-seaters. With the advent of T-Cars, all that has changed.

Now drivers as young as 14 can take an Association of Racing Drivers Schools (ARDS) test, and earn a licence to race a specially-built 100 mph T-Car saloon at top circuits like Brands Hatch or Snetterton.

Launched earlier this month at Castle Combe, the pilot T-Cars programme for 1999 sees eight youngsters, aged from 14 to 16, taking part. There are three races at each T-Cars event, with a keenly-contested Driver of the Day prize up for grabs.

The plan for Y2K is to expand the number of meetings – most of them will take place in school holidays – and attract a grid of 15 or more cars. Project manager Magnus Laird is enthusiastic about the prospects: "T-Cars is unique. Nowhere else in the world can an aspiring driver as young as 14 get behind the wheel of a proper car, on a proper circuit, and learn how to go racing in a safe, controlled environment. Now that T-Cars is up and running we are experiencing massive interest from families who want to become involved."

Inaugural T-Cars Driver of the Day at Castle Combe was 16-year-old Tom Boardman; can he stage a repeat performance at Brands, or will one of his young rivals get the upper hand this time?

Driver Profile

Tom Chiltern will be the youngest of the drivers competing in the second round of the inaugural T-Cars series.

Tom, from Norwood Hill, near Reigate in Surrey, only turned 14 in March. He is currently the youngest MSA competition licence holder in the UK.

With backing from Virgin Atlantic, this is Tom's first experience of racing. At the first round at Castle Combe earlier this month, all the drivers had to cope with extremely difficult, wet conditions. In the three short sprint races, Tom finished 5th, twice, and 6th, positions he hopes to improve on this weekend at Brands.

A pupil at Shiplake College in Henley, Tom is currently studying for GCSE's, and hopes to continue to mix motor racing and school next year, when T-Cars becomes a full championship.



All the young drivers competing in T-Cars have had to undergo strict training and assessment, to pass ARDS competition licence requirements, in accordance with the governing body of motor sport in this country, the MSA.

Tom is currently being coached by Andy Constable, an experienced racing driver, and senior instructor at the Nigel Mansell Racing School at Brands Hatch.

Past-Winners ...and where did they go?

The World Finals have launched the career of numerous Grand Prix, GT and touring car drivers. It's high-profile status launches winners into the limelight, as the eyes of the motor sport world focus on Brands Hatch every October. Matt James traces the history of the 26 past winners:

1972 Ian Taylor

(England, Dulon) Won the 1973 British Formula Three championship and moved on briefly to Formula 5000. Successful in Sports 2000, he switched to tin-tops and won the 1986 Uniroyal Saloon Car Championship. Switched to the Honda CRX Championship and then joined the Rover 216GTi championship. He was tragically killed during a race at Spa in 1992.

1973 / 9 Don MacLeod

(England, Van Diemen and Sark). The only man to win the Festival twice, he won the 1979 event in a car of his own construction - the Sark. He later became involved as its UK agent.

1974Richard Morgan

(England, Crossle). Turned down a Lotus F1 testing contract after a successful spell in Formula Atlantic. Returned to Formula Three in 1985, but has subsequently retired.

1975 Geoff Lees

(England, Royale). He won in Formula Three, and clinched both the Japanese and European Formula Two championships. Tried F1 with Tyrrell, Ensign and Shadow with little success. Joined Toyota's Group C effort in the late-'80s, and more recently, drove the Newcastle United Lister Storm at Daytona and Le Mans. Currently a works Toyota Sportscar driver.

1976 Derek Daly

(Ireland, Hawke). British Formula Three Champion in 1977. Drove for March, Tyrrell and Williams in F1, then switched to Indycars. Also formed part of Jaguar's 1989 Le Mans challenge and led the event at one stage. Now a TV commentator.

1977 Chico Serra

(Brazil, Van Diemen). Won the 1979 British Formula Three Championship before success in F2 led to F1 with Fittipaldi and Arrows. Occasionally drove sportscars in the late-'80s.

1978Michael Rowe

(England, Van Diemen). Moved to America and scored huge success in Can-Am before joining Nissan's IMSA assault. Made a brief comeback in Europe with Aston Martin's Sportscar project.

1980 Roberto Moreno

(Brazil, Van Diemen) Moved up through F3, Formula Atlantic and Formula 2 before a switch to CART. Came back to Europe to tackle the F3000 championship, and still remains the most successful driver ever in that category. Piloted a succession of bad F1 cars before he was selected by Benetton in 1990. Booted out in favour of Michael Schumacher, he returned to the CART where he has had an on-off career since leaving F1 in 1995.

1981 Tommy Byrne

(Ireland, Van Diemen). Won the 1982 British F3 championship and entered F21 with Theodore. Moved to the states and made a career with paid drives.

1982 Julian Bailey

(England, Lola). First Brit to win in F3000 in 1987. Raced F1 with Tyrrell and Lotus before joining Nissan's sports car programme. Has since raced touring cars for Toyota in Britain and South Africa, and now races in the Privilege Insurance GT Championship. He won the British Championship in 1999, provisionally.

1983 Andrew Gilbert-Scott

(England, Reynard). Raced in F3 and F3000 before turning his attentions to sports cars and F3000 in Japan. Made a decent living there, and formed part of the Gulf McLaren FIA GT squad.

1984

Gerrit Van Kouwen

(Holland, Lola). Won in F3 before going to saloons. Raced in BTCC before returning to Holland.

1985 Johnny Herbert

England, Quest). Won British F3 title in 1987, before terrible crash halted his F3000 career in 1988. Came back to race F1 for Benetton, Lotus and Tyrrell. Won Le Mans for Mazda in 1991. A second spell at Benetton, alongside Michael Schumacher, brought victory at the 1995 British and Italian GPs. After a spell at Sauber, he move to Stewart Ford for 1999 and took their first win, at the Nurburgring.



Roland Ratzenberger

(Austria, Van Diemen). Roland's 'drive anything, anywhere' attitude saw him part of BMW touring car squad while racing in F3 in 1988. Raced a Slick 50 BMW in BTCC. Subsequently moved to Japan to race for Toyota in sports cars. Got F1 opportunity with Simtek in 1994, but was killed in practice for the San Marino Grand Prix.

1987 Eddie Irvine

(Ireland, Van Diemen). Competed in F3 and F3000 with Marlboro backing, but didn't achieve any wins. Moved to Japan and built a career in F3000 and Toyota sports cars. Drove the last two GPs for Jordan in 1993, where he stayed for two seasons, and was picked by Ferrari in 1996 where he remains. Won his first GP in Australia in 1999.

1988

Vincenzo Sospiri

(Italy, Van Diemen). Won the GM Euroseries and moved to F3000, where he won the championship in 1995.. However, Lola signed him to spearhead its disastrous F1 foray in 1997. Switched to IRL and was on the front row for the Indy 500 in 1997. Now partners Emmanuel Collard in ISRS.



Niko Palhares

(Brazil, Van Diemen). Struggled with a lack of funds, but made it into Formula Three. Career faltered with a difficult season, and he's now stepped into driver management.

1990

Dave Coyne

(England, Swift). A larger-than-life character. Raced Sportscars, and achieved most success in British F3000 in 1991. Also drove for Peugeot in the TOCA Shootout in 1992. Now a car salesman

1991

Marc Goosens

(Belgium, Van Diemen). Moved on to F3 with West Surrey Racing and won before tackling F3000, again winning. Now competing in Japan's Formula Nippon series, Japanese GTs and Belcar.

1992

Jan Magnussen

(Denmark, Van Diemen). Dominated Formula Three with Paul Stewart Racing in 1994. Moved to the ITC in '95 with Mercedes before stepping up to Formula One with Stewart-Ford, now replaced by Jos Verstappen. Now races in Champ cars.

1993

Russell Ingall

(Australia, Van Diemen). Raced Formula Renault Sport in 1995, scoring race wins. Returned home to Australia after a fruitless season of German F3 to become a front-runner in the V8 touring car series. Won Bathhurst in 1995

1994 Jason Watt

(Denmark, Vector). Formula Opel Euroseries champion in 1995, then ITC in '96 with Alfa. Finished on the podium at Silverstone. F3000 race winner in 1997, 4th in championship this year.

1995 Kevin McGarrity

(Ireland, Van Diemen). Formula Opel Euroseries with little success in 1996, before switching to TOM'S GB F3 team for '97. Top ten in championship and a podium finisher at Oulton Park. Moved on to F3000, and enters his second full season in 2000.

1996 Mark Webber

(Australia, Van Diemen). Won his fourth Formula Three race with Alan Docking Racing. Finished third in F3's Marlboro Masters in Holland. Partners Bernd Schneider for Mercedes in the FIA GT Championship. Recently

1997 Jacky Van Der Ende

(Netherlands, Van Diemen). Competed in Formula Opel Euroseries where he finished 5th in the championship. Now racing in the German F3 Championship.

1998 Jenson Button

(Britain, Mygale). After doing the 'double' of winner the British Championship and the Festival last season, he graduated to the British Formula 3 Championship. Took pole at his first race and had a couple of wins on his way to finishing third in the 1999 Championship.
