Formula Ford

For each of the last three seasons the Duckhams Van Dieman team has scooped both senior FF1600 titles. This year, the very talented Brazilian driver, Niko Palhares, has notched up first places for the Van Dieman team at Silverstone and Donington, and a second place here at Brands on Easter Sunday, his first outing in the car.

Meanwhile, in another Duckhams Van Dieman, 18-year-old Scotsman David Coulthard has been taking the Dunlop/ Autosport Star of Tomorrow and the P&O European Ferries Championship by storm. Despite the fact that this is his first season in Formula Ford, David has already won six races in the two championships — and it's still only May! Touring Cars

Karl Jones' fearless driving earned him the 1987 Uniroyal Production Saloon Car Championship, with a Duckhams-liveried Ford Escort. For 1989, he and the Asquith Autosport team are contesting the British Touring Car Championship with a Ford Sierra RS Cosworth — still in Duckhams blue and yellow, of course.

The Asquith team's engines proved very reliable last season and a valiant third place at Thruxton recently proved that Karl's confidence in the team is well-founded.

Motorcycles

Simon Buckmaster has already been mentioned, and he achieved one of his best ever results with a fabulous second place in the Italian GP at Misano a couple of weeks ago, in appalling weather conditions.

New for this season is Duckhams sponsorship for Francis Neill's talented team of riders, and the support has already been rewarded with a clutch of race victories, include two apiece for Woolsey Coulter on a 250cc Aprilia and Darren Dixon on his 750cc Honda. Meanwhile the greatest trials rider of them all, Sammy Miller, has been proving that at 55, he can still finish in the points, on his Duckhams-backed 500 Aerial.

Formula 3000

The British Formula 3000 Championship is only attracting small grids as yet, but is producing some very fierce competition. Nevertheless, the Duckhams-backed NEC Reynard has put Gary Brabham on the podium at all three rounds so far — with a first, a second and a third — and he is in second place overall in the championship.

Porsches

Over £1 million worth of cars line up for each round of the BF Goodrich Porsche Club GB Championship; the biggest of all single-marque production series in Britain. Many of the cars run with Duckhams support including — at the time of writing — the leaders in all four classes.

That is a brief outline of just a few of the dozens of competitions that Duckhams are backing this season. Between them, they will almost certainly be representing the company this weekend at every race meeting in Britain — and quite a few overseas. Here at Brands Hatch watch out on Monday for Richard Piper and his Theodore in the Historic F1 race and Duckhams 'veteran' Reg James in the Toyota F3 event. Sunday will see rounds of the 'Duckhams Champion of Brands' for both solo bikes and three-wheelers. The latter event includes the Duckhams-sponsored pairs of David Lockyer/Robert Hitchcock and Gary Golder/Karl Firmin.

The two packed days of varied motorsport here at Brands Hatch will provide a wealth of good racing on the track, while all manner of exciting attractions around the circuit will provide plenty of other entertainment. We wish you a very enjoyable weekend.

He currently shares joint-third place with Brands Hatch Racing School pupil David Lewis and the two will no doubt be looking forward to renewing their Cadwell Park scrap!

The formula's only lady racer, Fiona Webb, is looking forward to returning to her home circuit after surviving a spin at Cadwell and will be out to add further points to her season's tally.

Action attraction

The MGCC Anglia Centre Phoenix Petroleum Championship pays its first-ever visit to Brands Hatch this weekend when a whole range of production MGs — from T-types to Maestros — contest round four of what promises to be a action-packed series.

The last round at Cadwell Park two weeks ago provided a thrilling two car battle for the lead in Class A with Steve Westwood in his MG Midget taking a last-gasp win from Duncan Drye whose fuel pump broke on the final lap. The two swopped and changed positions throughout the race and more of the same is expected today, with

the prospect of Andrew Hiley also joining in the fun.

In Class B, last year's champion, David Ecob in his MG Midget DM'A', is proving the man to beat again but should face strong opposition from Peter Coates, Conrad Bos and Alan Meadows, while in Class C Jonathan Wheeler and Stuart Musk head the entry.

Series co-ordinator Phil Thompson has over 80 drivers registered and believes the championship provides low-cost motor racing with the emphasis firmly on enjoyment. "Everyone has a lot of fun but having said that, it's still very competitive," he says.

In Class D for standard Plus 4s, Barry Sumner has been the quickest of the bunch but don't discount Chris Dady who won last year's championship and colannuallylected the presented Peter Collins Tray for his efforts.

One driver who will be hoping for success to round

off a memorable few weeks is Class A entrant, Andrew Jackson, who arrives back from his honeymoon just in time for Monday's race.

Andrew spent his honeymoon driving his Morgan around Europe and will have the car checked over by Brands Hatch Morgans before taking to the track!

The Morgan Challenge is into its fifth year but 1989 is the first season the championship has received backing. The sponsorship has been provided by Milbank Trucks who already have a vested interest in the series through their sponsorship of John Milbank and company managing director, David Watson. The Champion of Brands FF1600 regular from Hastings has been watching his father Len compete since 1974, when he made his debut at Lydden Hill.



He said: "It was based at Buckmore Park, Rochester and after I won the championship, I moved into Class 1 100cc karts." Due to Len's Sunday commitments at Lydden, Mark was unable to travel and had to content himself with trips to Tilbury and Snetterton. "As soon as I was 17 I started racing in FF1600 at Lydden with dad, and then progressed to the Champion of Brands series in one of Howard Drake's Lasers.

Although the past two

years failed to produce the kind of results Mark was hoping for, 1989 has seen a vast improvement in fortune. "I'm now running Tony Bee's Jamun from last year but apart from the chassis, everything else on it is brand new, including the '89 design rear end, Staffs gearbox and a Connaught engine. The car is actually owned by the sponsor, Overland Freight Forwarders who also put some money into the running costs.

Mark, who combines instructing at the Brands Hatch Racing School with work in the family's fibreglass business, has hopes of moving up motor racing's proverbial ladder.

"I want to do as much racing as possible," he says, "of course it must be everyone's ambition to reach F1 but that's all about money these days. Motor racing just gets into your blood and I'm just happy to be involved, whether it's out on the track or behind the scenes."



Copies of the magazine, along with special T-shirts and mugs etc, will be on sale, plus a selection of exclusive TVR mechandise.



A lot more bother than a hover

LAWNMOWER racing in this country is now in its 13th year and is probably the cheapest form of motor sport available anywhere.

Organised by the British Lawnmower Racing Association, who are affiliated to the R.A.C. Motor Sport Association, the sport owes its origins to Jim Gavin.

As an international rally consultant Jim was responsible for the routes for the two London to Sydney Rallies, and Mexico World Cup Rally, and many others. However, rumour has it the actual origins of lawnmower racing were thought up while Jim was in an Iranian gaol having been arrested by border Police when plotting a special stage for the second London to Sydney Rally, although folklore has it that the regulations were thrashed out in the Public Bar of the Cricketers Arms, Wisborough Green, East Sussex, where the Headquarters of the organisation are still based.

A series of races throughout the summer months are organised with British and World Championships for the various types of machines.

The classes are:

Group 1 - which are run-behinds and whilst popular 10 years ago have unfor-

tunately faded out through lack of entries.

Group 2 - which are the mowers with the towed seats, or

Group 3 - which are the sit-on mowers, and are the fastest.



Close action is guaranteed in Mower

All mowers share the same common regulation that they must be built to mow lawns and cannot be purpose-built machines.

Group 2 can have an engine size of up to 10 horsepower, although the fastest are the six horsepower two stroke Clio machines. These feature engines Rotax tuned to the same specification as racing karts and are very powerful.

Four strokes can use up to 10 horsepower, but with one or two exceptions, have yet to match the two-strokes in terms of speed and reliability.

Group 3 are the fastest machines, these are capable of around 45 to 50 miles an hour, and in fact last year, the winning machine earned a place in the 12-hour race averaged 28 miles an hour, which earned a place in the Guiness Book of Records as the furthest distance travelled in 12 hours on a lawnmower.

Racing over the weekend will feature numerous races on both Sunday and Monday with practice starting at 11.00 on Sunday with the first race at 13.30 and on Monday practice starting at 12.30 with the first race at 13.30.

A guide to Monday's car racing

Many of this weekend's spectators may be sampling their very first taste of motor racing and in an effort to help newcomers to understand the intricacies of motor racing, *Ann Neal* gives a brief guide to Monday's car racing meeting.

SEVEN races over the Brands Hatch 1-206-mile Indy circuit will provide a constant variety of thrills and spills from the frenzied antics of FF1600 through to the more precise style of Historic F1s. In between there are races for sportscars, saloons and F3 single-seater cars but it's the ever-popular FF1600 category that kicks off the meeting with the latest round of the P&O European Ferries Champion of Brands.

Formula Ford 1600 is generally regarded as the launching pad for tomorrow's Grand Prix stars and it is in this tyre-squealing formula that drivers quickly learn the more important aspects of car control.

Norfolk-based manufacturers, Van Diemen, are the long-time leaders in FF1600 but Swift, Quest, Ray, Tiga and Jamun examples are all represented in Monday's race. It's not easy to spot the difference between manufacturers but a closer look at the cars will reveal a subtle array of bodywork and design features.


Most of the drivers entered in the Champion of Brands series are locally-based and race almost exclusively at the Kentish track. Although the formula tends to attract the up-and-coming youngsters, there are several drivers competing today who are seasoned and very experienced campaigners. Look out for the likes of Len Bull, John Oxborrow and Chris Hall as they jostle for positions with 22-year-old Chris Goodwin who is also contesting this year's junior FF1600 championship and promising young Mexican driver, Victor O'Farrill.

Race two is for the Milbank Trucks Morgan Challenge and is quite selfexplanatory since it runs exclusively for the Morgan marque.

The championship has been running for five seasons and its points system is operated on an unique basis whereby car and engine modifications and configurations are all taken in account when issuing points. It might sound confusing but series co-ordinator Rick Bourne assures us with the help of modern-day computer systems, the format is quite straightforward! To simplify matters on race day, the series is broken down into Classes A, B, C and D and the first man across the line in each class is declared the victor!

If you're seeking for close and sometimes door-banging action, then look no further than race three when the MG Car Club Anglia Centre Phoenix Petroleum Championship takes to the track.

The title may be a bit of a mouthful but if recent races are any judge, the MGs will prove a hard act to follow. Again, the cars are broken down into classes with Class A for modified cars

being the one most likely to produce the eventual winner. Class B is for standard Midgets and front-wheel drive cars while Class C caters for MGA, MGB and MGCs. With a full 28-car grid, the field is unlikely to get too spread out around the Indy circuit and the heat will almost certainly be on at the front from where Duncan Drye, Steve Westwood and Andrew Hiley will head the rest.

Race four is for the BRSCC Toyota Formula 3 Championship and will provide us with some fast single-seater action. These F3s are not quite the same as those you'll see on BBC "Grandstand" but are slightly older models yet still highly capable of reaching top speeds of 100mph. Chevrons, Marches, Ralts, Argos and a few more lesser-known chassis will be evidence in what is becoming a well-supported class.

Formula One

For many, race five will be the highlight of the meeting when Brands Hatch echoes to the unmistakable sounds of the HSCC Historic Formula Ones. It goes without saying that these are F1s of the past with most of those entered coming from the seventies and early eighties. However, one of the more up-to-date versions is the last year's Arrows A10 of American Eddie Cheever entered by Tony O'Neill. It's been some time since turbo-charged F1s have raced at Brands Hatch (1986 to be precise) and no doubt the appearance of O'Neill's machine will stir the hearts of many a F1 enthusiast! The A10 will be joined on the grid by its earlier counterpart, the A4 driven in the 1982 Grand Prix season by Mauro Baldi, but nowadays handled by Ted Williams.

Another close race can be expected in


race six when the Slick 50 Road Saloon Championship enters round five. The drivers are only just back from competing at Zandvoort in Holland last weekend and with 25 of these standard Class B (up to 1800cc) cars due to line up at Brands Hatch, excitement of the highest order can be expected. Amongst the line-up are some instantly recognisable cars such as the VW Golf GTi and Scirocco, Ford Fiesta and Escort, Talbot Sunbeam, Hillman Avenger and Alfa Sud but the car that currently has the legs on all the rest is the Vauxhall Astra GTE of Mike Devine.

Sportscars

The final race of the day is for the Wurth Multisports and should not be missed. The Van Diemen-built Multisports formula is Brands Hatch's newest sportscar category and return to the Kentish circuit for this, round three of the inaugural championship. All the cars are powered by 1600cc engines and are very similarly matched with success heavily dependent on driver ability. The grids may be small at the moment but the action is never dull as each driver battles to keep the opposition in his mirrors.

Finally, don't miss out on the vantage viewing points that the Brands Hatch Indy circuit provide. In particular, pay a visit to the Paddock Hill Grandstand where you will be offered a virtually unobstructed view of the whole circuit. A wander up to the Druids hairpin where the drivers fight to gain an advantage is also strongly recommended while South Bank and Clearways provide spectacular views over the circuit.

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Grand Prix nostalgia

The Kent Motor Factory Trophy — a round of the HSCC Formula One Championship — is a feature race of the weekend's programme and sees the first visit this year to Brands Hatch of the HSCC Formula One circus. We asked Historic F1 driver Bob Baxter to set the scene.

From small beginnings in 1987 the championship gained momentum during last year and for 1989 some 29 competitors have registered, in cars ranging from the 1977 Monaco Grwinning Wolf to the Arrows A10B Megatron driven in 1988 Grand Prix by Eddie Cheever!

We are privileged today to have an excellent selection of machinery — all superbly presented by their owners many in the colours of their original teams/sponsors. The accent is very much on origination with no modifications allowed to chassis or engines (which are almost all three litre Cosworth DFVs) from when these examples of the pinnacle of motor sport technology did battle on the Grand Prix circuits of the World.

Pure genius

Heading the entry list is a brace of cars from Hampshire-based Source Racing, to be driven by team owner Don Wood and ex Formula Ford Champion Richard Peacock.

Wood is the current Championship holder — secured after the series went down to the wire at Snetterton last year.

He will be driving the ex-Derek Daly Guinness March 811 DFV pending readiness of his pair of Beatrice Hart Turbos which should appear early in the season. Peacock will be doing his best not to copy the actions of Daly in his Tyrrell 010 DFV which is best remembered for its

spectacular exit at Ste Devote in the 1980 Monaco Grand Prix.

The very professional BHL Engineering — based at the circuit — is running a Williams FWO8 for experienced local driver Tony Gordon. Club circuit specialist Tony lives nearby at Meopham and has benefitted from some recent testing to ensure complete competitiveness of his ex-Jacques Laffite team car. Do not bet against his combination for outright honours today.

Arrows

Two more competitors who should be well to the fore are both running exworks Arrows A4 Cosworths, Bob Baxter and Ted Williams.

Baxter has been supporting the championship for the past two seasons in his highly original ex-Marc Surer classic, with a best result in 1988 of second in the very wet Silverstone encounter.

For this round he has attracted support from the race sponsor and 'The Watch Works' — a company marketing exclusive wrist watches run by top fashion model Victoria White. The car will not be in its original familiar orange livery but nevertheless is superbly presented by Sevenoaks-based C2 specialists McNeil Engineering.

Mauro Baldi's A4 chassis was acquired by ebullient Bristolian Williams during the winter and has been painstakingly restored. Early season testing at Snetterton and Pembrey has proved encouraging and Ted's press-on style should ensure some fireworks today.

Turbo

Tony O'Neil faces the challenge of racing his ex-Cheever Arrows Megatron for the first time, testing permitting.

Of similar stature are the Theodores of Richard Piper and Kelvin Lambeth. The very experienced Piper has been concentrating on World Sportscar racing, for the past couple of seasons during which time the 1983 classic has remained dormant.

It is now resplendent in its Texas Home Care livery and will be in the hunt today for sure.

Kelvin Lambeth — the Essex based motor dealer — has recently acquired the Roberto Gurerrero sister car and will be having a run today — following a season with an F2 Brabham in 1988.

Prime movers in the FORCE (Formula One Race Car Entrants) organisation David McLaughlin and Lorina Boughton will be out in a Tyrrell 012 and McLaren M23 respectively.

David has an enviable stable of cars to choose from of which he considers the Tyrrell the most competitive over 20 laps of the Indy circuit. The season preparation problems have delayed testing but we can be sure he will be racing as aggressively as ever.

This season marks the first move into F1 machinery for Lorina who is well known for her exploits in sports cars. She adds a much-needed touch of glamour to the scene!

Northern-based Andrew Wareing will be bringing his Williams FWO8 down fresh from Oulton Park for a rare foray onto the southern circuits and John Saphir fields his ex-Alan Jones FWO7 providing he recovers from a back problem received whilst limbering up for the season in the gym!

These plus a smattering of older Marches and Penskes makes for a great race in prospect — the battle for outright victory, Gordon? Wood? with the Arrows A4 pairing of Baxter and Williams as a good each way bet.

Whatever the outcome you can be sure of a tremendous scrap for the first visit of these 500 bhp projectiles to Kent this year.

Others in with a shout will be the ever improving 'Ted' Bunton and Steve Bushell on their 1000 Yamahas, and local favourite Dave Burford making a welcome return to the series after earning the dubious honour of becoming the season's first victim - crashing on the first lap of the first race at the first meeting of the year.

Grand Prix


If exotic Grand Prix machinery is more your taste keep an eye out for Orpington's Simon Minch on the ex-Paul Lewis RG500 Suzuki. The temperamental twostroke has given Simon some headaches so far this year, but the spectacular Aussie proved a few years ago on its day, like Simon it's capable of beating anything.

Heading the 350 charge will be current championship leader Mark Whiting from nearby Ashford, an area which seems to produce so many fine riders including former Champions of Brands Gary Weston and Tim Bourne (perhaps it's something in the water) and Heath-

field's Simon Thompson.

In the Class 'A' race, runaway leader in the championship Nigel Froud another Ashford man - must start as favourite for a win on his 250 Yamaha, but the ever increasing competition might have something to say about that.

Those likely to get close to the young tearaway include 43-years young Dave Wilson on the ex-Gary Noel, European

Watch out again for Paul Willis, this time on a 600 Suzuki under the Fenton Plant Hire Banner.

Always in the hunt, and sure to be among the front runners will be the pairings of Trevor Rudolph/David Polden and John Cable/Chris George with their 750 Yamaha outfits.

Four-stroke honours decided between John Young/lan Curtis and Brian Aslett/David Vaughan, while

leading F2 runner Gary Golder, with Karl Firmin in the chair will aim to the first 350 home.

Some of the closest racing this afternoon is sure to come from the production races.

In the hectic 250 class, aptly named the 'headbangers' its not unusual to have 10 riders covered by just a couple of seconds so picking a winner is never

At the last meeting on the Grand Prix circuit the brilliant Paul O'Connor smashed the lap record on his way to two crushing victories so he must be among the favourites but with riders the calibre of Rhys 'Banzai' Boyd, Gerry Wicks, Kevin Willson and sensational novice John Yates in the opposition nothing is for certain.

In the senior production race Paul Willis makes another appearance but won't find the going any easier against the likes of Rob Dawson, Paul Lund and fearless newcomers Jason and Sean Emmett.

Despite their relative inexperience, the brothers are already making big names for themselves and many people are tipping them as stars of the future.


A full programme of supporting races includes single cylinder and Yamaha 'LC' races providing a cheaper alternative for the riders as well as classic action and novice races for the newcomers.

Yellow plus yellow with red stripes held crossed: These two flags shown crossed diagonally and held aloft, indicate the race has been stopped and is accompanied by a red flag (see above) at the start/finish line.

Yellow (waved): Great danger in sec tion of track

ahead, slow down, pro ceed with caution. Yellow (motionless): Danger in section of track ahead:

take care, no overtak ing, maintain positions until clear of section displaying yellow flag.

Green: Course clear. Used on marshals' posts to indicate their position to riders on first lap of all practice sessions. Also shown immediately after the post where a yellow flag has been shown to indicate circuit now clear ahead. Black: Accompanied by riders number on separate board. That rider to stop in pits next time round. Always shown at start/finish line on special instructions from Clerk of the course.

Yellow with red stripes: Oil flag. Dis played when oil has been dropped on the circuit in that section, displayed until the hazard has been dealt with also denotes slippery surface ahead.

White: Ambulance or course car on circuit.
Yellow with black cross: Denotes start of last lap.
Black/white chequered: Denotes finish of race, usually waved at the winner and held motionless until every

other rider has passed. NB: Races at all Brands Hatch Circuits are started using a system of red and green lights.
