


Riders for Health - What's the Problem?

Motorcycles are being used in projects of all kinds all over the developing world. The problem is that they are very rarely being used properly.

In many of the countries involved, there is no system of training management, workshops, spares or even fuel to support the bikes. The aid and development agencies who supply and use them have not usually understood that a motorcycle is not like a four wheeled vehicle. It will not run for six months without attention. Neither have they understood the need for detailed training for riders in riding and maintenance skills.

The World Health Organisation does understand these

problems, and has asked for help. A small group known as Riders for Health was set up to devise and develop management and training systems. What that group now wants to do is to set up a special pilot project in Lesotho in southern Africa. The money raised today will go directly to that project through Save the Children Fund, who are closely involved in the programme.

Riders for Health is an idea that goes far beyond Lesotho. It embraces every motorcyclist in Europe or America or in the less developed world who wants to take part. In Africa, the Riders for Health are often immunisation workers, or primary health advisers. Here,

Rider for Health are those motorcyclists who want to raise money to support the use of motorcycles to save lives. So, we are all Riders for Health.

We expect the movement to grow dramatically. We also expect it to change the way motorcycles and motorcyclists are viewed by the media. After all, we have a new motto and one that tells an important truth about us:

MOTORCYCLES SAVE LIVES





A Story You Never Expected to Read

ON THE OUTSKIRTS of a little town in Eastern Somalia, some children were playing a game. It wasn't a game they had ever played before. A funny looking stranger was hiding behind a Toyota and once in a while he would run out, grinning like a baboon and waving his arms about. They hid behind the corner of their house and waited for the stranger to go back behind the Hi-Lux. And then it would happen all over again.

We know this stranger as Randy Mamola. Of course, the name meant nothing in Bardere. All the children knew was that here was someone who appeared to be crazy and who was hell-bent on entertaining them.

But Randy wasn't just there to entertain, he was there to draw the world of motorcycling and the world of serious need closer together.

Since that visit some remarkable things

have happened. But none more remarkable and none more important than the event you are taking part in today.

Who would have believed it possible? All the world's leading grand prix riders are here and every one of them has come at his own expense. Some are riding and some are just here to say hello, and to say 'thank you' to you, the supporters of the greatest sport in the world.

Could you even have imagined today's

headlines a year ago: Kenny Comes Back to Save the Children or World Champ Rainey Rides in Club Meeting or Kevin Schwantz Serves Hamburgers at Brands? You may have a great imagination, but I doubt if you foresaw that!

So what's it all about? What's going on?

Two things. First of all, because of what Randy saw in Somalia, a group of people started to look seriously at how to make motorcycles work really effectively in health programmes and other jobs in the less developed world. Early this year, a meeting of people who might be able to help was called in London. After the meeting he suggested to Andrea Coleman that someone should put on a race. He stunned everyone by announcing that he would bring his bikes and his riders.

Gradually the whole thing took shape. Terry Mount of the British Motor Cycle Racing Club was also thinking of putting on some sort of special event and he mentioned his idea to Olly Duke, of *Motor Cycle News*. Olly spoke to Andrea, and things began to move. Randy was very enthusiastic, and so were all the other leading riders. All it took then was six solid months of organising.

So that's one aspect. The other is to do with what you could call public relations. Motorcyclists have been trying to tell the world ever since two wheels were linked to an engine that they are not this and not that. Not hooligans, not dirty, not dangerous. It's been an uphill struggle. Nobody has been listening.

But now, with our connection with Save the Children and Riders for Health, things are different. We know now that motorcycles save lives. We also know that without motorcycles, some vital health programmes could simply not be carried out.

So now we can start to show the world what we are, instead of telling it what we're not. We care, and we act. And, it turns out, we're rather important to millions of people in the developing world.

That's why we're all here today. You're showing just what it is that motorcycle enthusiasts are capable of. And because you came today, the world will never quite be the same again. The idea that motorcyclists are outlaws is well on its way to becoming a dead duck.

One final thing. The Americans. Remember the days when all we ever read about them was that they were cold fish, only interested in money, and couldn't give a damn about club riders or the kind of motorcyclists who came to the meetings to watch? Well, here's news. That kind of coverage was never justified and it always hurt the riders it was aimed at. That's right. These tough guys with no hearts were hurt, just as you would be. Well, they're here today, just like you are. It's time for a re-think on that, too.

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


Steve Webster


Kenny Roberts



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

Police Enquiry Office

The above is situated at the rear of the main grandstand building and is signposted 'Police Enquiries'. All enquiries relating to property lost or found, children lost or found wandering, theft from cars or other signs of tampering, emergency messages for spectators and any other serious problems relating to persons or property should be directed to this office. This applies only to major meetings.

May we ask spectators, officials and competitors to approach and leave the circuit by way of the A20, M25, and not drive through Fawkham village whenever possible. Thank you for co-operation.

FLAG SIGNALS

Red: Immediate stop by all riders. Only used by the Clerk of the Course or his deputy and displayed only at the start/finish line.

Red: When shown at marshals points around the circuit all riders must immediately cease racing and return with extreme caution to the Start/Finish line.

Yellow (waved): Great danger in section of track ahead, slow down, proceed with caution.
Yellow (motionless): Danger in section

Yellow (motionless): Danger in section of track ahead: take care, no overtaking, maintain positions until clear of section displaying yellow flag.

Green: Course clear. Used on marshals' posts to indicate their position to riders on first lap of all practice sessions. Also shown immediately after the post where a yellow flag has been shown to indicate circuit now clear ahead.

Black: Accompanied by riders number

Black: Accompanied by riders number on separate board. That rider to stop in pits next time round. Always shown at start/finish line on special instructions from Clerk of the course.

Yellow with red stripes: Oil flag. Displayed when oil has been dropped on the circuit in that section, displayed until the hazard has been dealt with. also denotes slippery surface ahead.

also denotes slippery surface ahead. White: Ambulance or course car on circuit.

Yellow with black cross: Denotes start

of last lap.

Black/white chequered: Denotes finish of race, usually waved at the winner and held motionless until every other rider has passed.

NB: Races at all Brands Hatch Circuits are started using a system of red and green lights. The best riders in the world choose Shell






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
