



#### **Trophies and Special Awards**

The Mellano Trophy, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the driver whose average race speed exceeds the existing class lap record for the corresponding class RUN IN AN ANTI-CLOCKWISE DIRECTION of the circuit, or if no driver exceeds the class lap record, then to the driver whose average race speed is closest to the class lap record than those of drivers in other classes. The competition for this trophy is arranged to cover the whole of the meeting, and should any driver be competing in more than one capacity class, solo or sidecar, then his best performance only will be considered

Any driver whose machine is entered for an event with a higher capacity limitation than the normal one associated with his machine and class, may qualify for the award for his original class. Example: A 350 cc machine being ridden in a 500 cc race will qualify for the 350 cc class award as it applies for the awarding of the above trophy.

Sidecar drivers may qualify on the above basis but subject to the International limitations of capacity classes and where a lap record exists for those classes.

**The A.M.C. Challenge Trophy** (presented by Associated Motor Cycles), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the overall winner of Events 3 and 9.

The Avon Trophy (presented by Avon India Rubber Co. Ltd.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the winner of Event 5.

The Dunlop Trophy (presented by Dunlop Rubber Co. Ltd.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the winner of Event 8.

George Reynolds Memorial Trophy, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the rider making the fastest lap of the day irrespective of class.

**Dennis Lashmar Challenge Trophy**, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the rider making the fastest lap of the day in the three-wheeler category (Events 2 and 10).

**Arthur Wheeler Trophy** (presented by Arthur Wheeler Ltd.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the winner of Event 4.

The Evening News Challenge Trophy (presented by the proprietors of the "Evening News"), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the overall winner of Events 3 and 9.

#### CLOSED

**B.M.C.R.C.** Championships: The first B.M.C.R.C. member to finish in each of the Championship Races will be awarded the Championship Shield for 1968.

**The Rickard Trophy** (presented by K. Rickard, Esq.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, wil be awarded for the best performance by a B.M.C.R.C. member who is a private owner not in receipt of a Manufacturer's or other trade support. The entry form must be signed in the correct place, othewise no rider who has not done so will be considered for the award. The final decision in making this award will rest with the judging committee of B.M.C.R.C.

The Watsonian Trophy (presented by Watsonian Sidecars Ltd.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the first B.M.C.R.C member to finish in Event 2.

On behalf of the Evening News which is glad to be associated with the British Motor-Cycle Racing Club and the owners of Brands Hatch Cicuit, I wish you all a most successful and enjoyable day's sport.

### TODAY'S RACING

Welcome to Brands Hatch and the oldest road race in the English Calendar — The International Hutchinson 100. Today is the 36th in a series which has been dubbed the unofficial British Grand Prix because, as always, the star studded entry reflects the continuing attraction of 'The Hutch.'

It was in 1925 that The Hutchinson 100 first took place. In those days members competed against one another on the concrete bowl which was Brooklands, the intervention of World War II saw in fact the finish of racing at the legendary track, and the beginning of the era of airfield race circuits where The Hutch' was to spend the next 19 years; first at Dunholme and then at Silverstone. The move to Brands Hatch took place in 1966 after several tests of the circuit in the reverse direction. So here today for the third time BMCRC present the wrong-way-round Hutch, and a line up of stars and machinery enough to whet the appetite of the most ardent enthusiast.

Today's racing is so organised that excitement should be maintained right until the final chequered flag. The destiny of the biggest prize in the sport—the giant-sized Mellano Trophy—always remains in doubt right until the end. The man who wins the Mellano has to ride an average race speed which is greater than the single lap record of the class in which he competes. It

takes some doing, and last year's winner, John Hartle (Triumph) managed it beating Mike Hailwood by a few fractions of a second. Beating Hailwood is now an ideal for many. Champions are champions, and Mike stands head and shoulder above many of his contemporaries in his fearless riding, skill and sporting characteristics. He will certainly need every ounce of his experience today whether astride the 6-cylinder 297 cc Honda or the 4-cylinder 500 for he is up against a man few English followers of the sport have ever had the good fortune to see in action, Italy's Renzo Pasolini on 'works' Benellis. Pasolini, whose knees out riding style is reminiscent of Ubbiali, World Champion in the 'fifties is reputed to have the fastest 350 road racing machine currently in the field. Although a stranger to England, but not to the TT where he came second to Agostini in the Junior TT and third in the 250 cc TT, Pasolini has the same conditions as every other rider - the unique reverse direction racing. A wonderful 'leveller' since it is an opportunity presented once a year only to racing motor cyclists. Thus we can expect to see Pasolini on equal terms and see how he fares against Hailwood, the 'works Yamaha's of Phil Read and Bill Ivy, and the enormously sporting and tenacious band of British riders on British machines - and if you think they are also-rans remember that British riders and British machines won the Mellano in 1966 (John Cooper) and last year.

But first the clash of the four men—Read, Ivy, Hailwood and Pasolini. All four will tackle the first leg of the Senior Championship over 15 laps, and

each man can choose his machine, Read either a 250 or 350, Hailwood the 297 or 498 and Pasolini the 250 or 350. Bill Ivy will ride the 250 throughout. All but Ivy bring their 350 machines to the line for the classes' Championship in Event 5, followed by a Yamaha/Benelli contest with Hailwood in the role of a spectator for the 250 Championship. When the Second Leg of the Senior Championship comes about (The Championship also includes the Evening News Challenge Trophy) the four again select their machines, according to which they think is most suitable. The Senior Championship has a total of £100 for the man, if there is one, who can win both legs, plus a bonus of £180 for the best aggregate performance. With a possible total of £280, look out for

And what of the other riders with eyes on the prize gold! One hat in the challenge ring is that of Ray Pickrell. Already Ray has chalked up more successes this year than any other rider. Riding the Paul Dunstall 745 cc Dominator you can expect to see him somewhere up at the front. That the works' champions will have to earn their glory is plain to see : besides Pickrell there is a galaxy of British talent -John Cooper, Dan Shorey, Malcolm Uphill, Rodney Gould, Percy Tait, Alan Barnett and Paul Smart. Then there is Kel Carruthers who in a brief but meteoric three year career over here (his first European race was the 1966 Hutchinson 100) has risen to the forefront of racing by skilful use of an exfactory 125 cc Honda. Kel, who raced a factory 4-cylinder 250 cc Honda in Australia, is a formidable opponent. A big welcome back to Hutch 'regular' Gyula Marsovszky, a native of Hungary now domiciled in Switzerland. Ever popular with European race enthusiasts he is also a well-known figure at 'The Hutch.' From Sweden comes their Champion, a position held by Bo Granath for the last three seasons.

Remember Hartle breathing down the neck of Hailwood in last year's Senior Championship? It could happen to any leader this time. Visitors to The Hutchinson 100 always get their money's worth!

And where better to see real value-formoney racing than in the tremendous struggles of the 20-lap Production Machine Race. Those who saw the 1967 event will doubtless still recall the fierce tussle. Triumphs are back again with Percy Tait, Rodney Gould and Malcolm


Uphill. Pickrell has the Dunstall Dominator which won this year's Production TT, and Paul Smart appears, for a change, not on the TT 4th berth Dunstall, but on a BSA. Upgrading? We leave you to watch and decide! Tony Smith has another factory BSA, and Rex Butcher is on a Norton Atlas. 500 cc class winner in the TT, Ray Knight will be on a Daytona Triumph. From the bigger-bangers to the tiddlers: Bill Ivy has made a surprise entry of an RDO 5 Yamaha in the 250 section and runs slap up against a formidable foe in the guise of Gordon Keith (250 cc Suzuki) 250 winner at the Motor Cycle 500 Mile Race.

Brands Hatch in reverse means full bore downhill approaches to South Bank, front wheel gyrating out of Paddock Bend, and a chance to cheer the winner, happily (or desperately) hanging onto his lead through Bottom Straight and Druids to the Finish line. If it makes solos exciting, sidecars are positively enthralling. And who better to enthrall than current World Sidecar Champion Klaus Enders making his debut at 'The Hutch,' matched against that ever popular rider from Ursenbach, Germany, the one and only Helmut Fath. Fath who is piloting his own 4-cylinder outfit spends a great deal of time on its development. Besides his capabilities as an engineer he also built his own house. Feeding is little problem: he grows most of his own. Between times he became World Sidecar Champion. The British force includes such stalwarts as Terry Vinicombe and Tony Wakefield.

For sheer unpredictability consider the Summer Scratch Race! Production machine exponent John Hedger is entered, so is Roy Francis on Geoff Monty's Monard, and Don May on a Norton. Derek Filler is riding the Derek Minter 500 Manx. Both Saville and Corbett — fifth and sixth respectively last year — could gain higher placings especially as John Taylor has moved out of the class and into the Championship.

So there we are, a very quick survey of the field. Have we mentioned all the winners? It's unlikely for at The Hutchinson 100 one thing is certain . . . excitement! Let's just wish that the best man wins, there is good scrapping for all places, and the day's sport is pleasant for everyone.
