THE MOTO-CROSS DES NATIONS

AFTER the war there was such a boom in motor cycle scrambling that the need was felt for an international event, and so, in 1947, a three-cornered match between Great Britain, Belgium and the Netherlands was organised over sandy paths at Duinrell in Holland. A complicated system of marking resulted in a win for our "A" Team, consisting of Ray, Nicholson and Rist, although the popular giant, Auguste Mingels of Belgium, was already making fastest times.

The following year a better planned event was held at Spa, the winning country being the one with the three fastest finishers from teams with a maximum of twelve starters. Sweden, France and Luxembourg joined the fray, but we already knew well enough whom our great rivals were to be, Moto-Cross having swept Belgium in the same manner in which Speedways did here in the '30's.


Watching their young and extremely dashing team roaring in and out of the trees, British supporters could not help being impressed. But when one of the heavy thunderstorms which characterise the district made everything so slippery that some of the hills became "flat in 2"—Victory Trial stuff—our hopes strengthened. Surely these youngsters who kept the throttle open all the time would lie down on the wet adverse-cambered grass? They did—but there were others to take their place. In the end, the Belgians gave us a sound beating—and something of a shock. Fastest British finisher was trials star Hugh Viney.

So in 1949, at Brands Hatch, we made a big effort. On a very dusty course pitted with shell holes, the Belgian frames and tyres suffered worse than our own, and Harold Lines (spare man a year before at Spa at his own expense!) and Basil Hall were able to keep well in front, harried only by the tenacious Dutch rider, Reitman. Bob Manns was the third of our team home, and our Spa defeat had been avenged.

The following summer the teams met at Skillingaryd, in Sweden. On this occasion, to the delight of an enormous crowd, it was the Swedish team who were runners-up, misfortune engulfing the Belgians from the start. Johnny Draper completed the distance way out in front, with Basil Hall second. Fourth, behind Reitman, came Lines, with only one Belgian finisher in the first twelve, Marcel Cox in the seventh place.

And so we were mildly hopeful when we embarked for Namur last year. If our boys had long ceased to dominate the smaller Continental scrambles, they all knew well enough what international Moto-Cross meant and had abandoned the last traces of an "after you, Charlie" mentality.

More thunderstorms made the many Camberley-type hills on the Citadel circuit almost unclimbable, but three years after our debacle at Spa we were still convinced that the worse the going, the better our chances. It was not so. We came out of the heats very satisfactorily, whereas the Belgians had the vile luck to see the great Mingels retire with broken forks, but in the final we were scarcely in the picture.



True, Ward led for a glorious lap, but this one white jersey was soon engulfed by yellow ones. True, too, that the Belgians appeared to be scrapping fiercely amongst themselves and several disappeared until only three were left at the head of affairs. But three is, of course, sufficient, and without question the Belgian team deserved to win. They did! The finishing order was Leloup, Jansen, Meunier—an F.N. and two Saroleas—with Stonebridge and Ward following them home. Sixth was the amazing Johnny Draper, who, left at the start with steamed goggles, had motored slap through the field.

So now we return to Brands Hatch, determined to give all comers a run for their money. For the first time teams have been reduced from a rather unwieldy dozen to half that number (the fastest three finishers still counting for the Moto-Cross des Nations Trophy), so the need for heats disappears.

With the introduction of a championship on the lines of that which has proved so popular in the road racing world—a 1952 baby which seems to be causing its parents a good deal of anxiety—there can no longer be the slightest excuse to refer to the first man home in the Moto-Cross des Nations as any sort of "champion." This event remains a team competition; let us hope it always will do so whatever the temptations of the spurious "champion" title to those interested primarily in commercial Moto-Cross as understood on the Continent, but not, happily, as yet established in this country, where a scramble is still first and last a sporting occasion.



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


