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
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A fine action shot of Dave Potter on his 750 cc Kuhn-Norton at Brands Hatch earlier this year. (Photograph by John Stoddart)

Superbikes put up big challenge for Evening News and Rothmans Trophies

Once again we welcome you to an Evening News sponsored meeting, and sincerely hope that not only do you enjoy the day's racing, but appreciate the work that has gone on behind the scenes to get together a top class entry at a time when most riders have the TT as the foremost thought in their minds.

As you are no doubt aware, practising starts tomorrow, and many riders already have their bags packed and are ready to set out for the Island immediately after today's racing. So to them, their sponsors, mechanics and the like our grateful thanks for turning out here today.

With a shortage of entries in the 250 cc and 350 cc classes, again due to the nearness of the TT, a new format for the programme had to be arranged at short notice, with of course, the blessing of the A.C.U. The set-up is now self explanatory in the following pages, and what a fine response there was for the two-stroke and four-stroke only events. This innovation has certainly produced an idea for the future.

The feature events of the afternoon are the Evening News Trophy Race, which incorporates the third round of the B.P./Bill Ivy Championship, the third round of the Motor Cycle News Superbike Championship, the fourth round of the Shell 500 c.c. Championship, and an invitation race for the Rothmans Trophy. Each

and every one of these could be a thriller, and so too should the two international threewheeler races, but on current form we may well be in for some surprises.


Ten riders from the opening two-stroke race qualify for the Rothmans Trophy, and they may be headed by Howard Robinson and Eric Piner, but with so many new names appearing it would be difficult to suggest who will join them. However, the international threewheeler races do not present such a problem, on paper at least. Siegfried Schauzu is currently second in the World Championship while Rudi Kurth was leading in the Austrian G.P. until his Crescent-powered outfit went on the boil, and even so he broke the lap record and eventually finished seventh. These two should be out in front, but Tony Wakefield, sixth in the Championship table, Mick Boddice, George O'Dell and Graham Milton have a little extra knowledge of the circuit to their advantage and possibly some extra ccs.

We can expect both races to be fought out by this quintet, barring, of course, mechanical failures.

Then to the third round of the M.C.N. Superbike Championship, in which Ray Pickrell won the first round here at Easter and John Cooper the second at Cadwell after a classic scrap with Tony Jefferies, with Ray in third place. With the points position Pickrell 30, Cooper 20, Read 18, Williams 17 and Jefferies 12, things are really hotting up. Will the winner come from this bunch or will Percy Tait stage a come-back after his unlucky tumble at Easter and sixth place at Cadwell? Another to look out for will be Charlie Sanby, making a welcome return after his prang in practice for the Easter meeting. Again the first ten qualify for the Rothmans Trophy Race, and Brian Adams, Tony Holland, Dave Potter, Paul Selleck, Jim Harvey, Dave Nixon and Dave Croxford will be anxious to get in on the act.

Despite some changing of machinery, the Evening News Trophy could be a carbon copy of the Superbike race but Read, Barry Sheene and Sanby will have their work cut out to hold some of the 750s, particularly those of Pickrell, Jefferies and Cooper, while Harvey, Tony Rutter and Alan Barnett have set themselves even bigger tasks on 350s. Whatever the result it should be a race worth watching, with again, the top ten, if not already qualified, going on into the 'Rothmans'. This race also incorporates the third round of the B.P./Bill Ivy Championship, in which Dave Potter and John Cooper share the lead with eight points apiece, and Tait, Sheene and Pat Mahoney come next with six.

To pick the winner of the four-stroke race raises quite a problem, but the first ten fill the remaining positions in the Rothmans race which will certainly be good experience for these National licence-holders.

There have been three different winners in the earlier rounds of the Shell 500 c.c. Championship, Barry Randle, Barry Sheene and Pat Mahoney, and they all share second place with eight points. With more consistant riding, Jim Harvey tops the table with 15 points. Take your pick from Potter, Sheene, Read and Harvey on the front rank of the grid.

There is still more to come—The Rothmans Trophy Race, with the line-up including the fastest 20 from the Evening News and Superbike races, plus 20 from the two national events. A guess for the front-runners must include Cooper, Jefferies and Pickrell once again, but with some surprises up with them—surley a race worth waiting for.

In conclusion, our best wishes go to all riders leaving for the Isle of Man, and if you are going to watch, enjoy yourselves but take care.

NOTE: At the time of writing these notes there are rumours of further machine changes but confirmation was not forthcoming.



A win and fastest lap at Brands Hatch and a third place at Cadwell gives him

a ten point advantage over John Cooper.

Top Scores: 1 Ray Pickrell (Triumph-3) 30 points, 2 John Cooper (BSA-3) 20, 3 Phil Read (John Player Norton) 18, 4 Peter Williams (John Player Norton) 17, 5 Tony Jefferies (Triumph-3) 12, 6 Dave Potter (Kuhn Norton) 11, 7 Dave Nixon (Boyer Triumph-3) 7, 8 Dudley Robinson (Padgett Kawasaki) 6, 9 Equal Percy Tait (Triumph-3) Dennis Trollope (Triumph-3) 5, 11 Equal John Barton (Triumph-3) and Kevin Sullivan (Viking) 4.




