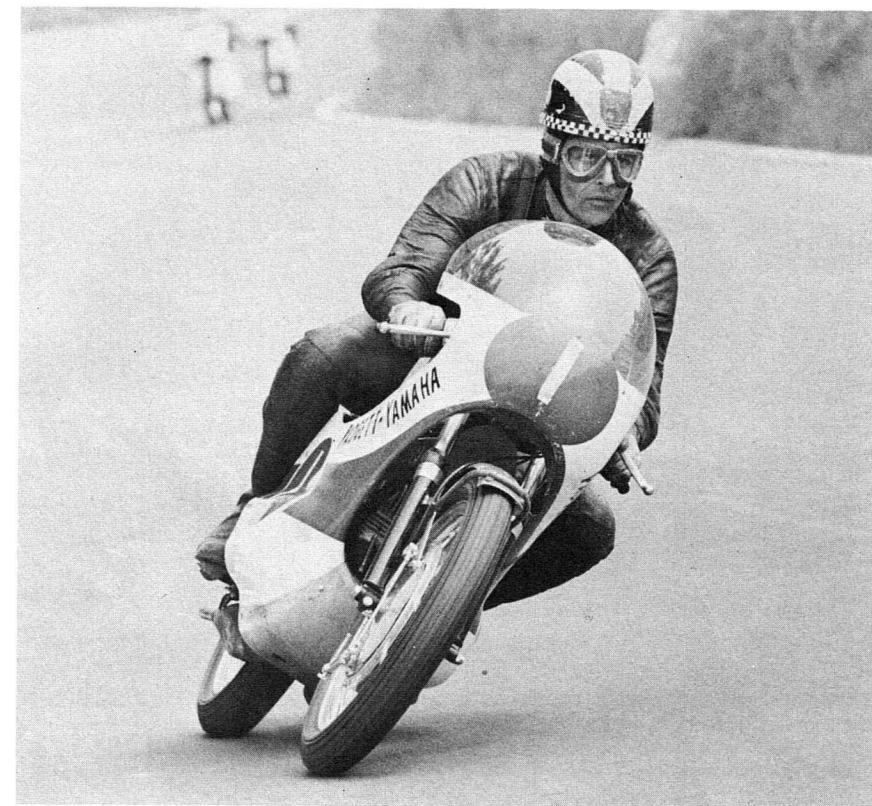

A bumper Whitsun programme

MCN Superbike Championship and a round of the Shell Super Oil 500 cc Championship add spice to the day

Here we are, with the Spring Holiday upon us even before the memories of those exciting Easter Meetings have faded—only the very cold Good Friday marked a near perfect week-end. To-day should see another thriller, 'The Evening News International' with the fortunate winner to be presented with the trophy by that popular Irish singing star Miss Clodagh Rogers who came so close to winning this year's Eurovision Song Contest.

To-day in addition to the 'International', another first—the opening round of the Motor Cycle News sponsored Superbike Championship. Paul Smart and Ray Pickrell, top scorers in the Anglo/American Series will this time be chasing points

for their own private collection as will erstwhile team colleague Percy Tait. Another having a say in the matter will be that new King of Brands, Brian Kemp, who is determined to show that his title is no 'flash in the pan', Charlie Sanby, Percy May, Bob Heath, Martyn Ashwood and Dave Croxford who had such a rousing victory at Easter will also be in the hunt for points as well as bonus offered for lap leaders and fastest laps. It would be as difficult to pick the winner here as in the Evening News International when Phil Read, Rod Gould, John Cooper and Barry Sheene join this exalted company while likely 'outsiders' to be in the money are Jim Harvey, Keith Turner and Pete Cockram. Read and Gould having their first ride in the U.K. this year have already come to grips in the early rounds of the World Championships while Barry Sheene went exceptionally well in Austria and West Germany.

Charlie Sanby leads the Shell Super Oil 500 c.c. Championship with 12 points from two rounds. He is being chased by Percy May 8, Brian Kemp 7 and Jim Harvey 6. They are all in to-day's line up but Dave Croxford, Percy Tait, John Cooper or Bob Heath could soon change some of these placings. If quantity is missing the quality is here as will be seen in the combined 250 c.c. and 350 c.c. race, amalgamated because of the drop in entries, maybe due to the fact that there are more lucrative events elsewhere. The 500 c.c. and 1000 c.c. three-wheeler events have also been combined but there is enough talent on the grid including George Auerbacher to ensure some close racing particularly between the B.S.As and the German B.M.Ws.

Enjoy the racing and mind that holiday traffic as you leave the circuit.

SHELL SUPER OIL 500 c.c. CHAMPIONSHIP FOR 1971. EIGHT ROUNDS AT BRANDS, MALLORY AND SNETTERTON.

The highly successful 500cc Championship sponsored by Shell last year will be repeated in 1971 under the new title of the Shell Super Oil 500cc Motor Cycle Championship.

The 500cc race at each of eight National and International Road Race meetings will count for points in the Championship on a scale of 8, 6, 4, 3, 2, 1 for the first six places.

At the end of the season, with all results counting, the rider with the highest total of points wins the Championship and receives the first prize of £100. The runner up gets £50, third man £25, fourth £15 and fifth £10.

Motor Cycle News Superbike Series



THE ACTION starts today. The works BSA-Triumph entries of Ray Pickrell, Paul Smart and Percy Tait clash in the opening ten-lap round of the £2,000 Motor Cycle News Superbike road race series.

The Big Three and southern ace Charlie Sanby on a Gus Kuhn Norton Commando top the bill in the first international six round series which continues at Mallory Park Post-TT on June 13, Race of Aces at Snetterton on August 29, Oulton Park on August 30, Mallory Race of the Year on September 19, and the Brands Race of the South on October 3.

Points will be scored, as in the world championships, 15-12-10-8-6-5-4-3-2-1, with double points in the last round. There will be a bonus five points for the fastest lap, and if more than one rider shares the fastest lap, each will receive five points. Overall winner will receive £500, with £250 second and £100 third.

In addition, to further boost the prize fund, there will be American-style cash bonus prizes for the lap leaders. Today's ten-lapper will be backed at £10 a lap by Shell-BP.

And the fastest lap at each of the six Motor Cycle News Superbike rounds will be backed by Norton-Villiers. They will award £25 to the fastest lap, with the prize being split if the fastest lap is shared.

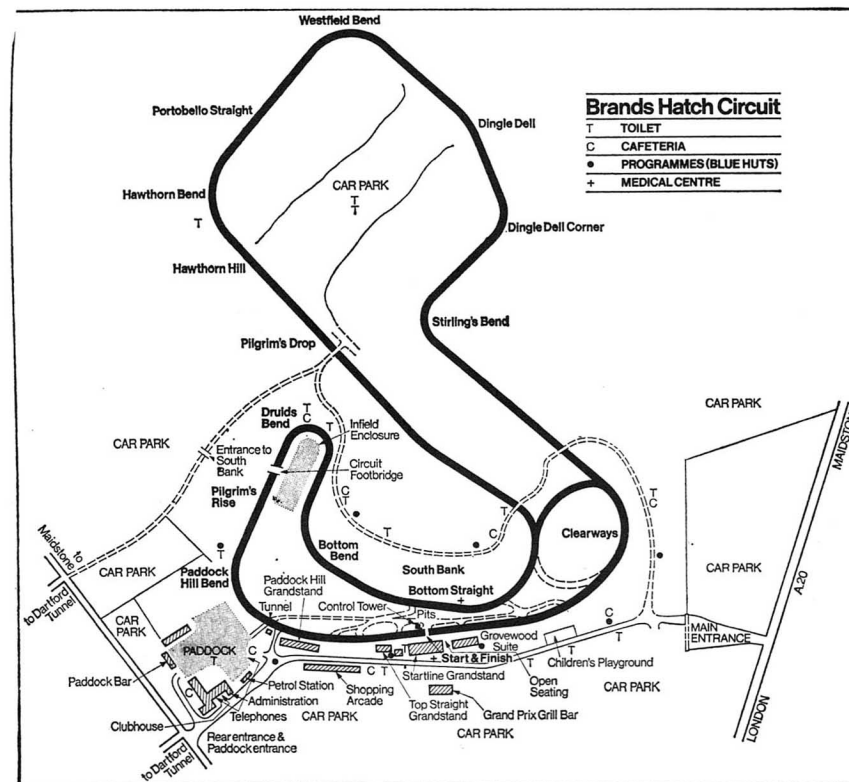

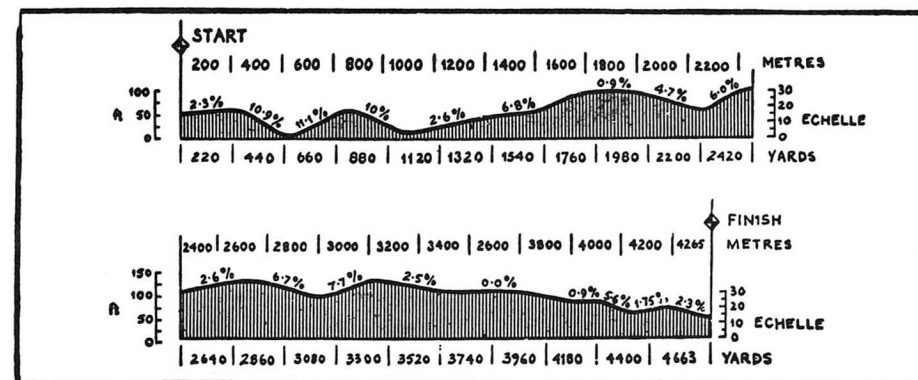

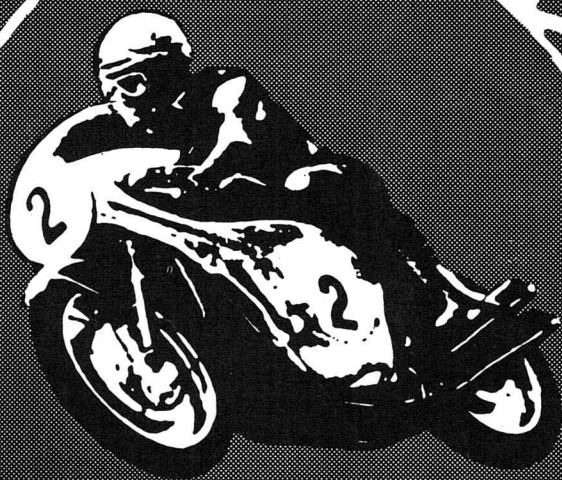
