



The visit of world champion Giacomo Agostini to London's own Grand Prix circuit at Brands Hatch is always an occasion of importance to motor-cycle fans.

The Evening News Race of the South today gives the Italian plenty of opposition from riders who have the advantage of knowing the circuit better, and many of whom are getting more competitive machines than a year or two ago.

On riding ability there is little between Agostini and Phil Read, himself a former double world champion, and among the younger element the progress of London's own Barry Sheene, current leader in the 125 cc world championship will be watched with interest after his recovery from injury.



Cooper v Agostini again

Are we in for another 'Race of the Year' today?

What more fitting way to end the Brands Hatch 21st Anniversary season than to see World Champion Giacomo Agostini trying to turn the tables on Motor Cycle News 'Man of the Year', John Cooper, who scored such a brilliant victory at Mallory Park a couple of weeks back. Those of you who saw that fantastic race will, no doubt, be hoping for a repeat performance today—there may well be. Another who put up a great show at Mallory was former American Champion Gary Nixon who will also be doing battle with the rest of our short circuit stars in their chase for the EVENING NEWS Trophy at this International 'Race of the South' Meeting.

21 years at Brands has seen many changes and legendary names have raced over both the Club and Grand Prix Circuits, the latter completed in 1960. To mark that occasion Mike Hailwood won all four solo classes. Don't get this wrong, it was the road race circuit that opened in 1950 while the motorcycling history of the area goes back almost 50 years and with competitive grass track racing starting in 1928.

Reminiscing is all very well so let us move forward to the present and extend a hearty welcome to all riders and spectators alike and particularly our overseas visitors.

With recent events in mind today's racing could even surpass the 1970 meeting when Phil Read and Rod Gould (250 cc) and John Cooper (350 cc) set new lap records and Chris Vincent chipped in with a new sidecar race record.

Agostini has won the Evening News Trophy for the past two years and will naturally be all out to complete the hat trick but we now know that he is not invincible and those fabulous M.Vs. have suffered a little digestive trouble in recent weeks. In 1969 he was chased home by the late Mick Andrew with Phil Read third. Last year it was that man Cooper second and Read again in third spot, but the Superbikes were only just arriving on the scene and neither riders or machines had reached the present high competitive standard.

Will it be Cooper again, Paul Smart, Ray Pickrell or Mr. Superbike himself, Percy Tait who will give the Champion most trouble? Phil Read on the Ducati, lightweight specialist Barry Sheene, Charlie Sanby, Bob Heath, Martyn Ashwood, Dave Croxford and a much improved Jim Harvey also come into the reckoning. After Gary Nixon's performance at Mallory he too could be up with the leaders. The 350s of Alan Barnett, Ron Chandler, Tony Rutter, Barry Randle, Steve Machin and Rex Butcher will have to be very quick to get in the hunt.

The Motor Cycle News Superbike Championship reaches it's grand finale and what a great innovation this has turned out to be, creating greater interest with each successive round. Percy Tait romped away with the first three rounds and with second places at Oulton and Mallory and looked certain to add the £500 jackpot to his already sizeable prize money. Following the Race of the Year meeting Ray Pickrell now has a great chance of catching the Triumphs works rider particularly with double points at this meeting. Present scores are Tait 79, Pickrell 59.

Another final is that of the Super Shell Oil 500 cc Championship in which after four rounds Brian Kemp held a 2 point advantage over Charlie Sanby and Jim Harvey, he was then unlucky to get sidelined by injury. The event was incorporated in the 1000 cc race at the Hutchinson 100 meeting and Barry Sheene was the only point scorer — this put him on level terms with Brian Kemp. Jim Harvey went to the top after a fine second place at Snetterton but missed out at Mallory Park where Agostini repeated his June victory, Sheene finished in second and this puts him in the lead with 20 points. Harvey has 18 and Agostini and Charlie Sanby 16. With this situation the destination of the £100 is still in the pot.

So to the final round of the B.P./Bill Ivy Silver Helmet Challenge Race Series which could be a three man dice between Barry Sheene (16 points), Dave Croxford (10) and Charlie Sanby (6). Retirements in the early rounds have completely decimated the field for this well meant series.

The remaining solo events should be equally competitive, Gary Nixon comes up against Ago in the opening 350 cc event so we shall get an idea of his ability on level capacity for he will have no fears that the Yamsel is a layabout. Read got the better of the Champion in 1969 but last year it was Ago — Cooper — Read, with John cracking the lap record for the class. No doubt Sheene, Smart, Jefferies and Co., will be pushing this bunch hard from the start. It will be the same warriors in the 250 cc race with this time Read on to a hat trick after a share with a new lap record last year with Gould. Pity Rod is not here today also to liven things up. By special request the 125 cc race has returned to the programme and collected a sizeable entry — World Title chasing Barry Sheene looks an assured winner but it is anyone's guess who follows him home.

As the new World Sidecar Champion, West German Horst Owesle makes his competitive debut on the circuit when he comes out for the first heat for the Brands Racing Committee Trophy. This will certainly be a tough one for he meets our own Champion Chris Vincent who has collected the trophy for the past two years in addition to setting a new race record in the 1970 event. Also in the heat is Norman Hanks who, with John Glastonbury as his partner is having a most successful season and challenging Chris for his National Title. With Pip Harris and Graham Milton joining in this heat should be quite a scrap. They should all qualify for the final as too should Rudi Kurth partnered by Miss Dane Rowe, Tony Wakefield, Gery Boret and Roy Hanks from heat two. This should make the last event of the day a real thriller. Tony Wakefield is a previous winner of the 500 cc Deubel Trophy but Harris, Kurth, Milton and Mick Boddice are bound to have other ideas about him collecting it again. These four three wheeler races in addition to the great solo programme should be enough for any enthusiast. Shall we have a repeat of Mallory Park — let us hope so.

Now to sign off, and as ever, we hope that you have enjoyed the racing enough to 'take it easy on the way home!'






