




Production Sports Machine Races - Events 1 and 7. Aggregate cash awards will be given to those finishers whose combination of the two race times are lower than those of other drivers finishing in the same events. These cash awards will be based upon an ascending order of the aggregate performance.

## **Trophies and Special Awards**

**OPEN TROPHIES** 

The Mellano Trophy, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the driver whose average race speed exceeds the existing class lap record for the corresponding class RUN IN AN ANTI-CLOCKWISE DIRECTION of the circuit, or if no driver exceeds the class lap record, then to the driver whose average race speed is closest to the class lap record than those of drivers in other classes. The competition for this trophy is arranged to cover the meeting except event 10, and should any driver be competing in more than one solo capacity class, then his best performance only will be considered.

Any driver whose machine is entered for an event with a higher capacity limitation than the normal one associated with his machine and class, may qualify for the award for his original class. Example: A 350 cc machine being ridden in a 500 cc race will qualify for the 350 cc class award as it applies for the awarding of the above trophy.

Sidecars drivers may qualify on the above basis but subject to the International limitations of capacity classes and where a lap record exists for those classes.

The Motor Cycle News Trophy (presented by the proprietors of "Motor Cycle News"), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the overall winner of Events 1 & 7.

The A.M.C. Challenge Trophy (presented by Associated Motor Cycles), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the overall winner of Events 3 and 9. The Avon Trophy (presented by Avon India Rubber Co. Ltd.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the winner of Event 6.

The Dunlop Trophy (presented by Dunlop Rubber Co. Ltd.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the winner of Event 8.

George Reynolds Memorial Trophy, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the rider making the fastest lap of the day irrespective of class. Dennis Lashmar Challenge Trophy, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the driver making the fastest lap of the day in the three-wheeler category (Events 2 and 10).

The Mick Andrew Trophy presented by the parents of Mick Andrew and Motor Cycle News. The trophy to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the driver not in receipt of manufacturer or trade support who is the highest placed finisher overall in the Production Machine Races (Events 1 and 7). The Entry Form must be completed in the correct place to be eligible to qualify for this award. The final decision in making the award will rest with the judging committee of B.M.C.R.C.

The Evening News Challenge Trophy (presented by the proprietors of the "Evening News"), to be neld for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the overall winner of Events 3 and 9.

CLOSED TROPHIES

The Rickard Trophy (presented by K. Rickard Esq.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded for the best performance by a B.M.C.R.C. member who is a private owner not in receipt of Manufacturer's or other trade support. The Entry Form must be signed in the correct place to be eligible to qualify for this award. The final decision in making the award will rest with the judging committee of B.M.C.R.C.

The Watsonian Trophy (presented by Watsonian Sidecars Ltd.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the first B.M.C.R.C. member to finish in Event 2. The Gerald Bunting Memorial Trophy presented by relations and friends. The trophy to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the B.M.C.R.C. member who is the highest placed finisher overall in the Production Machine Races (Events 1 and 7).

TEAM CHALLENGE RACE

B.M.C.R.C. will hold Round 2 of 3-round National Invitation Team Challenge Race for the Sponsors Association. The series is sponsored by Shell. Teams will comprise of 2 drivers and one reserve driver, one of whom must be a permanent registered driver of the invited team. The result will be determined as follows:

(a) Points will be awarded according to the drivers finishing position, i.e.: Winner - 1 point 2nd - 2 points, etc.

The Team obtaining the least number of points shall be the winner each round, and the team with the least number of points based on its aggregate performance shall be the winner of the series.



Ken Redfern brings to The Hutch the unique and rare 810cc Dunstall. Certainly it is its first time 'backwards at Brands'.

Stars of Tomorrow winner Peter Cockram is married to Suzanne, secretary to 'Motor Cycle' Editor in Chief Harry Louis. Cockram, rides the Magnum — the revolutionary racer with magnesium alloy frame and fork, Triumph-powered.

John Cooper on his Yamsel is 'Motor Cycle News' MAN OF THE YEAR. Cooper's memorable scrap at last year's Hutch with Phil Read is one of many historic races for the Derbyshire rider. Remember his meteoric victory in this year's North West 200 in cloudburst conditions?

Will World 250 Champion Rod Gould find his form in England. Two Hutch's ago Rodney won both legs of the Evening News Challenge Trophy, and was third in the Production.

Dave Potter takes the Dunstall Commando to the line in the Production Races. Dave is current LORD OF LYDDEN. Former Lord, Martyn Ashwood is one of the opposition on a 500 Suzuki.

Handicapping is re-introduced in international racing when Chief Timekeeper Harry Shuttleworth starts the limit man at 5.45 pm this afternoon.






