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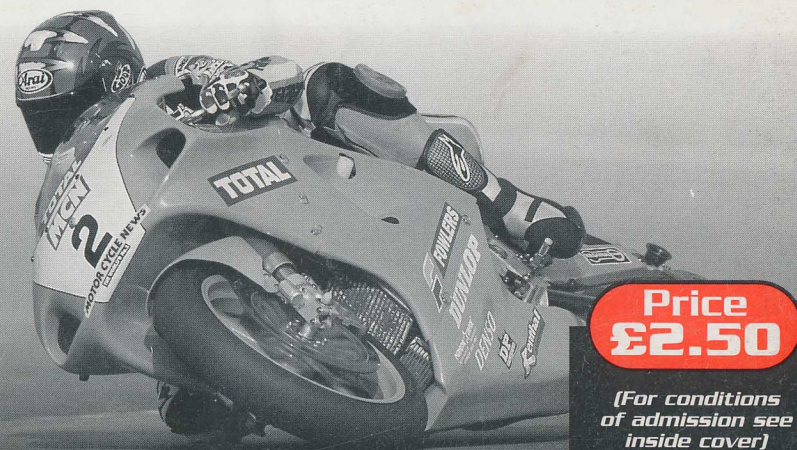

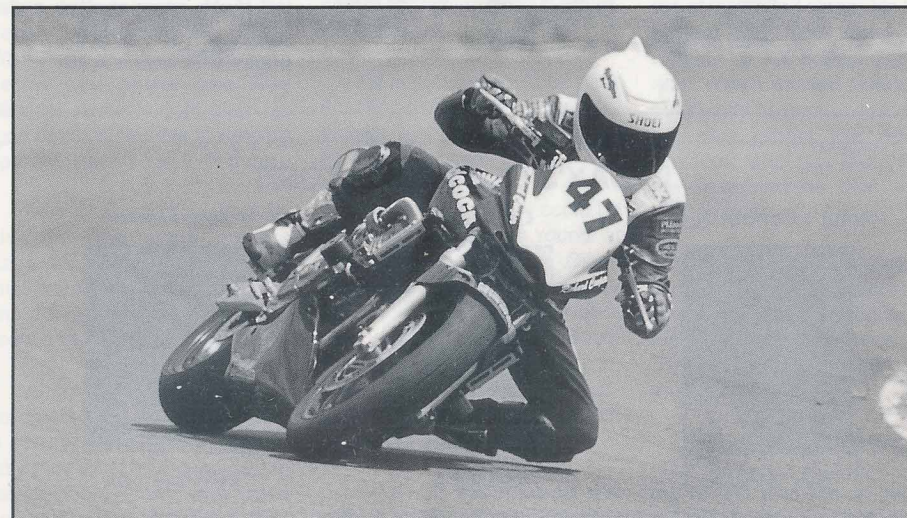

Six races means 150 points can still be won in the Formula 600 class, but a poor day here in Wiltshire could destroy someone's chances of taking a title.

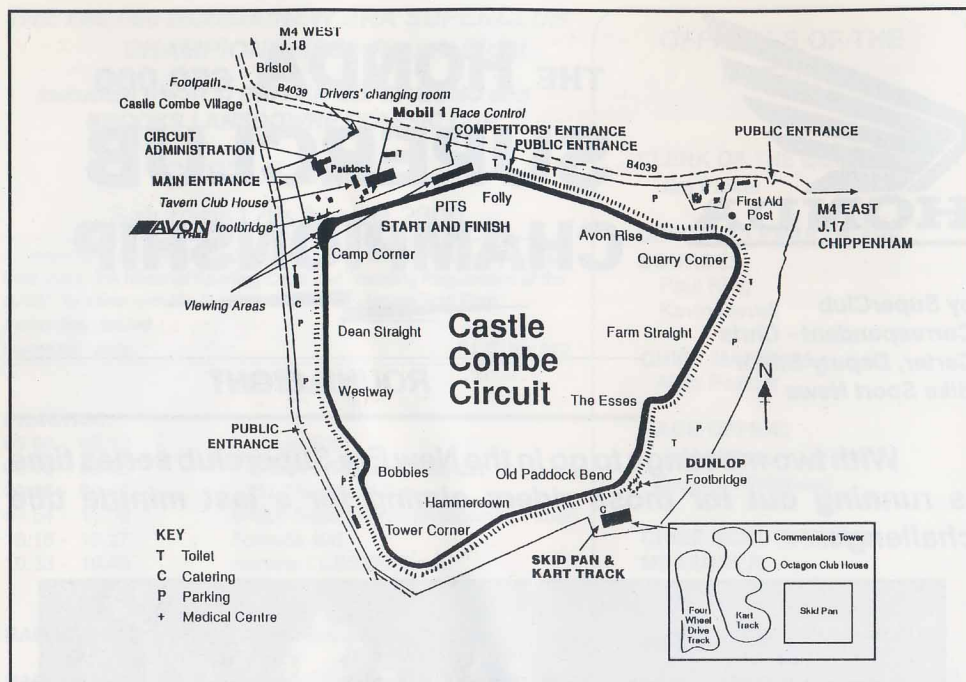
Peter Baker won only two out of his four races at Snetterton, the local track for the Kings Lynn rider. But consistency will always pay off and with two second places in

his other two outings his lead over Richard Norris, his closest rival in the Formula 600 class, has stretched to 46.

The series title must surely go to one or the other, because Darren Mitchell, the hard riding Yorkshire man, now trails Baker by a massive 102 points after notching just 38 at Snetterton.

Chris Firmin is looking home and dry in the Honda CB500 class after maintaining his unbeaten run in the competition with four more wins at the last two-day meeting. He is on 325 points, a massive 119 ahead of former scooter racer James Jackson.

Can Firmin win the remaining six races to go unbeaten through the season?

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Dennis Hobbs has amassed a hefty score of 292 points in the Honda Hornets series.

With his Pidcock Motorcycles teammate Richard Cooper sidelined through injury after a big crash at Pembrey Hobbs needs only 16 more points to be out of reach of third placeman Duncan Henderson.

Cooper, the teenager from Nottingham is a tough little cookie. He has entered for this meeting despite having broken his pelvis in that big get off in Wales.

Despite the domination of Hobbs and Cooper the Hornets continue to provide some interesting performances down the field. Schoolboys Tony Waistnag and Jon Kirkham get better and better and Ray Sinckler, once fully fit after his road crash is capable of running up front. Keep an eye on them.

Ben Wilson looked impressive at Snetterton on his Kawasaki, rattling up four wins in the Pro-Bike Open class to leap immediately from nowhere to sixth in the points' table.

At the time of writing he had not entered for this meeting, which is sad for spectators, but probably a big relief for championship leader Keith Penny, who could not beat Wilson at Snetterton.

Penny leads the big bike series by 97 points and a couple of top three rides will carry him closer

to the title. He is sponsored by Hansom, a large company involved nation-wide in gravel extraction and it is good to see them actively involved in grass roots motor cycle sport.

Dean Hobson is on target to take the 125cc crown and the task became much easier after his closest rival, teenager Andrew Sennett, virtually destroyed his bike in a spill in the second of four races at Snetterton after grabbing second spot to Hobson in their first clash.

The Kings Lynn based rider, like many, is always short of funds, but this latest crash will have increased the family's burden of debt to something close to a third-world nation!

He is determined to be back in action here at Castle Combe, though, even if they cannot eat for a week or two.

Talking of eating it could be bars of chocolate all round at Castle Combe because Oliver Bridewell, nick-named the Milky Bar Kid, is riding faster than ever after Jeff Norval, father of South African ace Shane Norval apparently helped him set-up the suspension on his Honda at a test day recently.

Bridewell, still at school and being guided by Mick Walker is fourth in the championship. Brother Thomas will be old enough at the end of the year to start racing too.

Geoff Spencer is rather more at the other end of the age spectrum and he is on target to win the Sound of Thunder championship. Spencer has switched recently from Triumph to Suzuki and marked the change of machinery with four wins at Snetterton.

The opposition is tough and Guy Etherington, in second spot will not give up without a fight. Reynard Norris, Richard's dad, is getting back to form after a crash earlier in the year and Mick Hemmings will join the fray here on a 1000 Honda.

Like Spencer, Pete Turnbull notched four wins at Snetterton to open a comfortable lead at the top of the 250cc class. He leads closest rival Derek Welch comfortably by XX points. The veteran Welch missed Snetterton, but should be back in action and he, plus others like Andrew Sawford, who has switched to the class from the 125s, will be hard to beat.

Watch out for a rare appearance from John Neate who spends most of his time now looking after his young sons, both rising stars of the world of mini moto racing.

Mark Waring came close to a clean sweep in Norfolk too, failing to win just one of his four races, but taking second place to Martin Sharpe.

That hat trick of victories gives Waring a 95 points advantage.

FLAG SIGNALS USED AT ALL NEW ERA EVENTS

FLAGS GIVING INFORMATION & INSTRUCTIONS

RED FLAG OR RED LIGHTS: The Race or Practice is being interrupted for safety reasons. Riders must immediately cease racing and return slowly to the Pits, or as directed by the Marshals acting on the instructions of the Clerk of the Course.

YELLOW FLAG: Danger on this section of the track. When shown motionless riders must prepare to slow down. When shown waved, the danger is imminent and riders must slow down and be prepared to stop. In both cases overtaking is forbidden up until the point where the green flag is shown.

BLACK: This flag is designed to convey instructions to one rider only and is displayed together with the rider's number. The rider must stop in the at the end of the current lap and cannot restart. This flag is always shown at the start/finish line on special instructions from the Clerk of the Course.

BLACK WITH ORANGE DISK (40 cm dia.) Shown together with a white number on a black signalling board, on the orders of the Clerk of the Course at the start/finish line, it informs the rider whose motorcycle number is displayed that his motorcycle has mechanical problems likely to endanger himself or others, and that he must immediately leave the track.

WHITE FLAG: This flag is not applicable to New Era Club Meetings and is never used.

FLAGS & LIGHTS GIVING INFORMATION

UNION JACK: Start of a race.

GREEN: Course is clear of all hazards This flag is shown on the first lap of each practice session, on the sighting lap and the warm-up lap. After the last yellow flag, the green flag will be shown motionless at the following flag marshal's post to indicate that the circuit is now clear ahead.

YELLOW WITH RED STRIPES: Oil, water or another substance is affecting adhesion on this section of the track.

YELLOW WITH BLACK CROSS: Denotes start of last lap.

BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED: Finish of Race or Practice session.

SLOW MOVING VEHICLES ON THE TRACK

In accordance with ACU Standing Regulations, the NEW ERA Club **NEVER** despatch an Ambulance, Fast Intervention Vehicle (FIV), or any other slow moving vehicle on the track whilst Practice or Racing is taking place on any part of the circuit. If such a vehicle is required on the circuit, the Red Flags are first displayed and the race or practice brought to an actual & effective halt before the vehicle is deployed.

EXCEPTION: Stationary or moving Ambulances, Fast Intervention Vehicles, Recovery Vehicles and the like, may be encountered anywhere on the circuit when riders are despatched from the Assembly Area on their "Sighting Lap" to the Startline prior to the start of a race. This "Sighting Lap" is not considered to be either Practice or Racing and riders must always be prepared to encounter such vehicles. When such a vehicle or vehicles are on the track the Yellow Flags will be displayed in the appropriate section of the course.

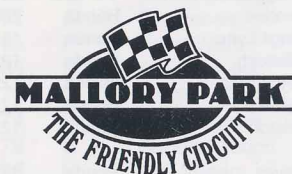

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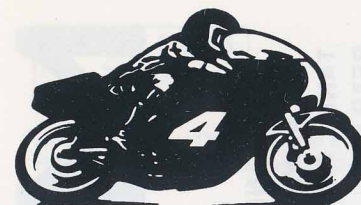

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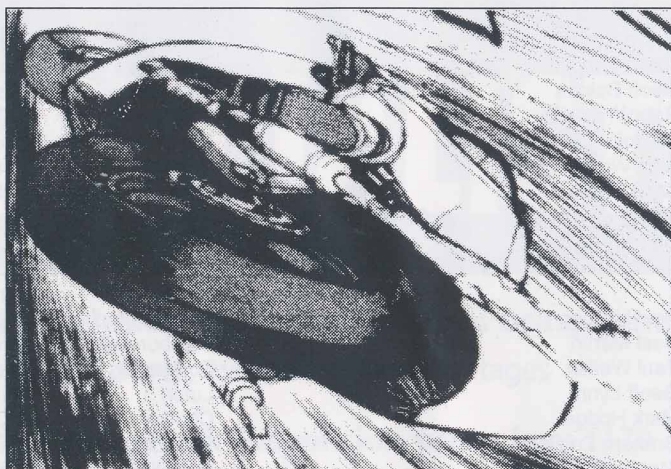

ACU SUPERMONO CHAMPIONSHIPS

Spencer Cook Sets Course For British Championship.

The British Supermono Championship comes to Castle Combe to-day for round six of their national series.

Spencer Cook, the Slipstream MuZ rider leads the championship by 32 points from Steve Marlow, who rides the Team James GRC Pami-BMW. Cook has had a fascinating season mixing spectacular wins with equally spectacular crashes, whereas Marlow has been collecting points with strong finishes at every round. That is until rounds four and five at Mallory and Snetterton. At Mallory in June Cook took a tumble while being harried for the lead by his rival, and tripped Marlow up, leaving him with an injured shoulder. Result....no points for the championship leaders and a chance for Adrian Stringer on his Tigcraft Yamaha to close up and join the title race.

Then at Snetterton in July Cook had a dream meeting, scoring a maximum fifty points while Marlow had a nightmare weekend starting with a fire before the start of race one, and a broken visor in the second, meaning a pit lane start while a replacement was fetched! He picked up 16 points with a charge to third place, but Cook's grasp on the championship looks strong with only two more rounds after today at Cadwell Park and Donington.

The ACU Supermono Championship takes place over eight rounds and is for pure racing machines with very few restrictions other than they must be four stroke and have only one cylinder. The rest is pretty well left up to the ingenuity of the teams and the skill of the riders. For anyone unfamiliar with these bikes you're in for a treat and not only for your eyes as the sound of these big singles is unique!

Round one saw a double victory at Donington Park, and fifty championship points, for the Slipstream Tuning team and their star rider Elliot Burgess. He recently crashed heavily on Slipstream's supersport 600 Yamaha and is unlikely to take any further part in this championship.

Round two at Oulton Park was truly a game of two halves for Slipstream. Their other rider Spencer Cook, on the ex-works MuZ, was the star here qualifying a full two seconds ahead of the field, and on his first proper visit to the circuit to boot! He duly romped away in race one but dropped the MuZ in a big way at the start of race two when in the rapidly changing conditions he was the first to find the damp patch! The beneficiary was Team James rider Steve Marlow who took the Gary Cotterell designed GRC/BMW to its maiden victory.

Cook kept the Championship pot boiling in the third round by taking a maximum fifty points from his two runaway wins at Cadwell Park (May 20/21). Marlow kept up his record of strong scoring with a third and a second place.

Cook, on current form, must surely have his hopes set high on increasing his championship lead and Marlow will be desperate for a result. He can't catch Cook with only 25 points available at this round, but will want to close the gap to stay in touch.

Brian Greenfield is another man to watch for. In his first championship season, he is delighted with his Cotterell built MuZ replica. He took his first podium finish at Cadwell and scored two seconds at Snetterton last month. He is third in the championship and we will surely see more of this talented youngster.

The chasing pack is bound to include a mix of experience and youth so look out also for, Steve Cozier, third in his first ever National Championship race at Snetterton and Adrian Stringer, still in touch in fourth and well overdue for his first win.

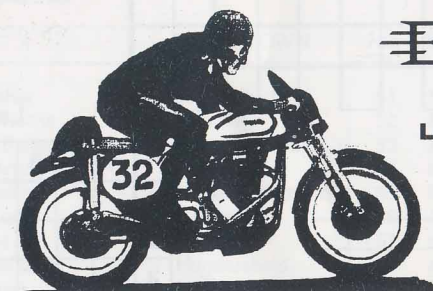

The Clerk of the Course

The Clerk of the Course is the most Senior Official at any Race Meeting and his responsibilities are many and varied.

His authority is derived from the ACU (Auto Cycle Union) Sporting Code which sets out the detailed rules and general framework under which all meetings are run.

He is licenced by the ACU or the FIM (Federation Internationale Motocycliste) the Geneva based International governing body of the sport.

He acts as Judge and Jury either in the case of Protest - or on his own initiative if any Competitor or Official should break the rules.

He has the power to Reprimand competitors, Fine them anything up to £500 according to the seriousness of the offence, impose Time Penalties, or even Exclude a competitor from the meeting.

Competitors however always have a right of appeal against his decisions to the Stewards of the Meeting in writing accompanied by a Fee of £50.00

An example of a Penalty which is regularly exercised at New Era Meetings is the automatic imposition of a 20 second penalty for a rider starting a race from a Grid position other than the one allocated to him in the Programme.....
