



## Will Castle Combe again be Britain's second—fastest circuit?

The F5000 brigade will provide the answer this afternoon

This is Castle Combe's big day of the season, the biggest motor racing event in the West Country calendar, and the South-Western Centre of the BRSCC have certainly laid on an attractive and thrilling programme.

The spotlight will inevitably be on the Rothmans European Championship Race, with a very well-subscribed field of 5-litre Formula 5000 machinery battling it out over 30 strenuous laps.

This is the sixth round of the lavishly sponsored Rothmans European Formula 5000 Championship, and with a prize purse of £2,500 for today's race you can be sure that all the boys will be trying their very hardest.

One of the intriguing questions to be answered this afternoon is who will set a new record for the 1.84 miles lap, and whether this will reinstate Castle Combe as Britain's second fastest circuit.

The absolute lap record, set at the F5000 meeting here last May, stands at 56.6 seconds, and is held jointly by Peter Gethin and Howden Ganley with McLaren M10Bs.

With twelve months of further development behind them, the big Formula 5000 single-seaters are now going much quicker, and Jackie Epstein, who manages the powerful Team Trojan trio of Graham 'Cassius' McRae, Ulf Norinder and Ray Allen — all of whom are due to be racing today — says: "If conditions are favourable then someone should be able to take a whole second off the present record".

If this happens it would mean a lap speed of 119.14 miles an hour, and Castle Combe would again be Britain's second-quickest circuit, overtaking Snetterton, where the record was recently set at 118.98 miles an hour.

Who is going to carry off the honours this afternoon in the big race?


Well, with Peter Gethin due to make his first F5000 appearance of the season in Sid Taylor's McLaren M18, he is probably favourite. Peter walked away with the Formula 5000 championship in its first two seasons, and now of course has graduated to the McLaren Grand Prix Team. He is driving well again this season, and having won the F5000 race here last May, he looks very much the man to beat.

But one suspects that Peter will face some really tough opposition this afternoon. Formula 5000 has become more competitive this year, and the Championship points are being shared more equally. Frank Gardner, the wise-cracking Australian, missed the first Championship round at Mallory Park, but since then he has been going great guns in the works Lola T192. Frank is a great sorter of competition machinery, and has certainly got the Lola in a very raceworthy state, so he should be in the up-front bunch.

Last May, New Zealander Howden Ganley put up a good show in his McLaren M10B, and indeed beat Peter Gethin in one of the race parts. If he has Barry Newman's McLaren M18 on form this afternoon he, too, could be a strong challenger.

And so could Mike Hailwood with the works-entered Surtees TS8. You may remember how well he went in the opening round of the Champion-ship at Mallory Park on March 28th. Certainly the new TS8 is a good-handling machine, and providing he has a good engine tucked in the back Mike could be very competitive. And so could young Mike Walker, who has a particular liking for this circuit, and has been driving very consistently this season in Doug Hardwick's Lola T192.

One driver who can never be overlooked is that other New Zealander, 'Cassius' McRae who, at the time of writing has not notched any Championship points but is such a determined driver that he cannot be left out of the reckoning. 'Cassius' is in the Trojan Arco McLaren and team-mate Ulf Norinder is in the Trojajn Gainsborough McLaren — both M18s — while



the third member of the Trojan Team is ex-soldier Ray Allen, whose Pink Stamps McLaren M10B will certainly bring a flash of bright colour to the proceedings. Ray has

taken to Formula 5000 like a duck to water, driving sensibly and without too much drama, and is proving very consistent in the results.

That's by no means the full list of drivers who expect to figure high up in the results. Tony Lanfranchi, that ebullient character who announced his retirement from racing last season but couldn't stay away, is due to be here with a Surtees TS5A, and so are Tony Dean with his converted Formula 1 McLaren M7A and David Prophet with a McLaren M10B. And if former Lotus GP driver Trevor Taylor can get some reliability into his Leda, he could also be up among the front-runners.

It will also be interesting to see how Bob Miller, from Cardiff, does with his Dulon. He bought the ex-Alan Fraser Lola recently, in order to get hold of its Chevrolet V8 engine, and is expecting it will go better than the Ford unit he used to use.

So all in all this looks a very promising turnout. Another interesting technical feature to look out for is whether any of the competitors will be using 'slicks' instead of treaded tyres. These 'slicks' are now proving very successful in Grand Prix racing, and are beginning to be used in F5000 as well. Given the right conditions, they could be the weapon to beat the lap record.

Though the F5000 race is the highlight of the afternoon's programme, it is not all by any means. The Formula Ford race is very heavily subscribed, which should mean two full heats as well as a maximum number of starters in the final. Since this is a qualifying round both for the BOC Formula Ford Championship and also for the Centre's own Formula Ford Championship there should be plenty of incentive for the boys to be trying.

There's also the promise of some tough battling in the Mod. Sports race. This is the Tunisia Holiday Race, and with the winner getting a week's holiday for two in Tunisia (there's more about this elsewhere in the programme) this should promote some hard dicing.

With a brace of saloon races as well, this is certainly an exciting day's racing. Let's hope it keeps fine.

## Tunisian sunshine the prize

This is the first year that Tunisia has been associated with motor racing events in Britain, and thanks to the Tourist Office and Caledonian/BUA we are able to offer the winner of the Modified Sports car race a week's holiday in the Tunisia sunshine with the partner of his choice.

Tunisia is an Arabic country just about the size of England and bordered by the Mediterranean Sea. For all this it is in North Africa and the holiday-maker will find himself enjoying a mixture of oriental mystery, exotic and enjoyable cuisine, plenty of sunshine, sandy beaches lapped by warm sea and what is left of a long and interesting past.

The main holiday resorts of Tunisia all have a different character of their own. Hammamet, the most popular, is well known for its beautiful gardens with orange and lemon groves which flourish despite the hot dry weather and rather sandy soil. The town has been well-planned and none of the hotels is taller than the highest palm tree. All are hidden from each other by landscaped gardens and orange groves. The Medina, or walled town, lies at the far end of the beach and has its own colourful souks (covered market).

Sousse, second most popular resort, is the third largest town in Tunisia with plenty of hustle and bustle and its own busy harbour. Here the holiday-maker will find several very good speciality restaurants and night spots.

Djerba has a true desert island atmosphere and the completely flat sandy terrain is said to cultivate over 2,000 palm trees. It is at its most lovely at sunset when the sun sinks low behind the palm trees leaving a rich flame-like sky. It is quieter, perhaps more relaxing in Djerba, where all there is to do is laze and catch up on some of those sporting activities you had long forgotten, such as riding a bicycle or horse riding along the endless and often deserted coast.

Wherever our winner decides to go he is sure to be impressed by the warm friendly people of Tunisia and to be in easy reach of visiting one of the astonishing sights of Roman, Phonecian and other remains of bygone conquerors. For instance, Tunisia has a slightly smaller but better preserved amphitheatre than Rome just one hour's drive from Sousse. Dougga is not far from Tunis and is a complete Roman city — an archaeologist's dream.

Caledonian/BUA is the only airline to operate direct services between London and Tunis. Their One-Eleven jets leave Gatwick every Saturday bound for Tunis and the flight takes only  $2\frac{3}{4}$  hours.

## European Formula 5000 Championship

The 1971 Formula 5000 European Championship is sponsored by Rothmans cigarettes which, like Guards, who sponsored the 1969 and 1970 series, are a product of Carreras. The total prize fund offered is £66,750.

The Formula 5000 drivers' and entrants' championship for 1971, promoted by Motor Circuit Developments in association with the British Racing & Sports Car Club, consists of 17 qualifying rounds on 13 different circuits. Of these eight are run over a distance of between 100 and 150 miles with a prize fund of £5,000 for each event and the remaining nine over a distance of approximately 75 miles with a £2,500 prize fund.

Points for the Rothmans European Formula 5000 Championship are allocated on the basis of 9, 6, 4, 3, 2 and 1 to the drivers and entrants finishing in the first six positions. A competitor's best performance in six of the longer races and six of the 75-mile events count towards the final score.

All the longer races are run on a two-part basis with the results calculated on a competitor's aggregate times. The prize money in the longer races ranges from £375 to the winner of each heat to £50 for the 20th finisher. In the 75-mile events the awards range from £500 to the winner to £50 for the 20th finisher (or, if the race is split into two heats, £250 for the winner of each heat down to £25 for the 20th finisher).

The 1971 qualifying rounds are as follows: March 28th, Mallory Park; April 9th, Snetterton; April 12th, Brands Hatch; May 2nd, Mondello Park; May 8th, Silverstone; May 15th, Castle Combe; May 31st, Mallory Park; June 20th, Monza; August 1st, Thruxton; August 15th, Silverstone; August 21st, Oulton Park; August 30th, Snetterton; September 12th, Hockenheim; September 26th, Brands Hatch; October 10th, Salzburgring; plus two dates to be announced.

Assuming there are at least 16 qualifying rounds, the drivers' championship winner receives £1,000 with £500 being allocated to the runner-up. This £2,500 fund extends down to £100 for fifth place. An entrants' championship has similar rewards. These funds and the individual prizes will be reduced or increased by £250 if more or fewer than 16 rounds of the championship take place.

### Formula Ford Championship

The British Oxygen Company, which last year backed a very successful Formule Libre series, are sponsoring a major £2,225 Formula Ford Championship during 1971. The winner receives £100 and the BOC Golden Helmet Trophy — the helmet and goggles worn by Stirling Moss when he won the British Grand Prix at Aintree in 1957. There is £75 for the runner-up and £50 for third place.

Points are allocated to the drivers on the basis of 9, 6, 4, 3, 2 and 1 for the first six places and prize money is paid at the rate of £4 per point. A competitor's best 16 results count towards the championship. (Supplementary rules relating to deciding ties at the end of the year and available from Motor Circuit Developments, Brands Hatch.)
