



## 1991 SPRING CUP

Two Four Sports will promote the 1991 Spring Cup National Motorcycle Challenge, over three meetings: Sun April 14 – Pembrey

Sat April 20 – Castle Combe

Sun April 21 – Thruxton

The meetings will be organised by New Era Motorcycle Club.

The Spring Cup will comprise the following classes, the machines complying to ACU regulations: Class 1 – TT Formula One, Class 2 – 250cc GP, Class 3 – 125cc GP, Class 4 – Supersports 600, Class 5 – Supersports 400, Class 6 – Open Sidecar.

All classes are open to 1991 National and International road race licence holders issued by ACU, Scottish ACU, MCUI.

Prize Fund (payable in each round):

TTF1 - 1st £300, 2nd £200, 3rd £140, 4th £100, 5th £80, 6th £70, 7th £60, 8th £50.

250cc GP - 1st £300, 2nd £200, 3rd £140, 4th £100, 5th £80, 6th £70, 7th £60, 8th £50.

125cc GP – 1st £200, 2nd £150, 3rd £100, 4th £80, 5th £70, 6th £60, 7th £50, 8th £40.

Supersports 600 – 1st £250, 2nd £160, 3rd £100, 4th £80, 5th £60, 6th-8th £50.

Supersports 400 – 1st £160, 2nd £100, 3rd £90, 4th £70, 5th £60, 6th £50, 7th £40, 8th £30.

Open Sidecars — 1st £250, 2nd £160, 3rd £100, 4th £80, 5th £60, 6th £50, 7th £40, 8th £30.

Points will be awarded on World Championship scale to riders in each round as follows:

1st 20pts, 2nd 17pts, 3rd 15pts, 4th 13pts, 5th 11pts, 6th 10pts, 7th 9pts, 8th 8pts, 9th 7pts, 10th 6pts, 11th 5pts, 12th 4pts, 13th 3pts, 14th 2pts, 1pt.

The Overall Champion in each class will be the rider who achieves the most points from the three rounds. The Champion in each class receives £500. Ties will be decided as follows:

(a) by the greatest number of first, second, etc., places in the races:

(b) the rider making the best performance in the final round.

### CENTRAL DESPATCH (London) FII Sidecar Championship

This new series will be 1991's richest FII Sidecar Championship with over £6,000 in prize funds and is the only sidecar championship open to 600cc four strokes and 350cc two strokes. This Championship will be run over 8 rounds.

Eligibility: a) Drivers and Passengers – Open only to holders of 1991 National or International Road Race Licences issued by ACU, SACU or MCUI.

b) Machines – FII Sidecars complying with ACU Standing Regulations: 301 to 350cc two strokes two cylinder and 401 to 600cc four stroke four cylinder. *Prize Money:* 1st £250, 2nd £160, 3rd £120, 4th £80, 5th £70, 6th £50, 7th £40, 8th £30. Total: £800 per round. *Championship Points:* 1st 20pts, 2nd 17pts, 3rd 15pts, 4th 13pts, 5th 11pts, 6th 10pts, 7th 9pts, 8th 8pts, 9th 7pts, 10th 6pts, 11th 5pts, 12th 4pts, 13th 3pts, 14th 2pts, 1pt.


All rounds will count towards the overall championship.

# Nation on the charge

Trevor Nation, riding the rotary engined JPS Norton, expects to set the pace in today's second round of the exciting new Spring Cup Motorcycle Races. The rider, who grew up near the circuit, is keen to avenge defeat here last year as he races in the day's Superbike event.

"Idon't see any reason why I cannot win," said Nation, adding "Last year my then team-mate Steve Spray just beat me in a very closely fought affair."

Nation though, will not have things all his own way, with a quality field

starting the 10 lap, 18.4 mile race. Already James Whitham, riding the Team Grant Suzuki, has shown his pace, winning the Pembrey opener and looks certain to give Nation a testing time.

Roger Burnett, riding with a factory supported Honda, has a strong pedigree and feels he is long overdue a visit to the winner's podium while Alex Buckingham, a speedy young

rider from Barnstaple, has already enjoyed a string of victories this year on his privateer Yamaha.

Chris Morris, the three times Welsh Champion, has enjoyed considerable success on his local Pembrey circuit. Now the 28 year old Llanelli steelworker is planning to maintain the record in national competitions.

John Reynolds adds to the challenge with the works 750cc Kawasaki, David Bowie rides a 750cc Honda as does course specialist Russell Benny, from Bridgwater.

And, the entry for the 250cc Spring Cup is equally strong – Alan Carter has his eyes firmly on the £500 Champion's prize after victory at Pembrey and starts as favourite on the Silkolene Honda Britain machine. Derbyshire duo lan McConnachie, the only British rider to win a solo mainland British Grand Prix, and John Yates are potential winners, as is the speedy Steve Sawford.

One to watch for is John Gainey, the young protege of Grand Prix ace Ron Haslam, riding a 250cc Yamaha.

McConnachie and Sawford expect to set the pace in the 125cc Spring Cup but need to be mindful of Stephen Thompson, riding a 125cc Honda.

Matt Llewellyn, Steve Ives, Mark Farmer, Morris and Tim Poole head an overflowing entry for the production based Supersport 600 race, and all feature heavily in a Supersports 400 race that is boosted by McConnachie and Potts.

Kenny Howles/Alan Langton look a good bet for victory in the 1300cc Sidecar Spring Cup, while the second round of the Central Despatch (London) F2 Sidecar series brings a big entry headed by John Brindley/Chris Jones, Eddy Wright/Andy Hetherington and the double seeking Howles.

Completing the 10 race programme is a round of the Norman Hyde/Leigh Van Sales series, a "Sound of Singles" race and a "Spring National" Allcomers 175–1300cc eight lapper.

### A bit about the series ...

The Norman Hyde Championship is joined by Leigh Van Sales of Warrington to give the classic superbikes a boost this year. This unique racing class brings the sights and sounds of a previous era back to the track, with British, European and American bikes from the pre-1978 years battling for the crown. Last year Colin Breeze on a BSA Rocket 3 won it, and in 1989 Ian Cobby on the RaceCo Moto Guzzi was champion; the championship's claim to bring variety back to the track is certainly true!

Bikes can have any number of cylinders and must use twin rear dampers in the classic style. Apart from that, just about anything rideable goes, and the result is a wide range of bikes and a chance of any rider or bike getting the win.

With help from Rock Oil and contingency sponsors Three Cross Imports, RGB Racing, Triple Cycles, British Bike magazine, Motex, Avon Tyres and Amal carburettors, the 1991 prize fund is worth almost £6,500. The result is hard racing – with plenty of variety!

# The return of "Fast Freddie"

The British will really have their work cut out to hold one of the strongest American squads to feature in the TransAtlantic Trophy but the home team contains a very talented line-up.


