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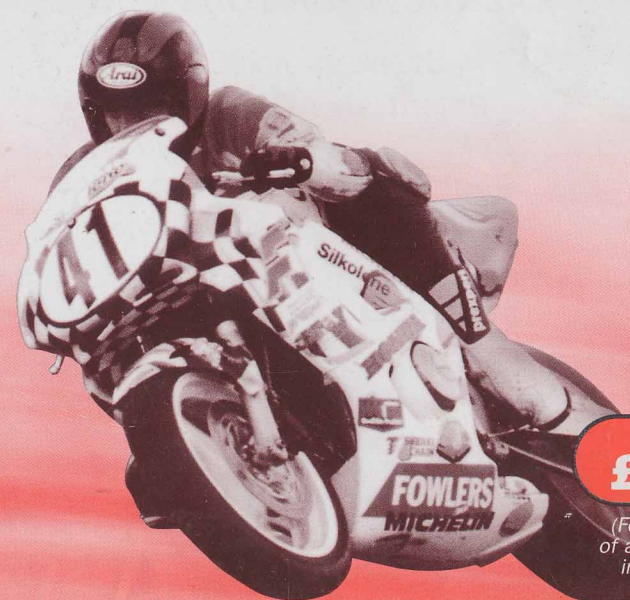

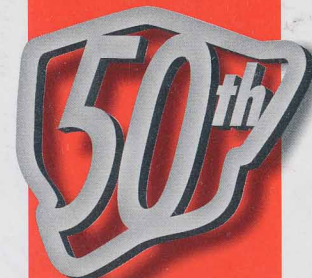

Baker & Kinnish in War of Nerves

Three New Era Superclub titles are still to be decided here today at the very last round of this season's Top Club series and all three look set to go to the very last lap of their races here at Castle Combe before the final outcome will be known.

THE PREVIOUS ROUND AT PEMBREY in AUGUST

Peter Baker, stayed ahead of the pack in the Honda/Metzeler Formula 600 series after two days of nerve jangling race action at Pembrey in the last rounds just three weeks ago. But what was a 25 point lead on Saturday morning and again before the start of play on Sunday, turned into a mere 15 points advantage by the time Baker and the other riders had finished their fourth race of the week-end.

The sprint to the line with Brian Bartlett in the final race of the day for the 600's had gone in Bartlett's favour, pushing Baker down into third place by less than a heartbeat.

Astonishingly, that is Baker's worst-ever finishing result. He has won eleven races, notched up three seconds and failed to finish in the other.

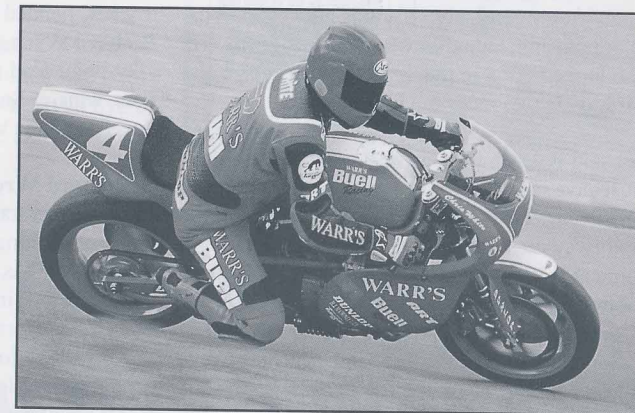

Baker argued long and hard that he had, in fact, pipped Bartlett to the line and who can blame him? There is a new 600cc Honda for the series winner and Baker, the reigning champion, would like to win the big prize again.

Only Julian Kinnish can ruin Baker's party.

The young man from the **Isle of Man** won the ACU Star Formula 600 crown last year and has taken nine victories in this years Superclub so far.

It will be a nervous time for both men and they know that none of the others will be out to do them any favours. **Castle Combe** is a quick circuit and both **Baker** and **Paul Chance**, third in the competition, have bikes tuned by **Mike Smith**, so they should have the performance to beat off most challenges.

But others have won rounds this season, including **Chris Platt**, **Karl Nicholson**, **Jon Tuck**, **Les Shand** and the sensation of Pembrey, **Andrew Wallace** who had made the long drive down to the Welsh circuit and won both wet races on Saturday.

Before then this motor-cycle mechanic had managed to score only 38 points altogether in the championship, including a best finish of fifth. He also looked good in the dry, finishing fourth and third in his two races on Sunday.

I said it was a long drive down for him, but it must have seemed even longer to get back home to Aberdeen. Heavy traffic and an accident on the motorway meant that he and his mates finally got home at 6.30am on Monday morning. Just time enough for a wash, breakfast and then off to work.

Some riders, like **Wallace** and local hero **Steve Jones**, double winner of the 250cc class on Saturday, actually like the rain. Others like **Gary Smith**, do not. **Gary** struggled at Snetterton when it was wet and was far from comfortable in the rain at Pembrey on day one.

He led his big rival **Chris Firmin** by 34 points in the Hornets class on Saturday morning. Two races later that was down to just 19 as **Smith** finished at the back of the pack earning just seven points from his two rides while **Firmin** scored a much more impressive twentytwo.

Neither of these two championship contenders could match the efforts of a man with a very famous road racing name, **Haslam**. This time it was **Carl Haslam**, son of the late **Phil Haslam**, **Ron's** elder brother who stormed to two wins. These were the very first of his short racing career which only began at the start of this season.

However, with a change of weather to dry conditions it was **Smith** and **Firmin** back at the front of the pack on Sunday with a win and a second respectively. **Smith** then, with fingers firmly crossed that it stays dry here at **Castle Combe** and that he stays out of trouble for the Hornets are definitely not an breed for the faint-hearted. The other Honda class, the CB500's, is not settled yet either.

Richard Harrison, who is training to be a P.E. teacher, handed out a lesson to his young rival **Richard Wren**, and turned a six point deficit into a 39 point lead after two days of Welsh action. Four wins at Snetterton for **Harrison** were followed by three wins and a second at Pembrey.

Richard Wren, only 19, did not give up the fight at either track and has certainly not given up hopes of winning here in Wiltshire. That's always assuming he has a bike to race as he failed to finish the fourth race in Wales after running up the back of a Honda Hornet rider "who went into a corner far too slow" for the teenaged Londoner. The resultant crash led his sponsors **Tippetts** to decide that a new frame was required and it'll be touch and go whether a new machine will be ready for today.

Steve Tomes has wrapped up the Formula 400 title. That's the bad news for all the opposition including **Mark Waring**, who tried so hard he crashed twice at the last round trying to stop **Tomes** taking the crown. The good news as far as the others go, is that **Tomes** is now concentrating his efforts on the **Ricky Leddy** R1 Yamaha.

Warren Scott crashed twice as well, but those rare get-offs were caused by a rear tyre that although new had probably spent too long in storage. **Scott**, a farmer, might have to spend this week-end getting in the harvest instead of racing here, leaving others in with a chance of victory.

Russell Gordon will benefit the most on his Team Raptor Cagiva, but our best wishes and hopes for a speedy recovery go to team mate **Geoff Baines** who fell at Pembrey and hurt his back.

Mark Vernon cannot catch Jamie Green in the Pro-Bike class but that will not stop him wanting to end the season with a couple of wins over his arch rival.

Owen Cherrell is the 250 New Era Champion, but this weekend as well as men like **Steve Goodlad** and **Phil Burman** to keep an eye on he'd better also look out for the 125 champion, **Darren Lane**.

Darren has had a 250 Honda all season but few opportunities to ride it as he wanted to make sure of the 125 title. But he will give the 250 an outing here and that should be well worth watching.

So with **Lane** out of the way the opposition can look for the glory on their 125's. **Ben Tye** had his first ever win at Pembrey so another win would certainly boost his confidence a shade. But it's **Andy Sennett**, who'll disagree with that idea!

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Important Notice FLAG SIGNALS USED AT ALL NEW ERA EVENTS

FLAGS GIVING INFORMATION & INSTRUCTIONS

RED FLAG OR RED LIGHTS: The Race or Practice is being interrupted for safety reasons. Riders must immediately cease racing and return slowly to the Pits, or as directed by the Marshals acting on the instructions of the Clerk of the Course.

YELLOW FLAG: Danger on this section of the track. When shown motionless riders must prepare to slow down. When shown waved, the danger is imminent and riders must slow down and be prepared to stop. In both cases overtaking is forbidden up until the point where the green flag is shown.

BLACK: This flag is designed to convey instructions to one rider only and is displayed together with the rider's number. The rider must stop in the at the end of the current lap and cannot restart. This flag is always shown at the start/finish line on special instructions from the Clerk of the Course.

BLACK WITH ORANGE DISK (40 cm dia.) Shown together with a white number on a black signalling board, on the orders of the Clerk of the Course at the start/finish line, it informs the rider whose motorcycle number is displayed that his motorcycle has mechanical problems likely to endanger himself or others, and that he must immediately leave the track.

WHITE FLAG: This flag is not applicable to New Era Club Meetings and is never used.

FLAGS & LIGHTS GIVING INFORMATION

UNION JACK: Start of a race.

GREEN: Course is clear of all hazards This flag is shown on the first lap of each practice session, on the sighting lap and the warm-up lap. After the last yellow flag, the green flag will be shown motionless at the following flag marshal's post to indicate that the circuit is now clear ahead.

YELLOW WITH RED STRIPES: Oil, water or another substance is affecting adhesion on this section of the track.

YELLOW WITH BLACK CROSS: Denotes start of last lap.

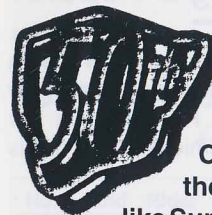
BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED: Finish of Race or Practice session.

SLOW MOVING VEHICLES ON THE TRACK

In accordance with ACU Standing Regulations, the NEW ERA Club **NEVER** despatch an Ambulance, Fast Intervention Vehicle (FIV), or any other slow moving vehicle on the track whilst Practice or Racing is taking place on any part of the circuit. If such a vehicle is required on the circuit, the Red Flags are first displayed and the race or practice brought to an actual & effective halt before the vehicle is deployed.

EXCEPTION: Stationary or moving Ambulances, Fast Intervention Vehicles, Recovery Vehicles and the like, may be encountered anywhere on the circuit when riders are despatched from the Assembly Area on their "Sighting Lap" to the Startline prior to the start of a race. This "Sighting Lap" is not considered to be either Practice or Racing and riders must always be prepared to encounter such vehicles. When such a vehicle or vehicles are on the track the Yellow Flags will be displayed in the appropriate section of the course.

CASTLE COMBE CIRCUIT 50 Years of Motor Cycle Racing

Today we celebrate 50 years of motorcycle racing at Castle Combe. During the last half century many of the top names of the sport have raced the circuit's demanding corners. Names like Surtees, Hailwood, Sheene and Fogarty together with a host of top National riders have all been regular competitors. However back in 1951, the circuit hosted its first dedicated motorcycle meeting. A year earlier the circuit had opened as a racing venue and although in that first year there were only car meetings, they all included a motorcycle race. In fact, the first ever race at Castle Combe was won by D. Wilkins on a Triumph. This set the scene for the Wessex Centre of the ACU and the Bristol Motor Cycle Club to look at running a meeting, with the ACU agreeing to underwrite the costs.

THE FIFTIES

Winner of the first race at that pilot meeting was John Hogan on a 125 BSA Bantam. John went on with a successful racing career and then as a development engineer working on various engine projects ending up at Hewland, the renowned race car gear box constructors. Other winners at that first meeting included Pip Harris on a Norton in the sidecar race.

By the end of that first year John Surtees won the 500cc race on a Norton taking the lap record to over 80 mph. By the mid fifties concern over safety banks meant a temporary end to car racing but motorcycle racing continued to thrive, with Bill Boddice winning the sidecar races, and Derek Minter starting to show the form that would set him as a top British short circuit rider for well over the next decade.

In 1957 Mike Hailwood made his debut at Castle Combe Circuit for only his second race and in that same year Alistair King took the motorcycle lap record over 85 mph. The following year Hailwood started to show his class taking easy 125 and 250 wins although was beaten by Derek Minter and Phil Read in the 350's. Later that year Hailwood won races in all four principle classes, 125's,

250's, 350's and 500's. As the fifties drew to a close, Minter had taken the outright lap record to 88mph and the thrilling dices between Minter, Read and Hailwood became a feature to the delight of the large crowds.

THE SIXTIES

Tremendous excitement was created in 1961 when Mike Hailwood entered the 250cc race on the factory four cylinder Honda, winning, not surprisingly by a country mile, his lead on the opening lap as 500 yards and his race average was faster than the previous lap record.

Such was the importance of Castle Combe within the national racing scene at that time Dave Simmonds debuted the factory Tohatsu 125cc at Castle Combe and promptly beat Mike Hailwood's lap record. By the mid sixties Minter had established himself as 'King of the Castle' although Dave Simmonds continued to dominate the smaller classes and the first 90mph lap was set by Tom Phillips from Newbury. In September a young rider from Kent dominated the 125cc race. Bill Ivy was arguably the most exciting racer of his generation. Bill always rode at eleven tenths, if he stayed on he would generally win. In the mid sixties the circuit hosted a 500 mile endurance race. The Thruxton

500, was the principle production race in the world and teams were stunned when in third place, beating many machines twice its capacity, was a 250cc Cotton, built in nearby Gloucester and ridden by Derek Minter and Peter Inchley. By the end of the sixties a new name sprung to the top who would go on to become possibly the most famous household name in motorcycling, Barry Sheene. This young Londoner won the 125cc race on his Bultaco to suggest that he would have a bright future in the sport.

THE SEVENTIES TO TODAY

Sheene went on to dominate racing at the circuit in the seventies winning 125cc, 250cc and 350cc races whilst in the unlimited classes Percy Tait rode the factory Triumph.

In 1971 Barry Sheene and Tony Rutter, (father of current British Super Bike Rider Michael Rutter) took the lap record to 93mph and this would stand unchallenged for 10 years. That was the last year that major motorcycle racing ran for sometime bringing the curtain down on an unbroken run of 21 seasons of ACU British Championship racing.

The mid seventies to early eighties was a bleak time but after considerable improvement by the new owner, Howard Strawford to the amenities and track, National motorcycle racing returned in 1989 with Carl Fogarty taking the lap record to over 100mph.

INTO THE NINETIES

Into the nineties, National racing thrived with riders such as Trevor Nation and Steve Spray on the Nortons, John Reynolds on his Kawasaki and a young Jamie Whitham on his Suzuki heading the field.

So today sets the scene for up and coming riders to shine and perhaps for those names to be contesting the world championship during the years to come.

To celebrate the 50th Anniversary of motor cycle racing at Castle Combe, we have a tremendous parade headed up by Sammy Miller on a four cylinder Gilera and Mike Braid on the three cylinder MV Agusta.

Collectively these bikes are worth well over half a million pounds and their appearance to-

gether with the other riders and bikes from throughout the last 50 years will evoke many memories.

Enjoy this day and enjoy the next 50 years!

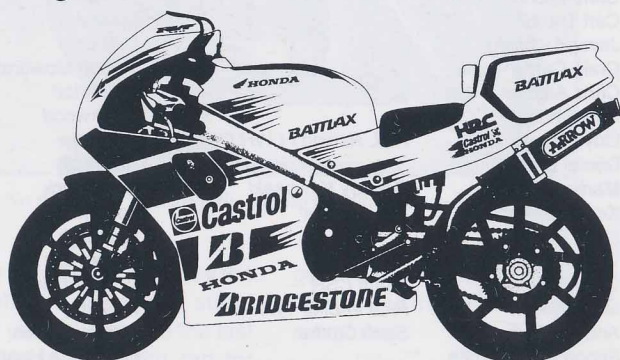

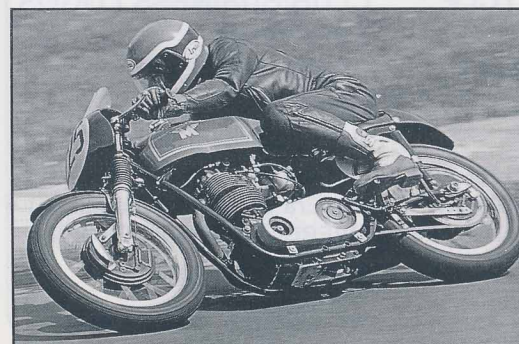

UK Supermono Championship Climax at Castle Combe

Geoff Lancaster sets the scene

The final round of the Bikesport News UK Supermono Championship comes to Castle Combe this weekend. Steve Marlow, The Team James Pami-BMW rider clinched the watercooled title at the last round in Wales, his second successive British title. He is also the European Champion for 2001. Adrian Stringer on the Stringer racing Tigcraft Yamaha and Steve Ruth on the Husqvarna will now fight it out for the runner up spot with only one point separating them. Fourth place is a dogfight between, Paul Thomas, Andrew Marsden and Barry Green.

Keep an eye also on the air-cooled championship battle where it has been incredibly close at the top of the table all season. Richard Rowley has led for most of the year but reliability has deserted him lately and he has dropped out of contention. Steve Lincoln ruined his chances by breaking his arm in a non-championship race at Mallory and it now comes down to a straight fight between the very rapid Graham Picksley and Ivan Porter.

The Bikesport News UK Supermono Championship has taken place over nine rounds this year. For those who have not come across them, Supermonos are pure racing machines with very few restrictions other than they must be four-stroke and have only one cylinder. The rest is pretty

well left up to the ingenuity of the teams and the skill of the riders. Frames are purpose designed with names like GRC, Tigcraft, Spondon and Harris. They race on slicks and the most popular power units come from BMW, Yamaha and Rotax. The sound of these big singles leaving the grid in formation is unique! As well as the British championship, Supermonos are popular in Holland, Scandinavia, France, Italy, the Czech Republic and even the US. The European Championship visits famous tracks like Assen, Spa and Brno. In fact this must be one of the cheapest ways to race on slicks at top GP circuits known to man!

2001 has been a landmark season for the Supermonos. An innovative new 'race within a race' formula has given club racers with the milder tuned air-cooled machines the opportunity to race against their peers on the national stage. Full grids and exciting racing right down the field indicate that the idea of running the 'Lites' alongside the full blown water-cooled bikes was inspired. The two categories are distinguished by yellow numbers for water-cooled machines and white for air-cooled.

The championship has been supported and exclusively covered throughout the year in the UK's premier bike racing paper.....**Bikesport News**
