SECRETARY'S COMMENTS.

As many of you may know, one of our members had his scramble bike stolen from a shed at his home. And I was surprised to learn that many of you have not got your machines insured and that some of you thought it was not possible.

Therefore, I have arranged with my Insurance Company (General Accident) to have proposal forms available for anyone who needs them.

The cost is £1.50p. per hundred pounds value with a minimum cost of £6.00p. This will give you cover for theft while the bike is at home in a locked shed or garage and for transporting the bike to and from meetings etc.

Also, one or two new members have asked about personal accident insurance for the riders, well as far as I know the only company to insure scramblers is the Combined Insurance Company of America, Park House, 165 The Broadway, London, SW.19 1NE. Anyone interested should contact the company direct.

It has come to my notice that some of our riders are using abusive language to Marshals and parents around the track. Now the Marshals are there for your safety, to warn you of a hidden danger and if you are lying in the track you are that hidden danger.

Now I know that most parents are only too happy to lend a hand to lift the bike, but it is you the boys who are spoiling it, I hear that Marshals are being sworn at and ordered to pick the b..... bike up.

This matter has been discussed at committee and it has been decided to stop it AT ONCE. The next time this is reported the rider will be told to put his bike on the trailer and off home.

SO PLEASE LADS, don't let it be you.

Congratulations to ex members, Kevin Marshall and Nick Toms on their performance in the adult scene. Both, I understand have enough points to become experts in July.
