PERSONALITY PAGE - CHRIS SALTER, No.8.

Chris, who last week became the Intermediate British Schoolboy Scramble Champion of 1975 should feel very proud indeed, but this shy unassuming lad shows no excitement at all.

Chris has always been at his happiest on two wheels. At the age of two he learnt to ride his cousin's Fairy Cycle down a lane and into a stream, little did anyone realise this was to be the first of many water splashes and his introduction to scrambling.

His first bike was an old N.S.U. Quickly bought by Dad for spares. It was pointed in the direction of the orchard and ridden until it fell apart. Several old bikes followed and all available pocket money spent on petrol.

A little under two years ago he joined the Corsham Club with his brother Neil, both on Bantams.
