Reserves are brought in to rectify problems and to replace members who have not informed me they are not coming. I appreciate unfortunate problems can occur but it makes life easier if you let me know.

Most of you are all doing a good job, you know what is expected of you, but there are a few who don't seem to concentrate on using the yellow flag to indicate if the track is clear. Please read your instructions again.

The friendly atmosphere that we lost is now returning fast I'm glad to say, and the attitude of leave it to others is disappearing.
