PERSONALITY PAGE. GARY DUNN. (NO. 6).

Gary was born on the 14th July, 1962, at Potters Bar. Middlesex. When he was 22 years old the family moved to Los Angeles, California, and lived there for 7 years. During this time Gary had his first taste of motorcycling, and rode a Honda "Monkey Bike" for a short time when he was 5 years old. He did not become involved with bikes again until the family returned to this country. He bought a Suzuki 50 when he was 12 years old for £5. Watching him ride this on the local dump his dad realised that the lad had some talent. Gary had also bought a couple of other old bikes which he got running and tidied up. He sold them all and ended up with nearly £100. The £100 went towards the purchase of a Honda TL 125 trials bike. In the winter of 1975/76 he competed in a trials series, winning all but 3 trials and winning the Championship. Gary started scrambling as a Senior in another Club at the beginning of 1976 on a KX 125 at Beanacre coming 2nd in his first race. Gary did not start scrambling seriously until mid year when he joined Corsham. He won the Senior Championship in the club he originally started with and also won the Trials Championship again at the end of the year, after winning every trial. Gary started 1977 with a Honda CR 125, later in the year changing to a Suzuki RM 125%. He had a good year winning the same Senior Championship again, was 4th at Corsham, came 5th in the British Schoolboy Championships and 6th in the B.S.M.A. At the beginning of this year he went up into the Experts and is currently riding a Kawasaki KX 125 a4. Gary maintains his own bike and riding equipment, trains hard and goes to bed by 9.30.p.m. most nights. Scrambling is a full time occupation for him so he does not have time for many other activities however, he likes swimming, playing pool and basket ball. Gary has two older sisters: Janet, who is married, and Julie who was married on the 10th of this month. His sisters and his mother, Valerie, are very interested in his scrambling and go to nearly all the Meetings. In July he will be 16 years old and will go into mens scrambling at the end of the year. It is his ambition to take up moto-cross as a profession proving he can make the grade in an increasingly competative sport. Schoolboy trials and scrambling have done a lot for Gary and he is very grateful to all those people, club members, officials and competitors that have offered advice, help and encouragement, also

the many good friends he has made.
