



Today's Racing

Today's meeting organised by the South-Eastern-Centre A.C.U. is the first to be promoted by the Greater London Council which, under the London Government Act, 1963, is responsible for the management of the Crystal Palace grounds.

The greatest point of interest in the racing programme is likely to be Roger Hunter's attempt to bring off his first "first" on this circuit. Last August Roger finished fourth in the 250 c.c. event and third in both the 350 and 500 classes, disappointing his many fans who had expected him to go one better on his second place in the Easter 500 race. As we write Roger is in some doubt as to which machine he will enter for the senior race, having a Norton and Matchless available. Whichever he chooses will need to be in peak condition to stay in front of John Simmonds' Norton. John was the star of last August's Bemsee meeting when he held off a tremendous challenge from favourite Joe Dunphy to win the senior event. K. F. H. Inwood, fifth on that occasion, is running a Norton again this season and should improve his performance today.

Hunter and Simmonds are also among the runners in the 350 event but this is unlikely to be a two horse race, especially as they are riding motor-cycles. Dave Strickland (A.J.S.) who knows the Palace circuit very well, J. Blanchard (Norton) and R. Chandler who won this event at the Palace last August Monday, could all finish at the front in this race.

Many of the entrants in the 250 class will be familiar to Palace race-goers. Dave Chester (Ducati), the winner of this class last Easter, will again be competing but he faces tough opposition in the shape of Jim Russell (Ducati) whose name has appeared almost as regularly as Hunter's in the first six. T. Grotefeld (Aermacchi) a heat winner last year, P. Busswell (Bultaco) and J. Blanchard (Aermacchi), two up and coming young riders who both had good results at Crystal Palace and other British racing circuits last season, should also be among the leaders. The machine ridden by Ron Eldridge in this event is bound to provoke comment and it will in fact be making its début here. It is one of the recently developed Royal Enfield racing 250s with a brand new design which gives a much lower seating position to the rider.

Most of the 250 men will be taking part in the "lightweight" race as well. P. Busswell (Honda) chalked up a success here in August but once again he is likely to be hard pressed by Jim Russell, R. Scivyer and T. Grotefeld, all mounted on Hondas.

The sidecar event is becoming increasingly popular and this year more races have been provided for the large entry. For the first time at the Palace four heats and two semi-finals will be run in the three-wheeler event—so only the fittest will survive. The man who must start favourite in this race is T. Vinicombe (Triumph). Not only did he win this event at Easter last year but he followed it up with a similar win in the August meeting, setting a new lap record at the same time. Today he will no doubt be eager to bring off his "hat trick" of Palace successes. Several of Terry's old rivals are in the field—N. L. Huntingford (Triumph), M. J. Rowell (Norton), B. H. Pinckney (Triumph) and D. R. Yorke (Norton) and with such runners the three-wheelers could well provide some of the most exciting and entertaining racing of the afternoon.

Reflections on the past ten years' racing at 'The Palace'

by W. T. Bult

What major changes have taken place in the Easter Monday race meetings over the past ten years?

As far as the track is concerned, in 1955 the start and finish was on the lower straight. This position was, possibly, better for viewing, but the change to the top straight was inevitable once building had started on the National Recreation Centre.

As for machines, the most noticeable difference is that in 1955 there was no streamlining, and one could tell one make of motorcycle from another. Now this is virtually impossible without peering under the fairing, and we old timers regret this very much.

Also, no doubt from economic causes, there has been a gradual change in the type of machine raced. Many well-known riders of large machines now do their racing on "babies".

In the 350 c.c. and 500 c.c. classes, A.M.C. machines—Norton, A.J.S., and Matchless—continue to dominate, as they did ten years ago. But at that time it was the works policy to place T.T. Replica machines within the reach of the ordinary rider, but for a year or so, no racing machines or engines have been manufactured. All A.J.S. 7R's and Manx Nortons are therefore somewhat old, having been kept in working condition by their owners with the liberal application of love and expensive replacements.

In 1955 the star rider was John Surtees. He had then been signed up by Nortons, but at our Easter meeting he was riding his own machines. He created new race and lap records. The following year he won the Senior T.T. John also introduced at Easter a newcomer to British short circuit racing—the 250 c.c. N.S.U. Naturally, he won this race and went home very satisfied and with a large bag of gold.

This started a kind of N.S.U. craze, and many of the best riders (including Samuel Hamilton Miller) found it just what they were looking for. But N.S.U.s gave up racing fairly soon and the Italians, who had never admitted defeat, took over. In the 500 c.c. class they—and Mike Hailwood—are still at the top.

Then the Japs started to take an interest in racing, and in a little while ousted the M.V.s and Benellis from all the smaller classes in international racing. Few of the genuine racers were, however, available for private entrants, and at today's meeting there is still a preponderance of Italian bikes in the smaller classes, which they can confidently be expected to win.

Returning to our 1955 programme, the smallest class was for 200 c.c. bicycles. This was in order to include the 196 c.c. Villiers engined racers. These were under-powered however and the 125 c.c. M.V. Augustas of Baughn and Hogan came first and second. The fastest lap was at 61.63 m.p.h.

There were only enough 250 c.c. entries to fill one race of 22 riders and the machines were mostly "specials", utilising pre-war engines with up-to-date frames. Today we have two heats of 25 riders each and could, if time had permitted, have doubled up on these. Apart from the foreign entries, one may be sure that the Greeves Silverstone machines and the Cottons and Royal Enfields using Villiers engines, will give a good account of themselves.

Sidecar racing has, perhaps, undergone the greatest change in the past decade. This follows the development of the ultra-low machine with 16 inch wheels by E. T. Young, an example of which he raced here at the 1955 Easter meeting. This, coupled with *full* streamlining—not permitted for solos—and the availability of fast and reliable 650 c.c. push-rod twin engines, has revitalised this class. Whereas we had 14 sidecars taking part ten years ago, today we have 44. This means four heats and two semi-finals—a thing we have not seen before at Easter.

Bill Boddice won in 1955 at 64.48 m.p.h. and established a lap record at 66.19 m.p.h. Since then these figures have been pushed up some 6 m.p.h.

A surprising number of British and World Champions have appeared on our Easter programmes. Not all of them are as well known today as John Surtees, nor were they as instantly successful, but if you keep your programme and refer to it in four years' time, you will be amazed at the people then at the top who appear somewhere within its pages.

There are some riders in the 1955 programme who are no longer with us, and there are others, who have not achieved international honours, but who still race because they love it. Three are here today. In the sidecar races are D. R. Yorke (No. 44) and Pat Millard (No. 23). Yorke came fifth in his heat and third in the handicap race, but the records are silent about Millard. The soloist, E. A. Lavington (No. 18) is today riding the identical machine—a 350 c.c. Velocette—that he rode in 1955. It is usual for engines to get slower with age (something about the knobs wearing off the cams, I think) but Arthur has managed the impossible by making his go a little faster each year. Its maximum speed is, however, some 40 m.p.h. slower than the Ajays and Nortons so the chink of gold will not be heard at Balham tonight.




