





Today's Racing

Today's meeting opens another season of racing at Crystal Palace. It is, as usual, organised for the Greater London Council by the South Eastern Centre Auto-Cycle Union. A total of seventeen races are on this afternoon's programme.

It is a pleasure to welcome back many familiar faces and to see a fair sprinkling of new talent.

The threewheeler event is always a favourite on this circuit and it has attracted the customary strong entry. Having competed here in every meeting since 1959, Mick Rowell (Norton) knows the track like the back of his hand. He proved this convincingly at last August's Bank Holiday meeting when he carried off all the honours in this event. Both D. Keen (Vincent) and D. Plummer (ETY Triumph) who finished second and third on that occasion, are taking part again this afternoon and they must be hoping to turn the tables. Also competing today is D. R. Yorke (Triton) whose record of Palace appearances can outdo even Rowell's. Yorke has raced at every meeting held here since 1954. Amongst the other names to watch are A. T. Baitup (Triumph), a lap record holder at Lydden; B. H. Pinckney (Triumph), the winner of this race last Easter and M. Fiddaman (Dresda-M.G.F. Triumph) who has had many good placings here.

Weather permitting, yet another attempt will be made this afternoon to break the lap record in the 125 c.c. class, now of four years standing. Perhaps the rider most likely to accomplish this is R. Scivyer (Honda), who has come very close to beating it on previous outings here. At last Easter's meeting he won the "lightweight" race with eleven seconds to spare. He will be up against the winner of the 125s on August Bank Holiday, G. Gibson (Bultaco). Gibson followed up his win at the Palace with a number of successes at other circuits in September and he finished the 1966 season in fifth position in the A.-C.U. Championships. Amongst the rest of the opposition are J. Jackson (Honda), second behind Gibson in August, and P. J. Busswell (Bultaco) who won here in August 1964 and still holds the 125 c.c. race record.

Someone to keep an eye on in all the three events in which he is competing—125, 250 and 350 c.c.s—is P. A. Smart. On his first visit to the Palace last August he was fifth in the senior 250 c.c. race which was dominated by R. Everett. He made a promising start to this season by gaining two third positions in the March 5 meeting at Mallory Park. Although he finished behind Scivyer in the 125s, in the 350 c.c. final he beat Butcher, Dunphy and Degens to the line and almost succeeded in overhauling Croxford in the closing laps.

R. J. Everett is sure to leave his mark on this meeting—most probably in the 250 c.c. race. Although he is also riding a 350 c.c. machine this afternoon it is on the 250s that he has the greater success. He has been runner-up in the A.-C. U. 250 Championships for the last two years. One of his most memorable rides at the Palace was in August 1965 when, on the way to victory, he shattered Dunphy's 250 c.c. lap record and broke the race record set up by John Surtees in 1957 by two m.p.h. The rest of the field in this event includes Scivyer on his F.H.S., P. K. Irons (Cotton) a previous winner here, G. R. Bunting (Ducati) who won the junior race last August and L. G. Rodda (Bultaco) who has considerable experience on this circuit.

Very few of today's riders have more experience of the Palace's twists and turns than R. Chandler who is the subject of the current Palace Portrait on page 14. His A.J.S. and Matchless machines should be well to the fore in the 350 and 500 c.c. races. Amongst the others likely to be keeping him company up front in both events are K. F. H. Inwood, M. Ashwood, J. N. Brillard, B. J. Davis, N. A. Griffiths, A. C. Peck and C. W. Sanby. Extra competition in the 500 c.c. machines should come from G. Young (Norton) who came third in this event last Easter, and D. H. G. Chester (Norton) who regularly puts in good performances here.

The programme and the entry it has attracted promise some four hours of good racing entertainment.





Ron Chandler

A regular performer at the Palace and almost as regularly successful, Ron Chandler is certainly a firm favourite with Palace crowds. His absence from last August Bank Holiday's racing was particularly noticeable as it was the first Crystal Palace meeting he had missed for the last six years.

Ron took up racing in 1959 and he made his debut at the Palace on Easter Monday of that year in the second race of his career. His first success here came at the August Bank Holiday meeting in 1960. Not only did he win the junior 1,000 c.c. event but he was also awarded the Les Graham Trophy for the best performance by a private owner.

During the next three years he had several good placings in races at the Palace but it was not until August 1964 that he brought off his next win here. This was after a close and exciting struggle in the senior 350 c.c. race in which his opponents included Roger Hunter and Joe Dunphy.

In the last three meetings in which he has competed, he has had a monopoly of the large machine races. In 1965 he won the 500 c.c. event on Easter Monday and the senior 1,000 c.c. event in August, following these up in Easter 1966 by again winning the 500 c.cs. In addition, in the 350 c.c. final last Easter, he was only just beaten into second place by John Blanchard after finishing well in front of him in the heat.

Ron's successes are by no means limited to Crystal Palace. Last season he was eighth in the 500 c.c. World Championships and some of his most notable rides during the year included finishing fourth in the East German Grand Prix, sixth in the Belgian Grand Prix and fifth in the senior T.T. He scored his first big win of the 1967 season at Mallory Park on March 5 when his Matchless outstripped a very tough field in the 500 c.c. final.

Although this was his first win at Mallory, he has wins to his credit at most of the other circuits. He finds Crystal Palace a convenient and likeable sort of circuit and one which commands respect. He considers it a good training ground for up-and-coming riders as the lack of run-offs helps to prevent any over-driving.

When he is not racing, he works as a River Thames lighterman, travelling up and down on the barges in all weathers. Twenty-seven years old, he is married and lives with his wife and one son in Kemsing near Sevenoaks.

This afternoon he will, as usual, be entered by Reg Kirby. He will be riding in both the 350 c.c. and 500 c.c. events although he prefers the 500 c.cs in which he has had more success. His ambition must be not only to maintain his unbeaten record in the 500 c.c. class on his familiar Matchless but also to pull off that more elusive win in the 350 c.c. event.




