

The Sidecar Trophy, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the rider making the fastest lap of the day in the three-wheeler category.

SPECIAL CLUB AWARD

The Les Graham Trophy (presented by the late R. L. Graham), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded for the best performance by a B.M.C.R.C. member who is a private owner not in receipt of a Manufacturer's or other Trade support. The final decision in making this award will rest with the judging committee of B.M.C.R.C. and no protest against their discretion can be entertained.

Today's Racing

This afternoon's programme of racing is organised for the Greater London Council by the British Motor Cycle Racing Club. As is customary at the August Bank Holiday meeting, "junior" and "senior" races are run in most of the events.

A handful of riders—all with previous successes on this circuit—are likely to dominate this afternoon's racing. In those races in which a number of them are competing—particularly the senior 350 and 1,000 c.c. events—some fierce battles should ensue.

Joe Dunphy is a former favourite at the Palace and it is a pleasure to welcome him back as it is now almost three years since he last raced here. His 500 c.c. lap record, set up in the course of a thrilling race in August 1963 in which he beat Griff Jenkins and Roger Hunter, is still standing. He will have the opportunity of having a further crack at it this afternoon. At the same meeting he completed a hat-trick of wins by carrying off both the 250 and the 350 c.c. events.

A strong rival to Joe in both the 350 and 1,000 c.c. events is another man with a formidable list of successes here, Ron Chandler. Ron must know the circuit like the back of his hand as he has been a regular performer since he took up racing in 1959. He began this season with a flourish by winning several big races at Mallory and Brands—even gaining the "King of Brands" title. During the last few months he has been having a fairly disappointing time on the continent. A rather nasty crash at high speed in the West German Grand Prix in May left him with a badly sprained neck. Now back in England, he is intending to concentrate on events over here.


Chandler has had almost a monopoly on the 500 c.c. event for the last few years and on Easter Monday he secured a double by also winning the 350 c.c. title which had previously eluded him. Close behind Chandler at Easter was Charlie Sanby who finished second in the 500 c.c.s and fourth in the 350 c.c.s. Sanby has had many successes at Lydden, earning the title of "Lord of Lydden", but his career at the Palace has been one of constant frustration. He has won heats here on several occasions but he has never yet managed to win a final—being thwarted, more often than not, by Ron Chandler.

Worth keeping an eye on is the new Harley Davidson of American, Lance Weil, which is certain to stir up trouble amongst the 1,000 c.cs. A very powerful machine, it has already aroused considerable interest on the other circuits on which it has been raced.

The circuit's unofficial 250 c.c. expert, Reg Everett, will also be among the leading competitors this afternoon. Riding, as usual, the Broad-entered Yamahas he will be out in both the 250 and 350 c.c. races. Everett has been runner-up in the A-C.U. 250 c.c. Championship for the last two years. He is, in fact, the current 250 c.c. lap and race record holder here. Both records were set up on the August Bank Holiday 1965 when he finished twelve seconds in front of a strong field—including Chris Doble and Rod Scivyer—to beat Joe Dunphy's previous record by almost two seconds.

Another lap record which has been proof against all comers for over four years is the 125 c.c. time of G. C. A. Murphy. Rod Scivyer is the rider who has come nearest to breaking it in the past and he is renewing his attempts today. On his last appearance here at Easter, although he did the fastest lap, he was just beaten to the line by Paul Smart in a very close finish. The 125 c.c. field is, of course, dominated by Hondas and Bultacos and among the chief dangers to Rod Scivyer and his Honda are the two Bultacos of Grant Gibson, winner of this race last August, and Martin Carney who has had good placings here and recently was unlucky to be narrowly beaten at Snetterton by Kevin Cass.

Instead of the customary event for vintage machines, a production solo race will be run and the programme will be concluded with the finals of the ever-popular and entertaining sidecar event.


Crystal Palace

London's own race circuit, dating from the 1930s, was popular for motor and motor cycle racing even before the war but the tortuous inner loop kept speeds down and made overtaking difficult. When motor sport was re-started by the London County Council in 1953, following the transfer of Crystal Palace to that Council by Act of Parliament the previous year, the inner loop was dispensed with and a shorter, faster circuit of 1.39 miles established. John Surtees, Mike Hailwood, Joe Dunphy, Terry Vinicombe and Bob McIntyre have all appeared at Crystal Palace and held lap records in their time.

In 1965 the circuit was taken over by the Greater London Council which has continued the L.C.C.'s practice of itself promoting most of the race meetings there. The major racing clubs, such as the B.M.C.R.C., which has organised today's racing for the Council, are of course responsible for entries and the programme of races.


Circuit administration is by the G.L.C. Parks Department, which is also responsible for the attractive park bordering the bottom straight of the race track. In the park there is a children's zoo (visited by over 175,000 each year), a large rock and water garden and an artificial ski slope. Also on view are the famous life-size models of prehistoric monsters, sited on the island in the boating and fishing lake and now restored to their former ferocious glory. The size of these beasts can be judged from the fact that, to celebrate their near completion, a grand banquet was organised on New Year's Eve, 1853, and the twenty guests were actually seated at table inside the half-completed corpus of the mighty iguanodon.

For those musically inclined there are band concerts in the park each Sunday afternoon during the summer and a series of open air symphony concerts in the natural amphitheater by the lake near the North Tower corner of the race circuit. Although the spelling and pronunciation of his name causes difficulty to both race organisers and fans, there is no mistaking the man himself. This young American rider has certainly made his mark on the English racing scene since he first began competing over here three years ago. His name is, in fact, pronounced 'while' although he really prefers to be known as Lance.

His most recent successes include a convincing win in the supporting race for 1,000 c.c. machines at the Brands Hatch "Hutchinson 100" meeting earlier on this month. At the beginning of August he also won the big race at Lydden in grand style after the lack of a clutch had put him almost a third of a lap back at the start. In addition he has already carried off the British Motor Cycle Racing Club's 500 c.c. championship.

The machine which Lance will be riding in the 1,000 c.c. race has certainly lived up to the publicity it has attracted this year. A giant 883 c.c. Harley Davidson, it is probably the first one to be raced over here for some 30 years or so. It has been specially prepared by Lance's sponsors, Elite Motors of Tooting, and its fantastic power was demonstrated at Lydden. Before his appearance at Brands it had to be geared down and it is now set for the rest of this season's meetings. The machine is a works prepared counterpart of an existing road bike which is used by many police departments both in America and other countries.

It is probably the first time that a Harley Davidson has raced at Crystal Palace and only the second time that Lance himself has appeared on this circuit. On his first outing here—at last August's Bank Holiday meeting—he won the senior 1,000 c.c. race and did the joint fastest lap. His views on the circuit can, therefore, claim some authority. He is quite impressed by this tight 1.39 mile circuit where any mistakes soon bring you into contact with the retaining wall. He says that it is probably the only circuit that causes him to reflect a little bit before he pulls out all the stops.

Twenty-nine years old, Lance comes from Los Angeles. Whilst racing over here he is living within a short haul of the Palace at Bexley. This afternoon he is scheduled to have three rides—on a Triumph in the production solos, a Lyster-A.J.S. in the 350 c.c. race and on the unmistakable Harley Davidson in what promises to be a very exciting 1,000 race.




